Govt urges HC to direct Jarange-Patil to take medical assistance

Mumbai, Feb 14 (UNI) : The government urged the Bombay High Court on Wednesday to direct Maratha activist Manoj Jarange-Patil to take medical assistance as his health is deteriorating while informing the court that the state is taking all necessary steps to amend rules to issue Kunbi caste certificates to Maratha community members for availing of reservation benefits.

A division bench of Justice Ajey Gadkari and Shyam Chandak asked Jarange-Patil's lawyer to ask the activist whether he would take medical assistance.

The court was hearing a petition filed by Advocate Gunaratn Sadavarte against the ongoing hunger strike by activist Jarange Patil. Advocate General Birendra Saraf said that it has barely been 20 days since the state agreed to meet Jarange's demands and issued the notification to amend the rules. He highlighted that the process would take some time since they have to follow the law and have already invited objections from the public. When Jarange's advocate, Ramesh Dube-Patil, said that he would take instructions from the activist as his health is unwell and he is being administered saline, Saraf urged the court to step in and ask him to take medical assistance.

Praful Patel as RS candidate

Mumbai, Feb 14 (UNI) : The Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) has nominated its sitting Rajya Sabha MP and senior leader Praful M Patel as its candidate for the upcoming Rajya Sabha biennial elections here on Wednesday.

State NCP President Sunil Tatkare made the announcement here this evening. Patel, 66, has been a four-time Lok Sabha Member from Gondiya in the state, plus three times a Rajya Sabha Member, including his current term, when he was elected in July 2022. Patel has also served as a Union Cabinet Minister on several occasions.

HC quashes rape case against Mumbai doctor

Mumbai, Feb 14 (UNI) : The Bombay High Court dismissed an alleged rape case with the complainant's consent, imposing a Rs 5 lakh cost on him and directing the amount to an advocates' association.

Passing an order, the division bench of Justices PD Naik and NR Borkar imposed a cost of Rs 5 lakh on the accused doctor to be paid to an advocate's body.

The court noted that there was sufficient material to show that the relationship was consensual.

"The material on record would indicate that the victim was in the company of the accused. She volunteered to do so. The relationship was apparently consensual," Bench said.

The court was hearing a plea filed by the Bandra-based doctor seeking quashing of the case by consent.

Fisherman injured in Shark bite

Mumbai, Feb 14 (UNI): A fisherman in Palghar district of Maharashtra was injured and survived after a shark attack him while the shark died after being caught by villagers. This was reportedly the first shark attack in Palghar. The injured fisherman, 34-year-old Vikya Suresh Gowari, is undergoing treatment at Vinoba Bhawe Hospital in Silvassa. Gowari, who lives with his family in Manor Dongar village, was fishing in the creek connected to a river when a 4-foot-long shark suddenly attacked him. The shark bit on his leg before he was rescued by other fishermen. Gowari was initially rushed to Astha Hospital in Manor and later shifted to Vinoba Bhawe Hospital.

Mumbai, Feb 14 (UNI) : The Maharashtra Congress has nominated state Congress Working President Chandrakant D. Handore as its candidate for the upcoming Rajya Sabha elections on Wednesday.

He is expected to file his nomination papers on Thursday in a massive show of strength planned by the Congress and its various organizations, plus opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi allies like Shiv Sena (UBT) and the Nationalist Congress Party (SP).

Handore, 67, a Dalit face and a seasoned leader of the Congress party, has been a former Municipal Corporator, later Mayor of Mumbai, a two-time M.L.A., and a state minister for several years, while his wife Sangita Handore is a former BMC Municipal Corporator.

Farmers facing atrocities, injustice under BJP rule : Cong

New Delhi Feb 14 (UNI) The Congress while accusing the government of betraying the farmers on the guarantee of giving legal MSP, said that atrocities and injustice done to farmers by the current regime was never done by any government after independence.

Addressing a press conference at the AICC headquarters here, Congress leader Pawan Khara said, "During the election campaign in 2014, Modi made a false promise of giving MSP on the lines of the Swaminathan report to the farmers and became the Prime Minister.

"But PM Modi's lie came to light when an affidavit was filed in the Supreme Court with regards to MSP, in which the Modi government took a shameful 'U' turn and said that we cannot give this kind of MSP where the input cost is too high," Khara said.

The Congress leader said that even after two years when the Prime Minister apologised and withdrew all three farm laws, he promised of constituting a committee to find solution to the MSP issue. "But today it has been two years but no committee has been formed," Khara said.

He said Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and Rahul Gandhi have taken a historic decision in Ambikapur on Tuesday of giving legal guarantee of MSP to the farmers.

"As soon as the announcement was made, the entire ecosystem is spreading lies and propaganda on the MSP," Khara alleged.

The High Court, however, failed to ascertain whether the prosecution of the petitioner would be legitimate in the given facts and circumstances, it contended. The plea also said the HC lost sight of the fact that the assembly did not lead to any violence or use of criminal force to present an imminent threat to the public at large or to the members of the then ruling dispensation or any public servant.

The arbitrator has given award for INR 1,48,48,550/- to respondent. The company has not recorded the said liability in the books of account. Petition against the order is filed at Bombay High Court.
- 4 Managing Director Mrs Reshma Ganji has filed case in NCLT against the company. Company has filed petition in June 2023 in NCLT. Case is not yet admitted in NCLT.
