Immuron is a biopharmaceutical company focused on oral immunotherapy treatments using dairy-derived antibody products for humans. Immuron is uniquely positioned with a versatile technology platform capable of generating a wide range of products with a high safety profile. This high safety profile makes it possible to complete pre-clinical studies relatively quickly and increases the prospect that the clinical development of Immuron's products will be expedited. Immuron's current products and product candidates target infectious diseases of the gastrointestinal tract, chronic diseases such as fatty liver/NASH, and Clostridium difficile. Immuron has one product on the market, Travelan, for preventing travellers' diarrhoea. Immuron's main scientific alliances are with Hadassah Medical Centre (Israel), the University of Melbourne and Monash University (Australia).
