MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS **(for the six month period ended April 30, 2015)**

June 23, 2015

INTRODUCTION

This management's discussion and analysis ("MD&A") has been prepared by RosCan Minerals Corporation's ("RosCan" or the "Company") management and provides an analysis of the Company's operating and financial performance for the six month period ended April 30, 2015, as well as a view of future prospects. The MD&A should be read in conjunction with RosCan's: unaudited condensed interim consolidated financial statements and related notes for the six month periods ended April 30, 2015 and 2014; and, audited consolidated financial statements and related MD&A for the year ended October 31, 2014. Additional information related to the Company is filed electronically on the System for Electronic Document Analysis and Retrieval (SEDAR) and is available online at www.sedar.com.

Basis of presentation

RosCan's consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"). All amounts in the MD&A and in the consolidated financial statements are expressed in Canadian dollars, unless otherwise noted.

NOTE: in this MD&A, references to years, such as F2015, refer to the fiscal years ending October 31.

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OVERVIEW

RosCan is an exploration stage company involved in the business of acquiring, exploring and developing mineral properties. Currently, the Company does not have an interest in or hold a right to participate in any mineral properties or projects. The Company continues to evaluate various resource and business opportunities with the expectation to make an acquisition in the near future.

Effective November 26, 2014, Collins Barrow Toronto LLP replaced Clancy & Co. LLP as the Company's auditors.

RosCan is currently listed on the NEX board of the TSX Venture Exchange (TSX-V) as a mining issuer, under the trading symbol ROS.H. On October 5, 2012, RosCan's listing was transferred to the NEX Board due to its inability to meet minimum TSX-V Tier 2 listing requirements.

For F2015, Roscan's activities were limited as the Company continued its search for and evaluation of potential business opportunities. The net loss in each quarter was primarily comprised of corporate and administrative costs. The significant factor causing the quarterly variance in corporate and administrative costs were costs related to the Company's annual shareholder meeting and annual public issuer fees, which impacted legal, audit and accounting costs, regulatory fees, shareholder relations and promotion costs and transfer agent fees in Q2.

For F2014, RosCan's activities were limited and revolved around conserving cash and evaluating potential resource properties/projects. Quarterly variances in the net loss were influenced by the amount of: corporate and administrative expenses, which were impacted in Q4 by legal, audit and accounting costs for audit and tax services, and in Q2 and Q3 by legal, audit and accounting costs, regulatory fees, shareholder relations and promotion costs and transfer agent fees related to the Company's annual shareholder meeting and annual public issuer fees; and, share-based payments in Q4, as 1,400,000 stock options were granted.

For Q3 and Q4 of F2013, RosCan's activities were limited and revolved around conserving cash and evaluating potential resource properties/projects. The net loss in each quarter was primarily comprised of corporate and administrative costs. The factor causing the quarterly variance in corporate and administrative costs was the accrual of F2013 audit and tax services costs, which impacted legal, audit and accounting costs in Q4.

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RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

For further information, please refer to the Consolidated Statements of Operations and Comprehensive Loss and Notes 5 and 6 in RosCan's unaudited condensed interim consolidated financial statements for the six month period ended April 30, 2015.

Three month period

The net loss for the second quarter of F2015 was \$25,362 versus a net loss of \$23,835 for the second quarter of F2014, representing an increase of \$1,527. As corporate activity is limited, the net loss primarily consists of corporate and administrative expenses (F2015 - \$25,373 vs F2014 - \$23,830).

Corporate and administrative expenses represent basic operating overheads and typical costs associated with being a public issuer and primarily consist of legal and management fees (please refer to the Related Party section for further information). During the quarter, the Company held its annual shareholder meeting and incurred annual public issuer fees, which impacted legal, audit and accounting costs, regulatory fees, shareholder relations and promotion costs and transfer agent fees.

Six month period

The net loss for the six month period of F2015 was \$39,951 versus a net loss of \$37,623 for the comparable period of F2014, representing an increase of \$2,328. As corporate activity is limited, the net loss primarily consists of corporate and administrative expenses (F2015 - \$40,032 vs F2014 - \$37,662).

The increase in corporate and administrative expenses was primarily due to: legal fees associated with the change in the Company's auditors, which impacted legal, audit and accounting costs; and, annual shareholder meeting costs, which impacted legal, audit and accounting costs, shareholder relations and promotion costs and transfer agent fees.

LIQUIDITY AND CAPITAL RESOURCES

Cash flows

Operating activity cash flows for the three and six month periods of F2015 were impacted by the growth in accounts payable and accrued liabilities resulting from the Company's financial liquidity constraints.

Financing activities for the three and six month periods of F2015 represent \$17,000 in cash provided by Company directors. These loans were made to enable the Company to meet its immediate financial obligations.

Working capital

As at April 30, 2015, RosCan had cash of \$760 and a working capital deficiency of \$102,422. Sales tax receivables represent amounts to be refunded by the Canadian government. Accounts payable and accrued liabilities include \$57,944 payable to Company officers and directors. The Company's operations are currently being funded by its officers and directors.

RosCan does not have sufficient working capital to remain a going concern and will need to arrange additional financing to fund its F2015 corporate activity and eliminate its working capital deficit. In addition, further funds will need to be raised to finance resource property/project evaluations, acquisitions and related exploration activities. There is a risk that the Company's officers and directors will cease funding the Company's operations and the Company will be unable to raise sufficient funds, thus jeopardizing the Company's ability to continue as a going-concern.

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The Company's ability to continue is highly dependent on its working capital and its ability to obtain additional funds in the capital/equity markets to, finance its activities, meet its obligations and pay its liabilities. It should be noted that during this period of economic uncertainty the ability for the Company to access the capital/equity markets for funding remains somewhat constrained.

Given the nature of the Company's operations, which consist of exploration, development, evaluation and acquisition of mineral properties or mining projects, the Company believes that the most meaningful financial information relates primarily to current liquidity and solvency.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Management fees of \$9,000 (F2014 - \$9,000) for the current quarter and \$18,000 (F2014 - \$18,000) for the six month period were paid or became payable to Rustle Woods Capital Inc., a company controlled by an associate of the Company's Chief Financial Officer, Mr. Mark McMurdie. These amounts are included in corporate and administrative expenses.

Legal fees of \$3,017 (F2014 - \$3,280) for the current quarter and \$4,987 (F2014 - \$4,180) for the six month period were paid or became payable to Irwin Lowy LLP, a law firm in which Mr. Chris Irwin is a partner. Mr. Irwin is a director of RosCan and acts as its President and Chief Executive Officer. These amounts are included in corporate and administrative expenses under legal, audit and accounting.

Filing fees of \$225 (F2014 - \$225) for the three and six month periods were paid or became payable to Irwin Professional Corporation ("IPC"), a company controlled by Mr. Irwin. These amounts are included in corporate and administrative expenses under regulatory fees.

Received cash of \$17,000 (2014 - \$nil) for the three and six month periods from IPC and Mr. Donald Whalen, a director of RosCan. At April 30, 2015, loans due to related parties of \$22,000 (October 31, 2014 - \$5,000) represent cash advances from IPC and Mr. Whalen and are unsecured, due on demand and non-interest bearing.

Included in accounts payable and accrued liabilities at April 30, 2015 is \$57,944 (October 31, 2014 - \$29,860) payable to companies controlled by, related to or associated with Mr. McMurdie and Mr. Irwin.

NEW ACCOUNTING POLICIES

IFRS 2 (amended) – Share-based Payments, IFRS 3 (amended) – Business Combinations and IAS 32 – Financial Statements standards were adopted on November 1, 2014. IFRS 9 – Financial Statements has been issued and is

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effective for annual periods beginning on or after January 1, 2018. The Company is evaluating the impact of this new standard on its financial performance, position and financial statement disclosures.

RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Additional disclosure on RosCan's other business risks may be found in Note 12 of RosCan's unaudited interim condensed consolidated financial statements for the six month period ended April 30, 2015.

RosCan is in the business of exploring for minerals and, if successful, ultimately mining them. The mining sector is by its nature, cyclical, competitive and risky. Many of these risks are beyond the Company's control. Investment in the mining sector, in general, and the exploration sector, in particular, involves a great deal of risk and uncertainty and the Company's common shares should be considered as a highly speculative investment. Current and potential investors should give special consideration to the risk factors involved.

Acquisition risk

RosCan uses its best judgment to acquire mineral properties or projects and, in pursuit of such opportunities, the Company may fail to select appropriate acquisition candidates or negotiate acceptable agreements, including agreements to finance the acquisition and development of the mineral properties or projects. The Company cannot provide assurance that it can complete any acquisition that it pursues, on favourable terms, or that any acquisition will ultimately benefit the Company.

Competition risk

RosCan must compete with a number of other companies that possess greater financial and technical resources. Competition in the mining sector could adversely affect the Company's ability to acquire mineral properties or projects.

Conflicts of interest

Certain directors and officers of RosCan, in their personal capacities or as directors or officers of other companies, are engaged or have interests in mineral exploration and development activities outside of the Company. Accordingly, exploration opportunities or prospects which they become aware of may not necessarily be made available to the Company.

Dependence on management

RosCan is very dependent upon the efforts and commitment of its directors and management to the extent that if the services of the directors or management were to not be available or they fail to perform their obligations a disruption in the Company's operations may occur.

Environmental risk

The exploration and development activities conducted on RosCan's mineral properties are subject to the environmental laws and regulations of the country in which the activities take place. Environmental legislation is evolving in a manner which will require stricter standards and enforcement, increased fines and penalties, more stringent environmental assessments and a heightened degree of responsibility for companies and their officers, directors and employees. Although the Company undertakes to comply with current environmental laws and regulations, there is no assurance that future changes in environmental laws or regulations will not adversely affect the Company's operations.

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Exploration risk

There is no assurance that the activities of RosCan will result in economic deposits being discovered and, in fact, most companies are unsuccessful due to the low probability of discovering an economic deposit. Once mineralization is discovered, it may take several years until production is possible during which time the economics of a project may change. Substantial expenditures are required to establish reserves through drilling. RosCan's ability to establish a profitable mining operation is subject to a host of variables, such as technical and economic factors and regulatory issues. Exploration activities involve risks which, even a combination of experience, knowledge and prudence, may not be able to overcome. Exploration activities are subject to hazards which could result in injury or death, property damage, adverse environmental conditions and legal liability.

Financing and liquidity risk

RosCan does not have any production revenue or a regular source of cash flow to fund its operating activities. The Company's ability to finance acquisitions, exploration, development and operating activities is highly dependent upon its existing working capital and its ability to obtain additional capital in the financial markets. RosCan will require significant capital to finance its overall objectives and there can be no assurance that the Company will be able to raise the capital required and continue as a going concern. In addition, RosCan's financial success is dependent on the extent in which it can discover mineralization in economic quantities and the economic viability of developing its properties.

Property title risk

Although RosCan takes reasonable measures to ensure proper title to its properties, there is no guarantee that title to any of its properties will not be challenged, impugned or renounced.
