SUMMER 2003 PROGRAM UPDATE

Vancouver, B.C. – Nevada Star Resource Corp. (OTC-BB: NVSRF and TSX-V: NEV) is pleased to report on the progress of this summer's work on the MAN nickel-copper-PGE (platinum group element) projects in Alaska.

Exploration work completed during the 2003 field season has included shallow drill testing of the Rainy, Canwell, and Fish Lake projects for structure and stratigraphic control, constructing a tractor-ATV trail to the top of Canwell from the Richardson Highway, trackhoe trenching at Canwell and the collection and analysis of over 1,000 rock trench and colluvium samples. The Company has also completed a surface geophysical program at Dunite Hill, which included gravity and large loop electromagnetics (UTEM).

Plans for drilling of mineralization horizons at Rainy and Canwell have been postponed, due to delays in receipt of assay results from the lab needed to further pinpoint drill targets. The delay was due to shipping problems compounded by a backup at the lab. Assay results will be released as soon as the results are returned and analyzed.

The Company is in the process of planning an extensive geophysical, geochemical and drilling program for this fall/winter on the Dunite Hill and Fish Lake properties where the Company believes the greatest potential for nickel-copper-PGE massive sulphide deposits exists.

The Company is in discussions with several major mining companies with regards to a joint venture on portions of the MAN projects and plans to choose a joint venture partner for the fall/winter program. The target on the Dunite Hill and Fish Lake projects is a Noril'sk style nickel-copper-PGE massive sulphide deposit. Nevada Star Resource Corp. is a mineral exploration company that uses the most advanced technology to search for metals that are in high demand, such as platinum. Platinum is key to building hydrogen fuel cell technologies that will help significantly reduce air pollution and American dependency on foreign oil. Nevada Star Resource Corp. currently has projects in Alaska, Nevada and Utah.
