Rajkot civic body passes Rs 2,355-crore budget

AMID OPPOSITION from the Congress over a proposal to raise taxes on new vehicles, the general body of the Rajkot Municipal Corporation (RMC) passed the Rs 2,355.78 crore budget of the civic body for the financial year 2022-23 Friday.

At the special meeting convened to discuss and pass the budget, four Congress councillors opposed the proposal to hike the one-time tax collected by RMC on registration of new vehicles.

In his draft budget submitted to the standing committee of the civic body, Rajkot Municipal Commissioner Amit Arora had proposed to increase the tax levied on new two-wheelers from the existing one percent to 2.5 percent of their ex-showroom price. Similarly, he had proposed to tax small cars at two percent of their ex-showroom price and luxury cars by up to five percent of their price. The standing committee had, however, amended this pro-

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posals and reduced the proposed hike in the range of 1.5 percent to 3 percent.

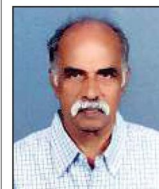
The Congress councillors opposed the proposal saying it would hit people hard at a time when they are already facing difficulties due to the ongoing pandemic. However, the proposal was adopted by the board by a majority vote. The ruling BJP has 68 corporators in the general body as against four of the Congress. The Congress corporators supported other proposals as the general body passed the budget that was tabled by the standing committee without any amendment.

Youth held for raping minor girl

Ahmedabad: A 21-year-old youth from Ahmedabad was arrested for allegedly abducting and raping a 14-year-old girl in Halol of Panchmahal Friday.

According to police, the accused, a resident of a village in Asali of Daskroi, had allegedly abducted the minor on February 14 from her village. He took her to another village in Panchmahal where she was raped. She was rescued by a police team Thursday after her father filed a complaint. The accused was arrested and brought to

Ahmedabad Friday. "The accused was known to the victim in the past and had pressured her saying he would kill himself if she didn't go with him on Valentine's Day. The accused lured and abducted her. After an FIR was filed, a team of the Asali police station rescued the victim and arrested the accused under sections of the Protection of Children against Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, IPC sections 376 for rape and 363 for abduction," said a senior police official at Asali police station ENS.

DAYS AFTER CORRUPTION ALLEGATION

7 Rajkot crime branch officers transferred

DETECTION OF Crime Branch Police Inspector Viraj Gadhi and seven police sub-inspectors (PSI) were transferred out of the Rajkot city police Thursday evening. Three officials of Special Operations Group (SOG) were also transferred along with them.

The action comes days after a businessman levelled allegations of corruption against personnel of the Rajkot DCB with BJP MLA Govind Patel backed him.

According to orders issued by the headquarters of Gujarat police in Gandhinagar, Gadhi has been transferred to Police Training College in Vadodra. SOG police inspector (PI) Rohit Raval has been transferred to Gandhinagar. Six Crime Branch PSIs—Pravi Dhakha, Vanrajsinh Jadeja,

Mayurudhwajsinh Jhala, Mahesh Rabari, Pruthviraj Jebalviya and Aljayraj Khachar have also been transferred to other districts.

Along with them SOG PSIs Ahmadaslami Ansari and Tushar Pandya have also been transferred to Vadodra Rural and Vyara respectively. "The above mentioned PSIs shall be appointed on non-sensitive posts once they report to districts where they have been transferred to," stated the transfer order. Khurshid Ahmed, joint commissioner of police (JCP) of Rajkot city confirmed the development but refused to comment on their reasons.

"The orders have been issued by the office of the DG and that office is the competent authority to comment," said Khurshid when asked if the transfers had anything to do with allegations of corruption levelled by Jagjivan Sakhiya, a city-based businessman and his brother Mahesh Sakhiya.

While PG Gadhi could not be contacted, P.Khachar said he had been requested around seven months ago to be transferred out of Rajkot. "The inquiry assigned to the ACP was rendered infructuous after the DGP launched an inquiry into the matter," Ahmed said. A letter written by Govind Patel, BJP MLA from Rajkot (south) to the Minister of State for Home, Harsh Sanghvi accusing a senior police officer of taking "havalas" and Rs 75 lakh as his share from around Rs 7 crore the DCB had helped the Sakhiyas recover from alleged fraudsters.

After the MLA's letter became public, Jagjivan gave media statement saying when he approached the Rajkot police to file a complaint against fraudsters who had defrauded Mahesh to the tune of Rs 12 crore, the senior police officer had refused to order an FIR.

Jagjivan had claimed that after the transfer, the officer had sent for Crime Branch PI Gadhi, who said that the officer was demanding 30 per cent of the amount to be recovered as his share to file an FIR.

The Crime Branch registered an FIR in November last year and arrested two persons.

Jagjivan alleges that even after the FIR, there was no recovery and accused the police being hand-in-glove with the accused. Reacting to media reports on February 5,

Sakhiyas and the accused had settled the matter after the accused paid up Rs 7.5 crore. However, an FIR was registered when the accused didn't pay the remaining amount to the applicants.

The joint commissioner had told media persons that assistant commissioner of police (crime) had been ordered to conduct an inquiry. Later, Police Commissioner Manoj Agarwal said that an inquiry was going on and therefore he would not give statement to media.

Youth kills colleague whose wife rejected his proposal

A TEXTILE worker allegedly killed his 21-year-old coworker at their workplace after the latter's wife rejected the proposal of the accused, police said.

The incident, which happened at Ratna Priya Mill in Palsana taluka of Surat, came to light on Thursday, when Akash Babu Kori (21) was found dead in a grey bale stockroom of the textile factory.

According to the police, Kori, a native of Rewa in Madhya Pradesh, came to Surat around three months ago after eloping with a girl from his village. A week after their arrival, the couple got married at a temple in Palsana.

Kori found a job at Ratna Priya Mill of Gujarat Eco Textile Park in Palsana, and stayed at a rented house nearby the factory.

Soon, he became friends with Laxman Arak (22), also a Rewa native, who was working in the same factory. He used to visit Kori's house and took the newlywed couple to different places in the city.

A few days ago, Arak proposed to Kori's wife, which she turned down. She also complained to her husband following which Kori and Arak had a heated exchange.

According to police, on February 15, Kori was working in the night shift when Arak found him sleeping on grey bales in a stockroom. Arak hit Kori with the grey bales and dropped an entire pile on him, killing him on the spot.

"When Akash Babu Kori failed to return home on the morning of February 16, his wife went to the factory and inquired but could not find him," said Dhanmesh Chaudhary, Assistant sub-inspector, Palsana police station.

On Thursday, labourers who went to the stockroom found the body. Police registered a murder case against Arak and launched a manhunt. "The accused has been absconding after the incident," said Chaudhary.
