Sweco to improve power supply in Mozambique's capital city

In Mozambique's capital city of Maputo, Sweco has been chosen to plan how the municipal electrical grid can be upgraded and expanded.

The contract has been awarded by the energy company Electricidade de Moçambique, and is worth over EUR 1.7 million.
