SENCO SENSORS MAKES CORPORATE CHANGES

VANCOUVER – Senco Sensors Inc. is pleased to announce a number of key changes that are being made to Senco's management and operations.

The company is pleased to announce the appointment of Denis Stewart to the position of President. Mr. Stewart will be replacing Tom Pocock who has resigned from the board of directors and as a result, can no longer serve as the President of the Company. Nasim Tyab is also stepping down from his role as CEO and is confident in handing over management responsibilities to Mr. Stewart. Mr. Tyab will remain as a director and as Chairman of the Board.

"I am pleased to be placing Senco in the hands of such a capable individual as Denis Stewart" said Nasim Tyab, former CEO of Senco Sensors Inc. "His extensive business and operational skills are going to be instrumental in moving the company forward."

Mr. Stewart has 25 years of senior management experience in the manufacturing of consumer products including 4 years as Senco's Vice President of Manufacturing. He was responsible for the establishment of Dicon Systems manufacturing facilities in Canada and Mexico. Under his direction, Dicon produced at a rate as high as 5.9 million smoke detectors annually. Mr. Stewart's skills include vendor selection, management information systems, and financial resource management.

In his role as President, Mr. Stewart is initiating cost cutting programs and slashing corporate overhead in order to optimise the Company's performance. One of the most significant changes will be a scheduled shift in production from Mexico to an ISO 9002 approved facility in China. This move will allow the company to reduce its costs and as a result become more competitive internationally. Mr. Stewart is responsible for facilitating a smooth transition of production from Mexico to the plant in China with the goal of starting production in May of this year. Senco plans to achieve BSI (British Standards Institution) certification for the factory so that the Company can expand its distribution in the UK. The UK is one of the fastest growing markets for CO alarm sales.
