Dream faded before intermission

Old cities survive through remembrance. The day memory weakens; stone begins dying too. In 2016, Pakistani authorities declared both houses protected heritage sites. Historians, film lovers, conservationists, and admirers across South Asia welcomed the announcement with emotion and hope. There were grand visions restoration projects, cinematic museums, archival galleries displaying handwritten letters, vintage photographs, gramophone records, costumes, film posters, and memorabilia celebrating a shared artistic inheritance.

People imagined these havelis reborn as sanctuaries of dialogue beyond politics. Young visitors from Mumbai, Karachi, Lahore or Delhi could walk through restored corridors and discover how art once travelled freely across the subcontinent before borders interrupted humanity.

But like many beautiful promises in tragic cinema, the dream faded before intermission. Years slipped away in bureaucratic silence. Restoration remained mostly symbolic while rain, neglect, and time continued their ruthless work. Nature merely accelerated the destruction of official indifference had already begun.

Today, grief hangs heavily across Peshawar's old quarters. Elderly residents still remember tourists arriving reverentially to photograph the carved gateways associated with cinema's greatest legends. Once those streets vibrated with curiosity and pride. Now barricades stand where admiration once gathered.

Heritage activists continue



warning that without urgent intervention, these buildings may soon become irretrievable ruins. Conservation demands more than speeches. It requires architects, engineers, craftsmen, historians, and above all emotional responsibility. Heritage survives only when affection transforms itself into action. Yet beyond physical collapse lies an even deeper tragedy.

If these homes disappear, future generations may inherit stories stripped of geography - legends detached from the very soil that shaped them. Cinema itself is an act of preservation. It rescues fleeting gestures from oblivion. Songs outlive empires. Dialogues survive dictators. Faces continue glowing decades after death. And still, the birthplaces of some of South Asia's greatest cinematic visionaries now stand abandoned before history's indifference.

If Kapoor Haveli collapses, it will resemble the extinguishing of an ancient projector whose beam once illuminated millions of hearts. If Dilip Kumar's ancestral home vanishes into rubble, an irreplaceable chapter of cultural memory will disappear with it.

And yet, hope stubbornly survives, just like in the final scene of a Bollywood classic where darkness trembles before one last possibility of light. Across the world, endangered heritage has often been rescued when ordinary citizens, artists, governments, historians, and dreamers united beyond politics. These homes can

still become vibrant museums of cinema and Partition memory. Their courtyards can once again host poetry readings, film screenings, ghazal evenings, theatre workshops, and conversations celebrating intertwined histories rather than divided identities. Hope UNESCO will declare these two decaying buildings as UNESCO World Heritage Centre to save legacy of cinema in India.

Imagine schoolchildren walking through restored corridors where Raj Kapoor once dreamt of Bombay's silver screen. Imagine listening rooms echoing with Dilip Kumar's unforgettable dialogues. Imagine discovering that before maps were fractured by Partition, creativity flowed from Peshawar to Bombay like one indivisible river of imagination.

Tonight, rain once again fell over old Peshawar. Ancient walls groan beneath time's merciless weight. Beneath cracked plaster still linger echoes of harmoniums, rehearsed dialogues, childhood laughter, and the first heartbeat of artistic destiny. History now waits silently at a fragile crossroads. Will humanity choose preservation over amnesia? Or will the long cinematic journey from Peshawar to Bombay finally end beneath rubble, rain, and forgetting?

Satyadev's 16th film 'Samavarthi'

Actor Satyadev Kanchanra on Saturday unveiled the first-look poster of his 16th film, Samavarthi, an ecological action thriller directed by Ajay N V.

Produced by Shivacharan Reddy Jakki and Shashidhar Reddy Padamati under Rudra Pictures and Panchabhuta Productions, Samavarthi will release in Telugu, Tamil, Kannada and Malayalam. The first look shows Satyadev in an intense avatar, calmly wearing headphones while a group of men



armed with axes and knives charge toward him. A tiger and other natural motifs in the poster underline the film's ecological theme.

The makers describe the project as an "Ecological Action Thriller," promising high-octane action woven into an environmental conflict — a new zone for Satyadev that leans into heightened physicality and intensity.

Cast includes Dileesh Pothan, Rajeev Kanakala, Govind Laxman, Ravindra Vijay, Mohan Bhagath and others. Key crew:

designer Ullas Hairur, art director Monkur Ravikumar and costume designer Priyanka Rebbe. Producer is Vinay Reddy Mamidi and executive producer Ujjwal BM.

The poster and title have generated early buzz, setting expectations for a gritty, nature-infused actioner from Satyadev.

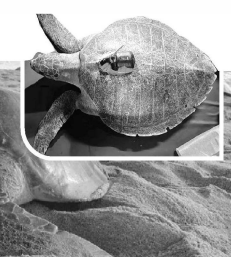

World Turtle Day

Chennai's Turtle Treasure: The Olive Ridley



Every year on May 23, the world pauses to celebrate a creature that has been quietly sharing this planet with us for millions of years: the turtle. But World Turtle Day is not just about celebration. It is also a reminder that turtles and tortoises are under growing pressure from pollution, habitat loss, fishing nets and climate change.

Turtles may move slowly, but the threats around them are moving fast. Across the world, many species are now endangered or critically endangered, with plastic waste, illegal trade and shrinking nesting grounds pushing them closer to trouble.

In India, the story is both hopeful and worrying. Along the Tamil Nadu coast, Olive Ridley turtles continue to nest in large numbers, and conservation teams have reported record hatchling

releases in recent seasons. But deaths at sea and along the shore show how fragile their survival still is. In Chennai, one of the best-known conservation efforts is the turtle walk organised by the Students Sea Turtle Conservation Network (SSTCN) along with forest and wildlife staff. The walk usually covers the stretch from Neelangarai to Besant Nagar, and participants join late at night to look for turtle nests and help protect eggs before they are moved to hatcheries. During the season, which runs mainly from January to April, hatchlings are later released safely into the sea, and the public can sometimes take part in those releases as well.

This community-led effort has become a unique way for Chennai residents to learn about turtles while directly supporting conservation.

Why protect turtles: Because they are more

than slow-moving creatures on land or in water. Sea turtles help keep seagrass beds and coral reefs healthy, while freshwater turtles support the balance of rivers and wetlands. When turtles disappear, the habitats and species around them can suffer too.

Technology is now giving conservationists a new edge. Scientists use satellite tags to track migration routes, drones to monitor nesting beaches and AI to identify individual turtles from photos. These tools help researchers protect turtles more effectively without disturbing them.

As a digital boost, Apps such as TurtleTracker help people record turtle sightings, spot movement patterns and support protection efforts through community reporting.

Simple reminder: Protect beaches, reduce plastic, respect wildlife and keep nesting areas safe. Even small actions, such as cleaning up litter or supporting conservation efforts, can help turtles survive for the next generation.

There is something deeply appealing about turtles. Their calm pace, long lives and shell-like homes make them easy to love. But beyond that charm, they play an important role in keeping ecosystems healthy.

This World Turtle Day, the message is clear: Slow down, look around and give turtles a fighting chance. They have been here far longer than we have, and with care, they can keep swimming, nesting and surviving for years to come.
