3 Press Release

The Press Release describing the matters referred to herein was disseminated on the corporate disclosure network of Canada Newswire Limited on September 30, 1999.

4 Summary of Material Change

EnerVision Incorporated ("EnerVision") announced that AeroGly Services AS ("AeroGly") executed an agreement ("Agreement") which designates AeroGly as the exclusive contractor for the recycling of de-icer fluid for a two year period at the Oslo Lufthavn airport in Gardermoen, Norway. AeroGly is a wholly owned subsidiary of AeroGly Holdings Incorporated. EnerVision has an option to become a fifty percent equity partner in AeroGly Holdings Incorporated in exchange for (Cdn.)\$1.1 million of which (Cdn.)\$300,000 has already been invested.

5 Full Description of Material Change

The Agreement is further to the Memorandum of Understanding as reported in EnerVision's press release dated August 25, 1999 under which Oslo Lufthavn and AeroGly agreed to complete negotiations for a final agreement for Gardermoen. This Agreement contemplates further negotiation and agreement on some specific details of the arrangement, including an option for AeroGly to purchase existing collected fluids from Oslo Lufthavn, service fees for the second year of the contract and service level objectives.

Gardermoen airport is the most modern airport in Europe completed and opened in October, 1998, at a cost of (Cdn.)\$2.2 billion. The airport averages 600 flights per day and will handle an estimated 13 million passengers in 1999.

Under the terms of the Agreement, Oslo Lufthavn will be responsible for the collection and transfer of spent aircraft de-icer fluids to designated areas and provision of the necessary storage capacity for recycled fluid for the normal demand for the airport. AeroGly will receive and recycle to specified concentrations of glycol the spent de-icer fluids and co-ordinate blending and distribution of de-icer fluids to de-icing operators at Oslo Lufthavn. Oslo Lufthavn has commenced the development and construction of the infrastructure at the selected site, including power, water and sewage services in accordance with the requirements of AeroGly for fluid storage, telecommunications, data and security services. AeroGly will provide, ship and install the process equipment for the facility. The estimated start up date for the facility is November 1, 1999. AeroGly estimates initial year revenues from this contract to approximate 16 million Norwegian Kroner (Cdn \$3.0 million).

AeroGly expects that this initial facility will provide it with a showpiece installation to market the aircraft de-icing recycling technology developed by AeroGly's partner, Inland Technologies Inc. of Truro, Nova Scotia, to other potential customers in Northern Europe.

EnerVision is an environmental services company. In addition to the aircraft de-icing fluid recycling services through AeroGly Services, EnerVision is the owner of the patented Continuous Ablative Regeneration (C.A.R.) technology which uses pyrolysis reactions to reduce organic materials (such as car tires, wood waste and municipal solid waste) into their original chemistry on an environmentally friendly basis. EnerVision, through a wholly owned subsidiary, is in the process of developing the first commercial C.A.R. plant in Europe near Oslo, Norway.
