1. The Consolidated Financial results of the company have been prepared in accordance with Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2006 as amended from time to time.
2. Consolidated Total income for the Half year ended 31st March 2026 is Rs.5651.87 Lakhs when compared to Rs. 4130.63 Lakhs for the corresponding Half year of the previous year. Consolidated Total income for the Financial year ended 31st March 2026 is Rs. 10609.54 Lakhs when compared to Rs. 8549.54 lakhs for the previous year.
3. The Consolidated Profit before tax for the current half year is Rs.133.43 Lakhs when compared to 2.61 Lakhs for the corresponding half year of the previous year. The Consolidated Profit before Tax for the financial year ended 31st March 2026 is Rs. 215.69 Lakhs when compared to Rs. 30.25 Lakhs for the previous year.
4. The Consolidated Profit after tax for the current half year is Rs.169.31 Lakhs when compared to Rs. 19.57 Lakhs for the corresponding half year of the previous year. The Consolidated Profit after Tax for the financial year ended 31st March 2026 is Rs.215.44 Lakhs when compared to Rs. 36.12 Lakhs for the previous year.
5. The above Consolidated Financial Results and Consolidated Statement of Assets and Liabilities were reviewed by the Audit Committee and then approved by the Board of Directors at their respective meetings held on May 30th, 2026. The Statement included the consolidated results for the Half year ended 31st March 2026 and 31st March 2025 being the balancing figure of the Audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published year to date figures upto the first half year of the respective financial years, which were subject to limited review by the respective auditors.

7. Depreciation on Tangible Assets is provided on Straight Line Method over useful lives of the assets. Depreciation for assets purchased / sold during the year / period is proportionately charged. The useful lives for the fixed assets are considered as specified in the Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.
8. The Consolidated Financial results for the year ended 31st March 2026 have been audited by the Statutory Auditors of the Company as per Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015. The Auditors have given an unqualified Report thereon.

Total income for the financial year ended 31st March 2026 is Rs. 10992.69 Lakhs, when compared to Rs. 8482.12 lakhs for the previous year.
3. The Profit before tax for the current half year is Rs.40.63 Lakhs when compared to Rs. 2.23 Lakhs for the corresponding half year of the previous year. The Profit before Tax for the financial year ended 31st March 2026 is Rs.90.55 Lakhs, when compared to Rs. 30.68 Lakhs for the previous year.

Opinion

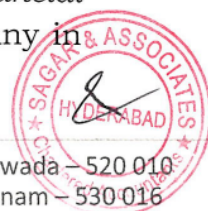
We have audited the accompanying Standalone Financial Results of **M/s Tanvi Foods (India) Limited** (the "Company") for the Half-year ended and the Year ended **31st March 2026** (the "Statement"), attached herewith, being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended (the "Listing Regulations").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the statement:

- (i) is presented in accordance with the requirements of Listing Regulations in this regard; and
- (ii) gives a true and fair view in conformity with the applicable Accounting Standards, and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of net profit and other financial information of the company for the year ended 31st March 2026.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results* section of our report. We are independent of the Company in



accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("ICAI") together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the Standalone Financial results for the half-year and year ended 31st March 2026 under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules there under,

and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the ICAI's Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Standalone Financial Results

The Statement has been prepared on the basis of the Standalone Annual Financial Statements. The Company's Board of Directors are responsible for the preparation and presentation of the Statement that give a true and fair view of the net profit and other financial information in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Accounting Standard prescribed under Section 133 of the Act read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India and in compliance with Listing Regulations.

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities;

selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Standalone Financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the Statement, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern,



disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the Standalone Financial results as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with SAs will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these Standalone Financial results.

As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the Standalone Financial results, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and obtain audit evidence that is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. Under Section 143(3)(i) of the Act, we are also responsible for expressing our opinion through a separate report on the complete set of financial statements on whether the company



has adequate internal financial controls with reference to Financial Statements in place and the operating effectiveness of such controls.

- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by the Board of Directors.
- Conclude on the appropriateness of the Board of Directors' use of the going concern basis of accounting and, based on the audit evidence obtained, whether a material uncertainty exists related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the standalone financial results or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.
- Evaluate the overall presentation, structure and content of the Standalone Financial results, including the disclosures, and whether the financial results represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.

Materiality is the magnitude of misstatements in the Standalone Financial Statements that, individually or in aggregate, makes it probable that the economic decisions of a reasonably knowledgeable user of the Standalone Financial Statements may be influenced. We consider quantitative materiality and qualitative factors in (i) planning the scope of our audit work and in evaluating the results of our work; and (ii) to evaluate the effect of any identified misstatements in the Standalone Financial statements.
