Neglect Leaves Dombivli’s Anand Dighe Garden Locked for Months



DOMBIVLI, Shrikant Khuperkar : The Dharmaveer Anand Dighe Garden, located near Model School in the MIDC area of Dombivli, has remained locked and inaccessible for the past three months, much to the disappointment of local residents—especially children and senior citizens who regularly used the space for recreation and relaxation.According to locals, the Kalyan-Dombivli Municipal Corporation (KDMC) has failed to appoint security personnel for the garden through its usual contractor-based system. This lack of basic management has led to the garden being shut indefinitely, leaving residents without access to one of the few green spaces in the area.Despite significant funds—allegedly in the lakhs—being spent from MP and MLA development funds to build and maintain the garden, its current state is one of neglect and decay. Weeds have taken over, amenities are deteriorating, and the overall infrastructure appears to be crumbling

due to poor maintenance.Residents claim that while the name of Dharmaveer Anand Dighe is prominently used to lend prestige to the park, the authorities and local politicians have failed to uphold the dignity associated with his legacy. Former corporator Bhalchandra Mhatre, along with local residents SagarPatil, Mandar Swarge, and RajuNalawade, have repeatedly raised the issue with the KDMC’s garden department and local representatives. However, they report that their complaints have gone unanswered and no concrete action has been taken.Frustrated by inaction, residents are now considering a protest to demand the reopening and proper maintenance of the park.“We have tried every possible official channel, but now we are left with no option. If this continues, we will be forced to agitate,” said one local resident. With Dombivli’s population increasing and public spaces already scarce, the closure of such an important community area has highlighted the ongoing challenges of urban civic management.

Netherlands delegation pays study visit to Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation



Navi Mumbai, Sunil Thakur : Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation organized a high-level dialogue on water management and solid waste management under the leadership of the Consulate General of the Kingdom of the Netherlands at the Municipal Headquarters with a delegation from the Netherlands. In this, Municipal Commissioner Dr.Kailash Shinde, Deputy Head of Mission of the Consulate General of the Netherlands Mr. Thierry van Helden and the representatives participating in the delegation along with him had a dialogue on various topics such as sustainable urban infrastructure, energy generation from waste, circular economy and opportunities for cooperation in water management.On this occasion, Additional Commissioners of Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation Mr. Sunil Pawar and Dr. Rahul Gethe, City Engineer Mr. ShirishAardwad, Additional City Engineer Mr.ArvindShinde, Chief Accounts and Finance Officer Mr.SatyawanUdale and other officers were present.On this occasion, Municipal Commissioner Dr.KailashShinde gave a

presentation to the delegation about the unique features of Navi Mumbai city and informed them about various initiatives and projects that Navi Mumbai is becoming known as the most planned, sustainable and promising city in India.Mr. Thierry van Helden, Deputy Head of Mission of the Consulate General of the Netherlands, outlined the shared vision of both regions for innovative and inclusive urban facilities. Ms. Miriam van Bookem, Project Manager of the Netherlands Water Partnership, presented state-of-the-art systems for water management and moderated the session. Ms. Jacqueline EckardtJerissen, Advisor of Netherlands Enterprises, presented information on women’s participation in solid waste management. This was followed by detailed technology presentations from Dutch companies working in areas such as water treatment, solid waste management, sanitation and urban innovation.After the presentation, there was a detailed discussion on the use of Dutch technology in various projects and initiatives of NMC in an interactive

session. Stating that Navi Mumbai is focusing on integrated management, the Commissioner gave information about water supply, solid waste and energy and appealed to the Dutch delegation to co-create scalable and replicable urban models for India. The Dutch delegation appreciated the projects and activities of Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation and expressed the belief that the addition of Dutch technical expertise will provide modernity to the projects of NaviMumbai.The delegation from the Netherlands visited various facilities including the Integrated Solid Waste Management Project at Turbhe and the Sewage Treatment and Tertiary Treatment Projects at Koparkhairane and learned about them. They visited the Textile Recycling Centre at CBD Belapur and appreciated the concept and system there.The idea of developing a joint working framework for Indo-Dutch cooperation in collaboration with Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation and focusing on pilot project creation, capacity building and knowledge exchange was decided during the study visit through mutual exchange of ideas.

Farmers should insure fruit crops like mango, cashew and banana

Thane, Dinesh Singh :

In order to provide financial support to farmers in case of damage to fruit crops due to various weather hazards in the upcoming AmbiaBahara, a restructured weather-based fruit crop insurance scheme is being implemented by the Agriculture Department. The process of participating in the scheme for the AmbiaBahara of the year 2025-26 has started. ShivajiAmle, Divisional Joint Director of Agriculture, Konkan Division, Thane, has appealed to more farmers to participate in the scheme within the specified period and protect their orchards from weather hazards such as low or high temperature, high winds, and untimely rain.

Features of the scheme:• Insurance cover will be provided to productive orchards of banana, mango and cashew crops in the notified revenue boards in the Konkan region. • Participation in the scheme will be voluntary for both indebted and non-indebted farmers. • Apart from account holders, this scheme will also be applicable to farmers engaged in clan and lease farming. • A farmer can register for insurance for a maximum of 4 hectares of area for notified fruit crops, including both the Mrig and Ambia seasons. • For farmer participation, the minimum productive area under one fruit crop for Konkan region will be 0.10 hectare. • Insurance cover will be applicable only to productive orchards. (Mango, Cashew - 5 years) • It will be mandatory to upload a geo-tagged photo of the orchard to the insurance portal along with the insurance application. • Insurance coverage can be applied for for any one season of deer and ambia season on the same area in a year for a single fruit crop. • Farmers are required to conduct

e-crop inspections. • Farmer ID number under Agristack is mandatory to participate in the scheme. • This scheme is being implemented through Bajaj Allianz General Insurance Company in Thane and Palghar districts, Agricultural Insurance Company of India in Ratnagiri and Sindhudurg districts and Universal Sampo General Insurance Company in Raigad district. • The deadline to participate in the Fruit Crop Insurance Scheme is October 31, 2025 for banana crops and November 30, 2025 for cashew and mango crops.
