1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with the notice of AGM and information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to, among other things, (i) the grant of the Issue Mandate to the Directors; (ii) the grant of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors; (iii) the grant of the Extension Mandate to the Directors; (iv) the retirement and re-election of Directors; and (v) the re-appointment of the Company's auditor and authorization of the Board to fix its remuneration.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

2. ISSUE MANDATE, REPURCHASE MANDATE AND EXTENSION MANDATE

In order to give the flexibility to the Company to issue and repurchase Shares if and when appropriate, separate ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the AGM:

- (a) to grant the Issue Mandate to the Directors, i.e. to exercise all the powers of the Company to allot, issue and otherwise deal with additional Shares up to a maximum of 20% of the number of issued Shares as at the date of passing of such resolution;
- (b) to grant the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors, i.e. to exercise all the power of the Company to repurchase Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the number of issued Shares as at the date of passing of such resolution; and
- (c) to grant the Extension Mandate, i.e. to increase the number of Shares to be issued and allotted under the Issue Mandate by an additional number representing such number of Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate.

Pursuant to the ordinary resolution of the Shareholders passed on 22 May 2025, a general mandate was granted to the Directors to (i) allot, issue and deal with new Shares of the Company not exceeding 20 per cent of its number of issued Shares; and (ii) to repurchase Shares not exceeding 10 per cent of its number of issued Shares. Both of such mandates, to the extent not utilised by the date of the AGM, will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the total issued share capital of the Company was 1,866,240,000 Shares. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution for the grant of the Issue Mandate and on the basis that no Shares are allotted and issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the maximum number of new Shares to be issued under the Issue Mandate (if approved by the Shareholders at the AGM) is 366,648,000 Shares.

Furthermore, as at the Latest Practicable Date, the total issued share capital of the Company was 1,866,240,000 Shares. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution for the grant of the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no Shares are allotted and issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the maximum number of new Shares to be repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate (if approved by the Shareholders at the AGM) is 366,648,000 Shares.

Each of the Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate, if approved, will continue in force until the earliest of: (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company following the AGM; or (b) the end of the period within which the Company is required by the Companies Law or the Articles of Association to hold its next annual general meeting; or (c) the revocation or variation of the authority given under such resolution by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in a general meeting prior to the next annual general meeting of the Company following the AGM.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Under the Listing Rules, the Company is required to give the Shareholders all information which is reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the resolution for the grant of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors at the AGM. An explanatory statement in relation to the Repurchase Mandate is set out pursuant to Rule 10.06(1)(b) of the Listing Rules in Appendix I to this circular.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Directors have no immediate plan to issue any new Shares pursuant to the Issue Mandate. With reference to the Repurchase Mandate, the Directors have no immediate plan to repurchase any Shares pursuant thereof.

Under the Listing Rules, the Company is required to give to the Shareholders all information which is reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the resolution in respect of the Repurchase Mandate at the AGM. An explanatory statement in relation to the Repurchase Mandate is set out pursuant to Rule 10.06(1)(b) of the Listing Rules in Appendix I to this circular.

3. RETIREMENT AND RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Pursuant to articles 84(1) of the Articles of Association, one-third of the Directors for the time being shall retire from office by rotation, provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement at an AGM at least once every three years. Pursuant to articles 83(3) and 84(2) of the Articles of Association, Mr. Li Congwei (an executive Director), Mr. Wang Lun (an executive Director) and Mr. Nathan Pau (an independent non-executive Director) shall retire from office by rotation at the AGM. Being eligible, each of them will offer themselves for re-election as Directors at the same meeting.

The biographical details of the above mentioned Directors who are subject to re-election at the AGM are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

The re-election of Directors has been reviewed by the Nomination Committee, which has made recommendation to the Board that the re-election be proposed for the Shareholders' approval at the forthcoming AGM of the Company.

The Nomination Committee has reviewed the biographical details of Mr. Li Congwei, Mr. Wang Lun and Mr. Nathan Pau and their meeting of nomination criteria (including but not limited to, character, professional qualifications, skills, knowledge and experience that are relevant to the Company's business and corporate strategy, time commitment to effectively discharge duties as Board member) set out in the nomination policy of the Company and has considered the diversity aspects (including but not limited to gender, age, cultural and educational background, ethnicity, professional experience, skills, knowledge and length of services) set out in the diversity policy of the Company, and has taken the view that Mr. Li Congwei, Mr. Wang Lun and Mr. Nathan Pau have been contributing to the Group effectively and are committed to their role as Directors.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

The Board has accepted the recommendation by the Nomination Committee for recommending the Shareholders to re-elect Mr. Li Congwei, Mr. Wang Lun and Mr. Nathan Pau as Directors at the AGM. Each of them abstained from voting at the Board meeting regarding their nomination. The Board considers that the re-election of Mr. Li Congwei, Mr. Wang Lun and Mr. Nathan Pau as Directors is in the best interest of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole and recommends the Shareholders to vote in favour of their re-election at the AGM.

Furthermore, each of the independent non-executive Directors of the Company, has confirmed independence with reference to the factors set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. The Nomination Committee is also responsible for, *inter alia*, assessing the independence of independent non-executive Directors. The Nomination Committee assessed and reviewed the individual independent non-executive Director's annual confirmation of independence based on the independence criteria as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules, and affirmed that all independent non-executive Directors remained independent.

4. PROPOSED RE-APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR OF THE COMPANY

KTC Partners CPA Limited will retire as the auditor of the Company at the AGM and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-appointment. The Board, upon the recommendation of the audit committee of the Company, proposed to re-appoint KTC Partners CPA Limited as auditor of the Company to hold office until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting. A resolution will also be proposed to authorise the Board to fix the auditor's remuneration. KTC Partners CPA Limited has indicated its willingness to be re-appointed as the Company's auditor for the said period.

5. AGM AND PROXY ARRANGEMENT

A notice convening the AGM to be held at 22/F, Euro Trade Centre, 13–14 Connaught Road Central, Central, Hong Kong on Thursday, 21 May 2026 at 11:00 a.m. is set out on pages AGM-1 to AGM-5 of this circular. At the AGM, in addition to the ordinary businesses of the meeting, resolutions will be proposed for approval on the proposed Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate as special businesses.

For determining eligibility to attend and vote at the AGM, the register of members of the Company will be closed from Friday, 15 May 2026 to Thursday, 21 May 2026, both days inclusive, during which period no transfer of Shares will be registered. In order to be eligible to attend and vote at the AGM, all transfer of Shares, accompanied by the relevant share certificates, must be lodged with the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at 17/F, Far East Finance Centre, 16 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong, for registration not later than 4:30 p.m. on Thursday, 14 May 2026.

The annual report incorporating the audited consolidated financial statements of the Group for the year ended 31 December 2025 and the reports of the Directors and the independent auditor of the Company thereon are dispatched to the Shareholders together with this circular.

A form of proxy for use by the Shareholders at the AGM is enclosed with this circular. Whether or not you intend to attend and vote at the AGM in person, you are requested to complete the enclosed form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and return the same to the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited, at 17/F, Far East Finance Centre, 16 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event no later than Tuesday, 19 May 2026 at 11:00 a.m. (Hong Kong time) or not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude the Shareholders from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjourned meeting should you so wish, and in such event, the form of proxy shall be deemed to be revoked.

6. VOTING BY POLL

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of Shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll. Therefore, the chairman of the AGM will demand a poll for all the resolutions to be put forward at the AGM pursuant to article 66 of the Articles of Association. The Company will appoint scrutineers to handle vote-taking procedures at the AGM. The results of the poll will be published on the websites of the Stock Exchange and the Company as soon as possible after the AGM in accordance with Rule 13.39(5) of the Listing Rules.

7. RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

8. RECOMMENDATION

The Board is pleased to recommend all of the retiring Directors to stand for re-election by Shareholders as Directors. The Directors also consider that the proposed resolutions set out in the notice of AGM, including but not limited to the grant of the Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Accordingly, the Directors recommend all the Shareholders to vote in favour of the said ordinary resolutions to be proposed at the AGM.

APPENDIX I EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required under the Listing Rules, to provide requisite information to Shareholders in connection with the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the authorised share capital of the Company was HK\$60,000,000 divided into 3,000,000,000 Shares, among which a total of 1,866,240,000 Shares were issued and fully paid-up.

Subject to the passing of the relevant ordinary resolution at the AGM approving the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the AGM, the Company will be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 1,866,240,000 Shares.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that the proposed grant of the Repurchase Mandate is in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. The Repurchase Mandate will give the Company the flexibility to repurchase Shares as and when appropriate. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

In repurchasing the Shares, the Company may only apply funds of the Company legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Listing Rules, the Articles of Association, the laws of the Cayman Islands, and other applicable laws.

A listed company may not repurchase its own securities on the Stock Exchange for a consideration other than cash or for settlement otherwise than in accordance with the trading rules of the Stock Exchange from time to time.

Under the Companies Law, any repurchases by the Company may be made out of profits of the Company, out of the Company's share premium account or out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for the purpose of the repurchase or, if authorised by the Articles of Association and subject to the Companies Law, out of capital. Any premium payable on a redemption or purchase over the par value of the Shares to be repurchased must be provided for out of either or both of the profits or the share premium account of the Company, or, if authorised by the Articles of Association and subject to the Companies Law, out of capital.

4. STATUS OF REPURCHASED SHARES

The Listing Rules provide that the listing of all repurchased shares is automatically cancelled and that the certificates for those shares must be cancelled and destroyed. Under the laws of the Cayman Islands, a company's repurchased shares may be treated as cancelled or held as treasury shares. When cancelled, the Company's issued share capital (but not the authorised share capital) will be reduced accordingly.

5. IMPACT ON WORKING CAPITAL OR GEARING POSITION

Taking into account the current working capital position of the Company, the Directors consider that, the exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full will have a material adverse impact on the working capital and/or gearing position of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the Company's audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2025. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

6. DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best knowledge of the Directors having made all reasonable enquiries, none of the Directors nor, any of their close associates have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

No core connected persons of the Company have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or have undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Company is authorised to make repurchases of Shares.

7. UNDERTAKING OF THE DIRECTORS

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the power of the Company to make repurchases of Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, the Articles of Association, the Companies Law, the laws of the Cayman Islands and the applicable laws.

8. EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition of voting rights for the purpose of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code and Rule 6 of the Share Buy-backs Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (within the meaning of the Takeovers Code), could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

APPENDIX I EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best knowledge of the Directors, the Company had not been notified of any Shareholders who were interested in 5% or more of the Company's issued share capital.

On the basis of the current shareholdings of the Shareholders, an exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full will not result in causing them becoming obliged to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that will result in a requirement of the above Shareholders, or any other persons to make a general offer under the Takeovers Code or the number of Shares in the hands of the public falling below the prescribed minimum percentage of 25%. The Directors have no present intention of exercising the Repurchase Mandate.

The Directors are also aware that the Listing Rules prohibit a company from making repurchase on the Stock Exchange if the result of the repurchase would be that less than 25% (such other prescribed minimum percentage as determined by the Stock Exchange) of the issued share capital would be in the hands of the public. The Directors have no present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that would result in the Company failing to comply with the public float requirements under the Rule 8.08 of the Listing Rules.

9. SHARES PURCHASES MADE BY THE COMPANY

No repurchase of Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) have been made by the Company during the last six months preceding to the Latest Practicable Date.

11. CONFIRMATION

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, stated below are the biographical details of the Directors who will retire and be eligible for re-election at the AGM.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Mr. Li Congwei (“Mr. Li”)

Mr. Li, aged 38, holds an associate degree in Tourism Management (Marketing) from Nanjing Institute of Tourism & Hospitality. He is a seasoned cross-sector manager with diverse industry experience and exceptional business operational capabilities. Mr. Li’s career spans four core sectors: technology, tourism, hospitality, and international trade. He has led technology strategy and market development at a technology company, deepened cross border tourism resource integration during his tenure at an international travel agency, and gained high-end service management and international operational expertise at the Suzhou Sheraton Hotel.
