This Management's Discussion and Analysis ("MD&A") of financial position and results of operation is prepared as at April 29, 2020 and should be read in conjunction with the audited annual financial statements and the notes thereto for the years ended December 31, 2019 and 2018. The audited annual financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2019, and comparative information presented have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standard ("IFRS") as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ("IASB") therein.

All dollar figures included therein and in the following MD&A are quoted in Canadian dollars. Nurcapital Corporation Ltd.'s ("Nurcapital" or "the Corporation" or "the Company")) common shares trade on the TSX Venture Exchange (the "Exchange") under the symbol "NCL.P". Additional information relevant to the Company's activities can be found on SEDAR at www.sedar.com.

OVERVIEW

The Company was incorporated under the *Business Corporations Act* (Ontario) on January 8, 2015. Is classified as a Capital Pool Company ("CPC") as defined in Policy 2.4 of the Exchange. On January 29, 2016, the Company completed its initial public offering ("IPO") to raising gross proceeds of \$441,700 and its common shares listed for trading on the Exchange on February 4, 2016 under the trading symbol NCL.P.

On May 18, 2016 the Corporation completed a non-brokered private placement financing by issuing 486,000 common shares at a price of \$0.20 per share, for gross proceeds of \$97,200. No financing cost was incurred for this financing.

The Company has no assets other than cash and harmonized sales tax receivable. The proceeds from the issuance of shares are to provide the Company with sufficient funds to identify and evaluate business or assets with a view to completing a "Qualifying Transaction" as defined by *Exchange Policy 2.4*. The Company will not carry on any business other than the identification and evaluation of assets or businesses with a view to completing a Qualifying Transaction.

On July 30, 2018, the Company received approval from the Exchange to transfer its listing to the NEX board of exchange, effective at the opening of markets on July 31, 2018 under the ticker symbol "NCL.H". In connection with its transfer to the NEX, Nurcapital cancelled 525,000 seed shares purchased by non-arm's length parties for less than \$0.20 per seed share, as approved by Nurcapital's shareholders at its annual and special meeting held on May 4, 2018. The NEX provides a trading forum for listed companies that have fallen below TSX and TSX Venture's ongoing listed standards, or companies that have low level of business activity or have ceased to carry on active business. Trading of the common shares of Nurcapital Common Shares is currently suspended. This cancellation resulted in the average cost per common share to these individuals being increased to \$0.20 per common share which equates to the initial public offering price per common share.

QUALIFYING TRANSACTION

On July 5, 2019, the Company entered into an option agreement (the "Option Agreement") with Globex Mining Enterprises Inc. ("Globex") to complete an arm's length business transaction whereby Nurcapital will acquire the right to earn a direct 100% legal and beneficial interest in the mineral property referred to as the Lac Savignac property located in the Province of Quebec at the National Topographic System ("NTS") coordinates NTS 32J15 (the "Property"). The Property, the work done to date, and a recommended work program are expected to be the subject of a NI 43101 technical report to be commissioned by Nurcapital and to be available within the coming weeks, at which time a further news release will be disseminated which will contain further details concerning the Property. Nurcapital intends that the Proposed Transaction (as defined below) will constitute its Qualifying Transaction ("QT") as such term is defined in Corporate Finance Policy 2.4 of the TSX Venture Exchange (the "Exchange").

The Option Agreement contemplates Nurcapital earning a 100% interest in the Property (the "Proposed Transaction"). The Proposed Transaction will include an initial payment of \$50,000 on or before the fifth business day after the Exchange issues a Final Exchange Bulletin (as defined in Corporate Finance Policy 5.2 of the Exchange) and a payment of \$250,000 on or before the first anniversary of the date of issuance of the Final Exchange Bulletin. Additionally, the Proposed Transaction will include a commitment by Nurcapital to undertake aggregate exploration expenditures of \$1 million on the Property, composed of \$300,000 of exploration expenditures to be completed on or before the first anniversary of the date of issuance of the Final Exchange Bulletin, and \$700,000 of exploration expenditures to be completed on or before the second anniversary of the date of issuance of the Final Exchange Bulletin. When Nurcapital has paid \$300,000 to Globex, and incurred aggregate exploration expenditures of \$1,000,000 on the Property, Nurcapital will have vested an undivided beneficial 100% right, title and interest in the Property, subject to a 2% gross metal royalty and a 2% gross diamond royalty.

Approval of the Proposed Transaction by the shareholders of Nurcapital is not expected to be required by the Exchange since the Proposed Transaction is an "arm's length transaction" pursuant to the policies of the Exchange.

The common shares of Nurcapital ("Common Shares") were transferred to the NEX Board of the Exchange in July of 2018 and trading in the Common Shares is expected to remain halted until the completion of the Proposed Transaction.

The Option Agreement is subject to the parties satisfying various other conditions. There can be no assurance that the Proposed Transaction will be completed on the terms proposed above or at all. Each of Nurcapital and Globex shall bear their own costs in respect of the Proposed Transaction.

Management and Board of Directors of the Resulting Issuer

The management and board of directors of Nurcapital is expected to remain unchanged following the Proposed Transaction, and to consist of Sharief Zaman (Director), Nadeem Ansari (Director), John Ryan (Director), and Barry M. Polisuk (Director and Secretary). To the best of the Company's knowledge and belief, all of the current shareholders of Globex act at arm's length to Nurcapital and all of the current shareholders of Nurcapital act at arm's length to Globex.

EVALUATION OF DISCLOSURE, INTERNAL CONTROLS, AND PROCEDURES

Internal Control over Financial Reporting

Designing, establishing and maintaining adequate internal control over financial reporting is the responsibility of the Company's management. Internal control over financial reporting is a process designed by, or under the supervision of management, and affected by the Board of Directors, to provide reasonable assurance regarding the reliability of financial reporting and the preparation of the Company's financial statements in compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"). These controls include policies and procedures pertaining to the maintenance of records that, in reasonable detail, accurately reflect transactions pertaining to its assets; provide reasonable assurance that all transactions are recorded to permit the preparation of its financial statements and that expenditures are being made only in accordance with authorizations of management of the Company, and provide reasonable assurance regarding prevention or timely detection of unauthorized acquisition, use or disposition of the Company's assets that could have a material effect on its financial statements. Management is responsible for establishing and maintaining internal control over financial reporting and has designed and implemented such controls to ensure that the required objectives of these internal controls have been met. The management of the Company applied its judgement in evaluating the cost-benefit relationship to controls and procedures. The result of which was, because of the inherent limitations in all control systems, no evaluation of the controls can provide absolute assurance that all control issues and instances of fraud, if any, have been detected.

Minor control deficiencies have been identified within the Company's accounting and/or finance departments and its financial information systems over segregation of duties and user access respectively. Specifically, as is common for companies of this size, certain duties within the accounting and/or finance departments were not adequately segregated due to the limited number of individuals employed in these areas. At the present time, the CEO and CFO oversee all material transactions and related accounting records. The audit committee reviews the financial statements in detail, the key risks of the Company, and queries management about all significant transactions.

For the period covered by this MD&A there were no changes in the Company's internal control over financial reporting that materially affected, or are reasonably likely to materially affect, the Company's internal control over financial reporting.

The Company is a CPC and has no sales revenue. Until such time as the Company completes a Qualifying Transaction as required by the Exchange, corporate expenditures will be restricted to costs of raising equity financing, administrative costs to maintain the Company in good standing and costs to identify and evaluate potential business opportunities.

During the period from incorporation on January 8, 2015 to December 31, 2019, the Company had no revenue.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Included in cash as at December 31, 2019 is \$222,126 (December 31, 2018 - \$340,751) held in trust in an account at a law firm where a partner is also a Board member of the Corporation. This amount is used to pay expenses of the Corporation.

During the year ended December 31, 2019, the Corporation incurred net legal expenses and disbursements of \$56,685 (2018 - \$48,599), charged by a law firm where a partner is also a Board Member of the Corporation. As at December 31, 2019, included in accounts payable and accrued liabilities is \$86,918 (December 31, 2018 - \$109,546) related to these costs.

During the year ended December 31, 2019, the Corporation was charged \$1,600 (2018 - \$nil) by a corporation owned by the Chief Financial Officer of the Company, for accounting and financial reporting.

LIQUIDITY AND CAPITAL RESOURCES

As at December 31, 2019, the Company had cash of \$63,198 held in the Company's bank account and \$222,126 held in trust with its solicitors. The Company's accounts payable and accrued liabilities outstanding as at December 31, 2019 was \$113,453 (December 31, 2018 - \$140,392). The Company's working capital as at December 31, 2019 was \$175,593.

The Company funds its activities through equity financing. To date, the Company raised approximately \$640,000 in initial seed financing and other offerings through the issuance of common shares to fund its operations, which at this time principally consists of identifying and completing a Qualifying Transaction.

The cash on hand as at December 31, 2019 is expected to be sufficient to meet the Company's liquidity requirements until a Qualifying Transaction is completed. However, upon completion of the Qualifying Transaction, additional capital may be necessary. As of the date of this MD&A, the Company has no outstanding commitments. The Company has not pledged any of its assets as security for loans, or otherwise and is not subject to any debt covenants.

The Company does not generate revenue from operations. The Company incurred a net loss of \$89,613 during the 2019. As of that date, the Company's deficit was \$402,217. However, the Company believes that its working capital balance as at December 31, 2019 will provide the Company with sufficient cash resources to meet its obligations for at least twelve months from the end of the reporting period. As the Company has no revenues, its ability to continue as a going concern is dependent on obtaining additional financing and completing a Qualifying Transaction.

Cash used in operating activities

Cash used in operating activities was \$94,875 in 2019, compared to \$66,472 in 2018 and was also the net decrease in cash for the years.

The Company expect to continue to generate negative cash from operating activities in the future until at least its Qualifying Transaction is completed and the Company commences revenue generation.

Cash provided by financing activities

No cash was generated from financing activities during 2019 and 2018.

CAPITAL STOCK AND DEFICIT

The authorized capital of the Company consists of an unlimited number of common shares without nominal or par value. As at the date hereof 3,219,500 common shares were issued and outstanding as fully paid and non-assessable.

RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

Investing in the common shares of the Company involves risk. Prospective investors should carefully consider the risks described below, together with all of the other information included in this MD&A before making an investment decision. If any of the following risks actually occurs, the business, financial condition or results of operations of the Company could be harmed. In such an event, the trading price of the common shares could decline and prospective investors may lose part or all of their investment.

No Operating History

The Company was incorporated on January 8, 2015, has not commenced commercial operations and has no assets other than cash. The Company has neither a history of earnings nor has it paid any dividends and it is unlikely to produce earnings or pay dividends in the immediate or foreseeable future. Until completion of a Qualifying Transaction, the Company is not permitted to carry on any business other than the identification and evaluation of potential Qualifying Transactions. The Company has only limited funds with which to identify and evaluate potential Qualifying Transactions and there can be no assurance that the Company will be able to identify a suitable Qualifying Transaction. Even if a proposed Qualifying Transaction is identified, there can be no assurance that the Company will be able to successfully complete the transaction.

Possible Trading Suspension or Delisting

The Exchange may suspend from trading or delist the securities of the Company where the Company has failed to complete a Qualifying Transaction within 24 months of the date of listing or if the Company fails to meet initial listing requirements of the Exchange upon Completion of the Qualifying Transaction. Suspension from trading of the common shares may, and delisting of the common shares will, result in the regulatory securities authorities issuing an interim cease trade order against the Company. In addition, delisting of the common shares will result in the cancellation of all of the currently issued and outstanding common shares of the Company held by Insiders. Trading in the common shares of the Company may be halted at other times for other reasons, including for failure by the Company to submit documents to the Exchange in the time periods required.

Halt of Trading

Upon public announcement of a potential Qualifying Transaction, trading in the common shares of the Company will be halted and will remain halted until completion of a Qualifying Transaction, or sooner pursuant to Exchange Policy 2.4. Neither the Exchange nor any securities regulatory authority passes upon the merits of the potential Qualifying Transaction.

Exchange May Not Approve a Qualifying Transaction

Completion of a Qualifying Transaction is subject to a number of conditions including acceptance by the Exchange and in the case of a Non-Arm's Length Qualifying Transaction, Majority of the Minority Approval, as such terms are defined in Exchange Policy 2.4. Notwithstanding that a transaction may meet the definition of a Qualifying Transaction; the Exchange may not approve a Qualifying Transaction: (a) if the Company fails to meet the initial listing requirements prescribed by Exchange Policy 2.1 upon completion of a Qualifying Transaction; (b) if, following completion of a Qualifying Transaction, the Company will be a finance company or a mutual fund as defined under applicable securities laws; (c) the consideration proposed to be paid by the Company in connection with the Qualifying Transaction is not acceptable to the Exchange; or (d) for any other reason at the sole discretion of the Exchange.

Approval by the Majority of the Minority

Where Majority of the Minority Approval is required, unless the shareholder has the right to dissent and be paid fair value in accordance with the applicable corporate or other law, a shareholder who votes against a proposed Non-Arm's Length Qualifying Transaction for which Majority of the Minority Approval by shareholders has been given, will have no rights of dissent and no entitlement to payment by the Company of fair value for the common shares.

Dilution

If the Company issues treasury shares to finance acquisition or participation opportunities, control of the Company may change and subscribers may suffer dilution of their investment.

Reliance on Management

The Company is relying solely on the past business success of its directors and officers to identify a Qualifying Transaction of merit. The success of the Company is dependent upon the efforts and abilities of its directors and officers. The loss of any of its directors or officers could have a material adverse effect upon the business and prospects of the Company.

Directors and Officers

The directors and officers of the Company will not be devoting all of their time to the affairs of the Company but will be devoting such time as required to effectively manage the Company. Some of the directors and officers of the Company are engaged and will continue to be engaged in the search for assets or businesses on their own behalf or on behalf of others such that conflicts may arise from time to time. As a consequence of such conflicts, the Company may be exposed to liability and its ability to achieve its business objectives may be impaired. Additionally, directors and officers of the Company may also serve as directors and/or officers of other reporting issuers from time to time. The Company has not purchased "key-man" insurance, nor has it entered into non-competition and nondisclosure agreements with management and has no current plans to do so.

Foreign Acquisition

In the event the Company identifies a foreign business as a proposed Qualifying Transaction, investors may find it difficult or impossible to effect service or notice to commence legal proceedings upon any management resident outside of Canada or upon the foreign business and may find it difficult or impossible to enforce against such persons, judgments obtained in Canadian courts.

Loans or Advances

Subject to prior acceptance from the Exchange, the Company may be permitted to loan or advance up to an aggregate of \$250,000 (\$25,000 without prior Exchange approval) of its proceeds to a target business without requiring shareholder approval and there can be no assurance that the Company will be able to recover the loan or advance.

Current Markets

In addition to the risks outlined above, the extreme volatility occurring in the financial markets has a significant risk for the Company. As a result of the market turmoil, investors are moving away from assets they perceive as risky to those they perceive as less so. An investment in the Company is highly speculative. The volatility in the markets and investor sentiment may make it difficult for the Company to access the capital markets in order to raise the capital it will need to fund its current level of expenditures.

OUTLOOK

The Company, a capital pool company, has only one objective and that is its successful involvement in the identification and evaluation of a Qualifying Transaction. Once identified and due diligence has taken place, the Exchange must approve the Qualifying Transaction and in certain circumstances so must shareholders.

Subsequent to December 31, 2019, financial markets have been negatively impacted by the novel Coronavirus or COVID-19, which was declared a pandemic by the World Health Organization on March 12, 2020. This has resulted in significant economic uncertainty and consequently, it is difficult to reliably measure the potential impact of this uncertainty on our future financial results

OTHER INFORMATION

Contractual Obligations

The Company does not have any contractual obligations.

Off Balance Sheet Arrangements

As at December 31, 2019, the Company had no material arrangements off its statement of financial position such as guaranteed contracts, contingent interests in assets transferred to an entity, derivative instrument obligations or any instruments that could trigger financing, market, or credit risk to the Company.

Going Concern

Management has prepared its financial statements using accounting principles applicable to a going concern which assumes continuity of operations and realization of assets and settlement of liabilities in the normal course of business. Should the going concern assumption no longer be valid, adjustments would be required to the carrying values of assets and liabilities and to the reported expenses, and statements of financial position classifications.

IFRS accounting policies and estimates

The Company's key accounting policies and significant estimates made by management under IFRS are as follows:

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and balances with banks and investment-grade deposit certificates with original maturities of three months or less. Cash and cash equivalents are held with a Canadian Chartered Bank. As at December 31, 2019, the Company did not hold any cash equivalents.

Financial instruments

Financial assets

Financial instruments are recognized when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Financial instruments are recognized initially at fair value plus, for instruments not at fair value through profit or loss, any directly attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition, financial instruments are measured as described below based on their classification in the following categories:

Loans and receivables, Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss and Held to Maturity financial assets

The Company has no financial instruments classified as loans and receivables, held to maturity or available for sale.

Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss (FVTPL)

An instrument is classified as fair value through profit or loss if it is held-for-trading or is designated as such upon initial recognition. Financial instruments are designated at fair value through profit or loss if the Company manages such investments and makes purchase and sale decisions based on their fair value in accordance with the Company's documented risk management or investment strategy. Upon initial recognition, attributable transaction costs are recognized in profit or loss when incurred. Financial instruments at fair value through profit or loss are measured at fair value, and changes therein are recognized in profit or loss. Cash is classified as FVTPL.

Other financial liabilities

Other financial liabilities are initially measured at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at amortized cost using the effective interest method, with interest expense recognized on an effective yield basis. Liabilities in this category include accounts payable and accrued liabilities.

Equity instruments

An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of an entity after deducting all of its liabilities. Equity instruments issued by the Company are recorded at the proceeds received, net of direct issue costs.

Fair value of financial instruments

The fair value of financial instruments that are traded in active markets at each reporting date is determined by reference to quoted market prices or dealer price quotations. For financial instruments not traded in an active market, the fair value is determined using appropriate valuation techniques. Such techniques may include using recent arm's length market transactions; reference to the current fair value of another instrument that is substantially the same; discounted cash flow analysis; or, other valuation models.

Income taxes

Income tax included in operations for the periods presented comprises current and deferred tax. Income tax is recognized in operations except to the extent that it relates to items recognized directly in equity, in which case it is recognized in equity.

Current tax expense is the expected tax payable on the taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at period end, adjusted for amendments to tax payable with regards to previous years.

Deferred tax is recorded using the statement of financial position method, providing for temporary differences, between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purposes and the amounts used for taxation purposes. The amount of deferred tax provided is based on the expected manner of realization or settlement of the carrying amount of assets and liabilities, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

A deferred tax asset is recognized only to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the asset can be utilized.

Loss per share

Loss per share is based on the weighted average number of common shares of the Company outstanding during the period. The diluted loss per share reflects the potential dilution of common share equivalents, such as outstanding share options and warrants, in the weighted average number of common shares outstanding during the period, if dilutive. In the Company's case, diluted loss per share is the same as basic loss per share as the effects of including all outstanding options and warrants would be anti-dilutive.

Significant accounting judgements and estimates

The preparation of these financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of expenses during the reporting period. Actual outcomes could differ from these estimates. The financial statements include estimates which, by their nature, are uncertain. The impacts of such estimates are pervasive throughout the financial statements, and may require accounting adjustments based on future occurrences. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised and the revision affects both current and future periods. Such estimates include, but are not limited to, the valuation of share-based payments and income tax accounts.

Accounting Standards Adopted

IFRS 16 – "Leases" ("IFRS 16"), which replaced IAS 17 – "Leases", and its associated interpretative guidance. IFRS 16 applies a control model to the identification of leases, distinguishing between a lease and a service contract on the basis of whether the customer controls the asset being leased. For those assets determined to meet the definition of a lease, IFRS 16 introduces significant changes to the accounting by lessees, introducing a single, on balance sheet accounting model that is similar to current finance lease accounting, with limited exceptions for short-term leases or leases of low value assets. Lessor accounting remains similar to current accounting practice. The standard became effective for annual periods beginning on or after January 1, 2019. The adoption of this standard had no impact on the financial statements as the Company is not party to any leases.
