Sentencing on
deaths of desi
family of four

More than three years after a family of four from India froze to death while trying to cross into the US along a remote stretch of the Canadian border in a blizzard, two men face sentencing in Minnesota on Wednesday on human smuggling charges for their roles in what prosecutors call an international conspiracy. Federal prosecutors have recommended nearly 20 years in prison for the alleged ringleader, Harshkumar Ramanlal Patel, and nearly 11 years for the driver who was supposed to pick up the family, Steve Anthony Shand. The prison terms are up to US District Judge John Tunheim, who declined last month to set aside the guilty verdicts, writing, "This was not a close case." Tunheim will hand down the sentences at the federal courthouse in the northwestern Minnesota city of Fergus Falls, where the two men were tried and convicted on four counts apiece last November.

PIO fined
for feeding
pigeons

A 70-year-old Indian-origin woman was fined SGD 1,200 (USD 930) on Wednesday for illegally feeding pigeons near her apartment block in Singapore. Samugamathian Shamilia pleaded guilty to two counts of feeding wild birds under the Wildlife Act, reported Channel News Asia. Eleven similar charges, including for disrupting a National Parks Board (NParks) pigeon trapping exercise, were taken into consideration. Shamilia was caught when NParks enforcement officers conducted checks near her home.

Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Azerbaijan President Ilham Aliyev reaffirmed their countries' shared commitment to diversifying strategic partnership through investment in mutually beneficial avenues, a media report said. During their meeting in Lachin on Tuesday, the two leaders reviewed the full spectrum of bilateral relations and expressed satisfaction over the cooperation.

Independent Australian Senator Patyma Fayman has lodged a formal complaint with a parliamentary watchdog, alleging that a male colleague urged her to consume wine and "dance on the table" during an official function. Senator Fayman, 30, also claimed the colleague "made other inappropriate remarks after consuming 'too many drinks'." Speaking to national broadcaster ABC, Senator Fayman recounted the alleged incident, stating, "Let's get some wine into you and see you dance on the table." She further explained that she told the colleague, "Hey, I'm drinking a lime," before saying, "I'm not drinking with the formal complaint."

for Ukraine peace accordAgencies

President Vladimir Putin's conditions for ending the war in Ukraine include a demand that Western leaders pledge in writing to stop enlarging NATO eastwards and lift a chunk of sanctions on Russia, according to three Russian sources with knowledge of the negotiations.

US President Donald Trump has repeatedly said he wants to end the deadliest European conflict since World War Two and has shown increasing frustration with Putin in recent days, warning on Tuesday the Russian leader was "playing with fire" by refusing to engage in ceasefire talks with Kyiv as his forces made gains on the battlefield.

"What Vladimir Putin doesn't realize is that if it weren't for me, lots of really bad things would have already happened in Russia, and I mean REALLY BAD. He's playing with fire," Trump said in a Truth Social post on Tuesday.

Putin's foreign policy aide, Yuri Ushakov, told a state TV reporter that Trump's remark suggested that he is not well-briefed on the realities of the war.

After speaking to Trump for more than two hours last



week, Putin said that he had agreed to work with Ukraine on a memorandum that would establish the contours of a peace accord, including the timing of a ceasefire. Russia says it is currently drafting its version of the memorandum and cannot estimate how long that will take.

Kyiv and European governments have accused Moscow of stalling while its troops advance in eastern Ukraine.

"Putin is ready to make peace but not at any price," said one senior Russian source with knowledge of top-level Kremlin thinking, who spoke on condition of anonymity.

The three Russian sources said Putin wants a "written" pledge by major Western powers not to enlarge the US-led NATO alliance eastwards — shorthand for formally ruling out membership to Ukraine, Georgia and Moldova and

other former Soviet republics. Russia also wants Ukraine to be neutral, some Western sanctions lifted, a resolution of the issue of frozen Russian sovereign assets in the West, and protection for Russian speakers in Ukraine, the three sources said.

The first source said that, if Putin realizes he is unable to reach a peace deal on his own terms, he will seek to show the Ukrainians and the Europeans by military victories that "peace tomorrow will be even more painful".

The Kremlin did not respond to a request for comment on Reuters' reporting. Putin and Russian officials have repeatedly said any peace deal must address the "root causes" of the conflict — Russian shorthand for the issue of NATO enlargement and Western support for Ukraine.

Ukraine seals
defence pacts
with Germany

KYIV: Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy said on Wednesday that Ukraine and Germany had reached new agreements on defence sector investments. Zelenskyy, who was speaking in Berlin alongside German Chancellor Friedrich Merz, did not give further details. Kyiv has increasingly sought money from its allies to fund its own burgeoning defence industry.

Kyiv has repeatedly said that Russia should not be granted veto power over its aspirations to join the NATO alliance. Ukraine says it needs the West to give it a strong security guarantee with teeth to deter any future Russian attack.

President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's administration did not respond to a request for comment.

NATO has also in the past said that it will not change its "open door" policy just because Moscow demands it. A spokesman for the 32-member alliance did not respond to Reuters' questions.

Firing on aid seekers in
Gaza kills 1, injures 48Agencies
Gaza, Israel

At least one Palestinian was killed and 48 others wounded when forces opened fire on a crowd overturning a new aid distribution site in the Gaza Strip set up by an Israeli and US-backed foundation, Gaza's Health Ministry said Wednesday.

Crowds of Palestinians broke through the fences around the distribution site on Tuesday, and an Associated Press journalist heard Israeli tank and gun fire, and saw a military helicopter firing flares.

It was not yet known whether the deaths and injuries were caused by Israeli forces, private contractors or others. The foundation said its military contractors had not fired on the crowd but "fell back" before resuming aid operations. Israel said its troops nearby had fired warning shots.

Ajith Singh, head of the UN Human Rights Office for the Palestinian territories, had earlier told reporters in Geneva that as people were wounded, mostly by gunfire.

In a separate development, Israel said it had carried out airstrikes Wednesday on the international airport in Yemen's capital, Sanaa, after Iranian-backed Houthi rebels fired several missiles at the country in recent days, without causing casualties. The Israeli military said it destroyed aircraft used by the rebels.

Israeli airstrike
kills eight in Gaza
journalist's home

GAZA CITY: An Israeli airstrike on the home of journalist Osama al-Arbi in northern Gaza today reportedly killed eight people and wounded several others, according to Al Jazeera Arabic. Al-Arbi is said to have survived the strike, with video footage showing him being pulled from the rubble. Medical sources in Gaza reported a total of at least 15 fatalities from Israeli attacks across the Strip since the early hours of today.

In Sanaa on May 6, destroying the airport's terminal and leaving its runway riddled with craters. Some flights resumed to Sanaa on May 11.

Chaos at new aid hub

The distribution hub outside Gaza's southernmost city of Rafah was opened the day before by the Gaza Humanitarian

Foundation, which has been slated by Israel to take over aid operations.

The UN and other humanitarian organisations have rejected the new system, saying it would be unable to meet the needs of Gaza's 2.5 million people and allows Israel to use food as a weapon to control the population. They have also warned of the risk of friction between Israeli troops and people seeking supplies.

Palestinians have become desperate for food after nearly three months of Israeli border closures pushed Gaza to the brink of famine.

Israel says it helped establish the new aid mechanism to prevent Hamas from siphoning off supplies, but it has provided no evidence of systematic diversion, and UN agencies say they have mechanisms in place to prevent it. GHF says it has established four hubs, two of which have begun operating.

SpaceX suffers another setback,
Starship tumbles out of controlAgencies

After back-to-back explosions, SpaceX launched its mega rocket Starship again on Tuesday evening, but fell short of the main objectives when the spacecraft tumbled out of control and broke apart.

The 123-metre rocket blasted off on its ninth demo from Starbase, SpaceX's launch site at the southern tip of Texas. Residents voted this month to organise as an official city.

CEO Elon Musk's SpaceX hoped to release a series of mock satellites following liftoff, but that got derailed because the door failed to open all the way. Then the spacecraft began spinning as it skidded space toward an uncontrolled landing in the Indian Ocean.

SpaceX later confirmed that the spacecraft experienced "a rapid unscheduled disassembly," or burst apart. "Teams will continue to review data and work toward our next flight test," the company said in an online statement.

Musk noted in a post on X it was a "big improvement" from

Billionaire Elon Musk said he was "disappointed" with US President Donald Trump's legislative push for a massive spending package, which includes multi-trillion dollar tax breaks. "I think a bill can be big or it can be beautiful but I don't know if it can be both," he said.

The two previous demos, which ended in flaming debris over the Atlantic, Despite the latest setback, he

promised a faster launch pace moving forward, with a Starship soaring every three to four weeks for the next three flights.

It was the first time one of Musk's Starships — intended for Mars and Mars travel — flew with a recycled booster. There were no plans to catch the booster with giant chopsticks back at the launch pad, with the company instead pushing it to its limits.

Contact with the booster was lost at one point, and it slammed into the Gulf of Mexico in pieces as the spacecraft continued toward the Indian Ocean.

BNP stages

Former prime minister Khader Zia's Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) intensified pressure on the Muhammad Yunus-led interim government on Wednesday as tens of thousands of youths staged a massive rally demanding elections by December.

The national election must be held by December. Preparations must begin immediately. BNP's acting chairman Tarique Rahman said as he joined the rally through a virtual platform from London, where he currently lives.

He alleged the government's "delay tactics" in staging elections and push for "30-called reforms" were part of a broader plan to derail democratic processes.

"In the past, all caretaker governments held fair elections within three months. Today, it's been over 10 months and yet, the government has not even announced the date of the election," Rahman said.

French surgeon gets 20 years
in jail for raping 299 childrenAgencies
PARIS

A 74-year-old pedophile and former surgeon who raped hundreds of victims over a period spanning more than two decades was given a maximum 20-year prison sentence on Wednesday by a French court. Joel Le Scouarnec was found guilty of raping and sexually assaulting 299 children.

Judges followed the public prosecutor's recommendations regarding the length of the sentence and the criminal court of Morbihan ordered that Le Scouarnec should serve at least two thirds of the sentence before he can be eligible for release.

Le Scouarnec is already serving a 15-year prison sentence, for a conviction in 2020 for the rape and sexual assault of four



children, including two nieces.

The new trial in Brittany, western France, began in February and laid bare a pattern of abuse between 1989 and 2014. Most of the victims were unconscious or sedated hospital patients at the time of the assaults. The average age was 11. Among the victims were 158 boys and 141 girls.

During the trial, advocacy groups have accused health authorities of inaction after they were notified as soon as 2005 of Le Scouarnec's conviction for possessing child pornography pictures.

At the time, no measures were taken to suspend his medical license or limit his contact with children and Le Scouarnec continued his abuse in hospitals until his arrest in 2017.

"Should Joel Le Scouarnec have been the only one in the defendant's box?" prosecutor Stephane Kellenberger asked during his closing arguments.

Le Scouarnec has confessed to all the sexual abuse alleged by the 299 civil parties as well as to other assaults that are now beyond the statute of limitations. In a shocking admission during the trial, he also acknowledged sexually abusing his granddaughter.
