POST RS POLLS, RACE FOR BI-ELECTIONS BEGINS

BJP, Congress pull up socks

The BJP and the Congress have begun to pull up their socks for the ensuing by-elections after the Rajya Sabha polls.

Although both parties do not know when the by-elections will be held because of the corona pandemic, they are paying full attention to it.

The BJP has 22 candidates ready for the elections. It has to choose candidates for Agar and Jaura constituencies.

Since the Congress has difficulties in choosing candidates for 24 seats, there happens to be a stir-up in the party.

Congress men seeking tickets for the by-elections have begun to meet former chief minister Digvijaya Singh and MPCC president Kamal Nath. Of the 24 seats, the party had legislators from 23.

Nevertheless, after 22 of them crossed over to the BJP, new aspirants for tickets have cropped up. Nath has clearly said the tickets will be distributed on the basis of survey. Since the Congress does not have enough faces in these constituencies, it is trying to woo BJP leaders.

Baraiya to be fielded from Bhandar, to make up for defeat in RS polls

GOT 36 VOTES IN RS ELECTIONS

The Congress will field Phool Singh Baraiya from Bhandar seat in the ensuing by-elections to make up for his defeat in the RS polls.

A resident of Gwalior, Baraiya, has fought assembly elections twice but lost. Now, he wants to try his luck on Congress ticket.

Once a president of Bhanjar Samaj Party's state unit, he left the party and formed Bhanjar Samaj Party.

A leader of SC community in Gwalior-Chambal division, he is well-connected at

grass root level. He fought assembly elections from Gwalior rural in 2018 and from Soland in 2019 but lost. Former chief minister Digvijaya Singh brought him to the Congress in 2019.

The BJP made an issue for keeping Baraiya at number two in RS elections calling it an insult to SC community. The Congress knows that BJP will raise the issue in by-elections too.

Therefore, the party will try to silence the BJP by giving ticket to Baraiya. The Congress has no

good candidate to be fielded from Bhandar seat, so Baraiya is all set to get the ticket. This is reason Baraiya has spoken a word against any Congress leader despite BJP's provocation.



Report on Jatav to be sent to BJP central leadership

MLA TENDERS APOLOGY, MAY NOT FACE ANY ACTION

BHOPAL: The state BJP unit will send a report to the party central leadership on cross-voting by legislator Gopal Jatav in favour of the Congress.

The report will be sent to BJP's state incharge Vinay Sahasrabudhe and a decision on Jatav will be taken only after that.

BJP's central leadership was cautious about the RS elections and Jatav's cross-voting in favour of Congress nominee Digvijaya Singh has jolted the BJP. Nevertheless, the state BJP unit has decided not to raise the issue.

Both the chief minister Shriyraj Singh

Chouhan and home minister Narottam Mishra dressed down Jatav for his act of omission. He left for his constituency in Guna after that.

The by-elections will be held in the Gwalior-Chambal region where Jatav community is dominant.

The BJP is scared of taking strong action against Jatav as it may spark anger among his community and have an adverse effect on the election.

The BJP state unit, after a discussion with its central leadership, may issue a notice to Jatav to end the matter.

Jatav has been telling the state party leadership that he cast vote in favour of Digvijaya Singh by mistake. Jatav said he could neither think of leaving the party nor of deceiving it.

Two criminals arrested for murderous attack on man

The Pipalni police have arrested criminal Ramji Madras for his brother Raju Madras for stabbing a man after a fight with his relative.

The accused had thrashed near of victim Omprakash Onhe, a resident of Chandabid

slum. After the incident, the woman went to the police station and lodged a complaint. However, the cops are yet to arrest them.

The two accused reached at the woman's house in the morning and after a verbal spat, they thrashed her.

The woman's relative Omprakash intervened and it led to a brawl between them. Omprakash then informed the police and a case was registered. When the accused they came to know about the case, they reached at Omprakash's house and stabbed him. Pipalni police registered another case and arrested victim Omprakash was said to be out of danger.

SPO Pipalni Chait Singh said the accused are criminals and they are involved in criminal activities. During the attack and the knife used in the assault has also been seized.

BHOPAL: The Ratilband police have seized a truck carrying liquor worth over Rs 4.5 lakh on Saturday evening. The accused Shivank Tiwari was held with the truck and on being arrested he tried to influence the cops saying the truck belongs to one Sharma.

SIO Ratilband Sudesh Tiwari said he received an input about a truck ferrying illicit liquor and he chased it in his SUV in the afternoon. He also shot a video of the incident. The accused said there were 89 cartons of liquor inside the truck and when the cops quizzed him, he said the truck belongs to Sharma.

The accused Shivank is son of Manish Tiwari, a liquor baron. The liquor shop that he owns is at Sakshi dhaba and as the date of his permit to stock the liquor was ending on Saturday, he was transporting it to some other location, said the accused.

SIO said the truck was seized near Neelband and the accused was booked under Excise Act. The accused said the liquor was being taken to Bhopal from Sakshi dhaba. Additional superintendent of police (ASD) Rajat Saklecha said accused did not show the documents pertaining to the liquor stocks and that is why he was arrested.
