Opinion

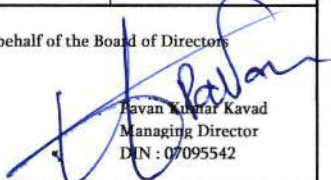

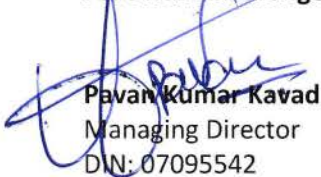
