INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information in respect of the resolutions to be proposed at the 2025 Annual General Meeting for the approval of (a) proposed re-election of the Retiring Directors; (b) proposed re-appointment of independent auditors; (c) the grant to the Directors of the Proposed Issue Mandate; (d) the grant to the Directors of the Proposed Buy-back Mandate; and (e) the extension of the Proposed Issue Mandate to issue Shares by adding to it the aggregate number of the issued Shares bought back under the Proposed Buy-back Mandate.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

Pursuant to Article 88 of the Articles of Association, Ms. Wang Xue (“**Ms. Wang**”) will retire from office at the 2025 Annual General Meeting and being eligible for re-election.

Pursuant to Article 97 of the Articles of Association, Mr. Jiang Zhaobai (“**Mr. Jiang**”), Mr. Ho Yiu Yue, Louis (“**Mr. Ho**”) and Mr. Ko Ming Tung, Edward (“**Mr. Ko**”) will retire from office by rotation at the 2025 Annual General Meeting and being eligible for re-election.

Ms. Wang, Mr. Jiang, Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko (the “**Retiring Directors**”) have offered themselves for re-election at the 2025 Annual General Meeting.

The factors taken into account by the Board, the process and the discussion of the Board with respect to the proposed re-election of Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko as independent non-executive Director of the Company are set out below:

The Nomination Committee is responsible for making recommendations to the Board on selection of individuals nominated for directorships. When evaluating Directors for nomination, the Nomination Committee considered the potential contributions the Director can bring to the Board in terms of qualifications, skills, experience, independence, age, culture, ethnicity and gender diversity in accordance with the Board Diversity Policy and Nomination Policy of the Company. The Nomination Committee will then make recommendations to the Board for its consideration, with the Board determining whether to recommend the proposed Directors for re-election at a general meeting.

Each of Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko has given a confirmation of independence (“**Independence Confirmation**”) to the Company. The Nomination Committee has assessed and reviewed their Independence Confirmation based on the independence criteria as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and considers Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko to be independent and believes that they should be re-elected. Each of Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko (being the members of the Nomination Committee) had abstained from deliberation and decision in respect of assessment of his own independence.

Mr. Ho, has consistently provided objective insights and expressed independent judgment, offering valuable advice to the Board in his roles as an independent non-executive Director, Chairman of the Audit Committee, and member of both the Remuneration Committee and the Nomination Committee of the Company. With extensive knowledge and experience in finance and accounting, Mr. Ho, as an accounting professional, has also contributed impartial advice during the Board’s decision-making processes, making significant contributions to the Board and its committees.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Mr. Ko is a legal professional with extensive experience in legal consultation and services. Over the years, he has consistently provided valuable insights and independent guidance to the Company. Mr. Ko has held directorships in a number of companies listed in Hong Kong. His professional background, combined with his extensive experience and comprehensive knowledge in the legal field, enables him to contribute effectively and offer a broad perspective to the Board and the Group regarding its business development.

Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko possess diverse blend of skills, background, experience and viewpoint that are crucial to drive the Company forward in the ever-evolving competitive landscape. They bring a broad perspective to the Board and provide constructive thoughts for the Company's overall strategic planning and business development. The Nomination Committee is of the view that Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko will continue to contribute to the Board with a diversity of perspectives, skills and experience. According to the code provision B.2.3 of the Corporate Governance Code as set out in Appendix C1 to the Listing Rules, if an independent non-executive director has served more than nine years, his further appointment should be subject to a separate resolution to be approved by Shareholders. Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko have served as independent non-executive Directors for more than nine years. Therefore, the re-election of Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko will be subject to a separate resolution.

The Nomination Committee considers that Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko have expressed valuable opinions and provided independent guidance to the Company over the years, which has benefited the Board a lot and contributed to safeguarding the interests of Shareholders. The long services of Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko would not affect them to exercise independent judgement and the Nomination Committee is satisfied that Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko have the required character, integrity and experience to continue fulfilling their roles as independent non-executive Director.

Taking into consideration the above factors, the Nomination Committee is satisfied that Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko can bring broad perspectives, invaluable knowledge, skills and experiences to the Board and contributes to diversity of the Board. The Board, having considered the recommendation of the Nomination Committee, accepted the nomination by the Nomination Committee and considers that the re-election of Mr. Ho and Mr. Ko as Director are in the best interest of the Company and Shareholders as a whole.

Details of the Retiring Directors which are required to be disclosed under the Listing Rules are set out in Appendix I to this circular.

If a valid notice from a Shareholder to propose a person to stand for election as a Director at the 2025 Annual General Meeting is received in accordance with the Companies Ordinance after the printing of this circular, the Company will issue a supplementary circular to inform Shareholders of the details of such additional candidate(s) proposed.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

PROPOSED RE-APPOINTMENT OF INDEPENDENT AUDITORS

Upon the recommendation of the audit committee of the Company, the Board proposes to re-appoint HLB Hodgson Impey Cheng Limited as the independent auditors of the Company to hold office until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting. A resolution will also be proposed to authorise the Board to fix the auditors' remuneration. HLB Hodgson Impey Cheng Limited has indicated its willingness to be re-appointed as the independent auditors of the Company for the said period.

PROPOSED GRANTING OF GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND TO BUY-BACK SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 5 September 2024, ordinary resolutions were passed granting the Existing Buy-back Mandate and the Existing Issue Mandate to the Directors.

In accordance with the provisions of the Listing Rules and the terms of the Existing Issue Mandate and the Existing Buy-back Mandate, the Existing Issue Mandate and the Existing Buy-back Mandate shall lapse if, inter alia, they are revoked or varied by ordinary resolutions of the Shareholders in general meeting.

Ordinary resolutions set out as resolutions 4(1)(d) and 4(2)(c) in the AGM Notice will be proposed at the 2025 Annual General Meeting to revoke the Existing Issue Mandate and the Existing Buy-back Mandate respectively. Ordinary resolutions to consider, and if thought fit, to approve the Proposed Issue Mandate and the Proposed Buy-back Mandate as set out in resolutions 4(1)(a), (b), (c) and (e) and resolutions 4(2)(a), (b) and (d) in the AGM Notice respectively will also be proposed at the 2025 Annual General Meeting. With reference to the Proposed Issue Mandate and the Proposed Buy-back Mandate, the Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plans to issue or to buy-back any Shares pursuant thereto. As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue was 7,294,369,363 Shares. Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the Proposed Issue Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares will be issued or bought back before the 2025 Annual General Meeting, the Company will be allowed to issue a maximum of 1,458,873,872 Shares upon exercise of the Proposed Issue Mandate in full.

An explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to be sent to the Shareholders in connection with the Proposed Buy-back Mandate is set out in the Appendix II to this circular. The explanatory statement contains all information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the relevant resolution at the 2025 Annual General Meeting.

Ordinary resolution set out as resolution 4(3) in the AGM Notice will also be proposed at the 2025 Annual General Meeting to extend the Proposed Issue Mandate by adding to it the aggregate number of the issued Shares bought back under the Proposed Buy-back Mandate.

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This appendix sets out the information, as required to be disclosed by the Listing Rules, on the Directors proposed to be re-elected at the 2025 Annual General Meeting.

Ms. WANG Xue (“Ms. Wang”)

Ms. Wang aged 40, is currently an overseas affairs assistant to the chairman of Shanghai Pengxin (Group) Company Limited, which owned as 99% by Mr. Jiang Zhaobai, a non-executive Director and chairman of the Company. Ms. Wang received a double bachelor’s degree in law and literature from Shanghai University of Finance and Economics. She has over 15 years of experience in the field of international investment and operations. From 2010 to 2016, she served as the international investment director of the tourism and commercial division of Fosun International Limited (a company listed on the Hong Kong Stock Exchange, stock code HK0656). From 2017 to 2019, she served as the acting general manager of Mini-Camp. From 2020 to 2023, she served as the deputy chief human resources officer and general manager of the Innovation and Leadership Center of Fosun Tourism and Culture Group (a company listed on the Hong Kong Stock Exchange, stock code HK1992).

The Company has not entered into any director’s service contract with Ms. Wang but has entered into a letter of appointment with her. Although Ms. Wang had not been appointed for a specific term, but she is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Articles of Association. Pursuant to the letter of appointment, Ms. Wang shall be entitled to receive a director’s fees of HK\$240,000 per annum, which has been determined by the Board upon recommendation of the remuneration committee of the Company with reference to her experience and duties with the Company and prevailing market conditions. The remuneration of Ms. Wang will be subject to annual review by the remuneration committee of the Company and the Board.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. Wang did not have any interests in Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Save as disclosed, as at the Latest Practicable Date, (i) Ms. Wang did not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company; (ii) she did not have any interest in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO; (iii) she did not hold any other directorships in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years; and (iv) she did not hold other positions with other members of the Group.

There is no other information in relation to the re-election of Ms. Wang which is required to be disclosed pursuant to Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules. Save as disclosed above, there are no other matters in relation to the re-election of Ms. Wang that need to be brought to the attention of the holders of securities of the Company.

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Mr. JIANG Zhaobai (“Mr. Jiang”)

Mr. JIANG Zhaobai, aged 62, appointed as an executive Director and Chairman of the Board in September 2012 and re-designated to a non-executive Director from 1 November 2023. He has over 30 years’ experience in real estate development and investment in the PRC and extensive experience in international investment including agriculture and animal husbandry industries and mining, new energy and its related business field etc. He is also the chairman of the board of Shanghai Pengxin (Group) Co., Ltd. (“**Shanghai Pengxin Group**”). Mr. Jiang is the founder of Shanghai Pengxin Group. Mr. Jiang was appointed as vice president of China Enterprise Directors Association from July 2010 to July 2015 and is currently vice president of China-Latin American and Caribbean Friendship Association. He graduated in Nanjing Institute of Architecture and Civil Engineering and was admitted to an Executive Master of Business Administration degree at China Europe International Business School in June 2005. He is the father of Mr. Jiang Xiao Heng Jason, an executive Director and a substantial shareholder of the Company.

The Company has entered into a service agreement with Mr. Jiang and Mr. Jiang had not been appointed for a specific term, but he is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Articles of Association. Mr. Jiang is entitled to receive fixed director’s fee of HK\$240,000 per annum. However, the Board, on the recommendation of the remuneration committee of the Company, may determine his remuneration from time to time with reference to his experience and responsibilities with the Company and the prevailing market condition.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Jiang did not have any interest in Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. His son, Mr. Jiang Xiao Heng Jason was deemed to be interested in 2,042,210,000 Shares, representing approximately 28% of the total number of issued Shares, within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Save as disclosed, as at the Latest Practicable Date, (i) Mr. Jiang did not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company; (ii) he did not have any interest in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO; (iii) he did not hold any other directorships in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years; and (iv) he did not hold other positions with other members of the Group.

There is no other information in relation to the re-election of Mr. Jiang which is required to be disclosed pursuant to Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules. Save as disclosed above, there are no other matters in relation to the re-election of Mr. Jiang that need to be brought to the attention of the holders of securities of the Company.

Mr. HO Yiu Yue, Louis (“Mr. Ho”)

Mr. HO Yiu Yue, Louis, aged 77 was appointed as an independent non-executive Director in April 2009. He is also the Chairman of the Audit Committee and the Remuneration Committee of the Company and a member of the Nomination Committee. He obtained a master degree of business administration in finance & operations research from Concordia University in Canada and is an associate member of both Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and Australia Society of Certificate Practising Accountants. Mr. Ho had over 30 years working experience with international accounting professional firms and had been admitted as partner in Ernst & Young, PricewaterhouseCoopers and Arthur Andersen, focusing on technology risk, system and process assurance and risk consulting practices. During that period, Mr. Ho provided services and advices to numerous blue chip corporations in both Hong Kong and the PRC. Mr. Ho was an independent non-executive director of China Pipe Group Limited, whose shares are listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange.

The Company has not entered into a service agreement with Mr. Ho and Mr. Ho had not been appointed for a specific term, but he is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Articles of Association. Mr. Ho is entitled to receive a fixed director’s fee of HK\$240,000 per annum, which has been approved by the Board with reference to his duties and responsibilities in the Company, his qualifications, experiences and the prevailing market situation.

Save as disclosed above, there are no other matters in relation to the re-election of Mr. Ko that need to be brought to the attention of the holders of securities of the Company.

This appendix contains the particulars that are required by the Listing Rules to be included in an explanatory statement to enable the Shareholders to make an informed view on whether to vote for or against the resolution to be proposed at the 2025 Annual General Meeting in relation to the Proposed Buy-back Mandate.

(1) SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue was 7,294,369,363 Shares. Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the Proposed Buy-back Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares will be issued or bought back before the 2025 Annual General Meeting, the Company will be allowed to buy-back a maximum of 729,436,936 Shares during the period ending on the earlier of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by law or the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by a resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

(2) SOURCE OF FUNDS

Buy-backs must be funded out of fund legally available for the purpose and in accordance with the Articles and the laws of Hong Kong, the jurisdiction in which the Company is incorporated.

(3) REASONS FOR BUY-BACKS

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders to seek a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to buy-back its Shares on the Stock Exchange. Such buy-back may, depending on market conditions, and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value of the Company and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a buy-back will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

The Directors have no present intention to buy-back any Shares and they would only exercise the power to buy-back in circumstances where they consider that the buy-back would be in the best interests of the Company. The Directors consider that if the general mandate to buy-back Shares were to be exercised in full at the prevailing market value, it would have a material adverse impact on the working capital position and gearing position of the Company, as compared with the positions disclosed in the audited consolidated accounts of the Company for year ended 31 March 2025, being the date to which the latest published accounts of the Company were made up. The Directors do not propose to exercise the general mandate to buy-back Shares to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels of the Company which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

(5) GENERAL

To the best of their knowledge, having made all reasonable enquiries, none of the Directors nor any of their close associates currently intends to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the Proposed Buy-back Mandate is approved.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will only exercise the Proposed Buy-back Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Hong Kong.

No core connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company has notified the Company that he has a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company, or has undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Proposed Buy-back Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

If as a result of a buy-back of Shares pursuant to the Proposed Buy-back Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purposes of the Rule 32 of the Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (as defined in the Code), depending on the level of increase of the Shareholders' interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Code.

Accordingly, such increase will give rise to an

obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Code. The Directors have no present intention to exercise in full the power to buy-back Shares proposed to be granted pursuant to the Proposed Buy-back Mandate.

The Listing Rules prohibit a company from making buy-back on the Stock Exchange if the result of the buy-back would be that less than 25% (or such other prescribed minimum percentage as determined by the Stock Exchange) of the total number of issued Shares would be in public hands. The Directors do not propose to buy-back Shares which would result in less than the prescribed minimum percentage of issued Shares in public hands.
