### **DRILLING TARGET ANOMALIES UPGRADED**

Berkeley Resources Limited is pleased to announce a change to the proposed drilling programme at the Miriam Bouchers Nickel Project due to commence next week.

In order to accurately target the geophysical conductors, believed to be nickel sulphides, the company commissioned the re-modelling and re-assessment of the geophysical data and the TEM anomalies relating to the Miriam project. This work was performed by an independent consultant geophysicist and has significantly upgraded the targetted anomalies. The company will re-prioritise its programme to compensate these changes.

The re-modelling showed that previous target drilling on two TEM conductors had failed to reach the conductor position and that the dip of the conducting body is sub parallel to the drilling. Only one of these conductors (Target C) was part of Berkeley's proposed drilling programme, the company believing the other conductor (Target B) had been previously tested. In addition, the TEM conductor Berkeley intended to drill can clearly be seen to be an up dip extension of a deeper and larger conductor.

Berkeley now intends to target all drilling at the MID010 edge hit conductor (Target C) and the deeper downdip projection of this target. The data from the second conductor (Target B) will be modelled to produce target coordinates and the geophysical data relating to Berkeley's Bouchers project to the south will be re-modelled prior to drilling.

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
