Key activities in the Quarter

- Commencement of a clinical collaboration with Radboud University Medical Center, laying the foundation for the completion of product development of ⁸⁹Zr-Girentuximab for renal cancer patients;
- Submission of a Drug Master File (DMF) to the US FDA for a sterile kit used in the preparation of ⁶⁸Ga-PSMA-11, as an important step toward a product approval for the prostate imaging agent. The DMF is held by Kyzeo Imaging LLC, a joint-venture between Telix Pharmaceuticals (US) Inc. and ANMI SA;
- Kyzeo additionally entered into a contract with Endocyte in relation to providing imaging technology for Endocyte’s phase III trial of ¹⁷⁷Lu-PSMA-617 (the “VISION” trial); and
- Commencement of a research partnership with the French National Institute of Health and Medical Research (INSERM) and the Accelerator for Research in Radiochemistry and Oncology at Nantes Atlantic (ARRONAX).

Telix is an Australian biopharmaceutical company focused on the development of diagnostic and therapeutic products based on targeted radiopharmaceuticals or molecularly-targeted radiation (MTR).
