LeT terrorist Ganal killed in Shopian

A Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terrorist identified as Zakir Ganal was killed in South Kashmir's Shopian district following a relentless six-day operation launched by the Army and other security forces, based on a Jammu and Kashmir Police tip-off, officials said Wednesday.

In an X post, the Army's Chinara Corps said during the joint search operation being conducted by the Army, Jammu and Kashmir Police and CRPF in Chinarapora, "one LeT terrorist identified as Zakir Ganal, has been eliminated in the firefight".

Giving details, the officials said that since July 2, gunfight took place twice and Ganal (26), a category C terrorist, was earlier injured.

The terrorist was a resident of Mottahalla in adjoining Kulgam district and had been active since 2022.

His body had bullet injuries in left lung and on leg and the officials said that he had been injured and had crawled to a shed in the orchards.

STAMPEDE CASE | Party seeks action after withdrawing plea in Supreme Court

DMK moves top court panel, CBI over Vijay visit to Karur

Hours after suffering a setback in the Supreme Court over its attempt to seek restrictions on Chief Minister C. Joseph Vijay's proposed visit to Karur, the opposition DMK on Tuesday approached both the Supreme Court-appointed Supervisory Committee and the CBI with fresh representations seeking safeguards ahead of the Chief Minister's visit on Friday.

The move came just hours after the Supreme Court questioned the party's last seeking curbs on Vijay's speeches and public engagements in connection with the September 2023 Karur stampede case, prompting the DMK to withdraw its petition.

In separate representations to the Supervisory Committee headed by retired Supreme Court judge Justice Ajay Rastogi and the CBI, DMK Organising Secretary R. S. Bhadrathi sought action against PWD Minister Aadhar Arjuna over

his July 2 speech, alleging it was capable of influencing voters and interfering with the ongoing CBI investigation.

The DMK also sought safeguards for Vijay's proposed Karur visit, where he is expected to meet the families of the 41 people killed in the stampede, announce welfare measures and is widely expected to offer compassionate government jobs to some members of the bereaved families.

The party requested that any distribution of monetary assistance, compassionate appointments or other government

benefits be undertaken only with safeguards considered necessary after obtaining the CBI's views. It also sought preservation of the statements of material witnesses before any interaction with the Chief Minister.

In its separate representation to the CBI, the DMK additionally urged the agency to monitor Vijay's Karur visit, approach the Supervisory Committee if further safeguards are considered necessary, and examine whether Aadhar Arjuna's speech warrants further legal action. The fresh representations came amid a sharp

political exchange between the ruling TVK and the opposition DMK.

Earlier in the day, Tamil Nadu Law Minister C.T.R. Nirmal Kumar accused the DMK of trying to block the Chief Minister's Karur visit. The DMK is doing everything possible to stop Chief Minister Vijay's visit to Karur even now," he alleged, after the Supreme Court proceedings.

The ruling TVK has maintained that Vijay's visit is meant to console the bereaved families and announce welfare measures.

The DMK, on the other hand, has argued that any political statements or distribution of government benefits could influence material witnesses in the ongoing CBI probe. The CBI continues to investigate the stampede that claimed 41 lives, including children, at a TVK rally addressed by Vijay in September last year. The agency has already questioned Vijay twice in Delhi as part of its investigation.

Patna court reserves order on Khan Sir's bail plea

A Patna court on Wednesday reserved its order on the anticipatory bail plea of educator Faisal Khan, popularly known as 'Khan Sir', in connection with the coaching institute firing case.

The order is scheduled to be announced on July 10. The case relates to a firing incident that occurred in early June after Khan Sir's coaching institute was allegedly vandalised by a group of miscreants. His security guards are accused of opening fire during the incident.

The court heard the arguments from both sides today, and has reserved its order till the next hearing on July 10. Advocate Munir Tiwari, representing Khan Sir, told reporters, "The interim protection for Khan Sir against any coercive action, which was ensured in previous orders, will remain in force till the order is pronounced, he added.

Child volunteers: SIR probe ordered

Fresh controversy has erupted over the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in Karnataka after allegations that schoolchildren were used in

the enumeration process at a government school in Bellary district, leading to the Bellary Deputy Commissioner Mohammad Roshan ordering a probe.

The alleged incident was reported from the Government Kamala Higher Primary School at Maradimutt village in Gokak taluk on Tuesday, where Booth Level Officers (BLOs) are alleged to have involved schoolchildren while carrying out the SIR exercise.

According to the allegations, the BLOs called villagers to the school premises to distribute and collect Enumeration Forms as part of the electoral roll revision process. Videos purportedly showing schoolchildren assisting in the exercise have surfaced on social media, triggering concerns over the alleged involvement of students in an official election-related activity.

The incident has drawn the attention of the district administration, with Bellary Deputy Commissioner Mohammad Roshan issuing a notice to the Gokak Tahsiladar seeking an explanation.

The Deputy Commissioner also warned that strict action would be initiated if any lapse or violation of official guidelines is found during the enquiry.

According to preliminary information, the schoolchildren were allegedly used to fill up the forms and paste the photographs.

India's economy now less vulnerable to monsoon shocks: Report

India's economy has become less dependent on monsoon rains, with expanding irrigation networks and changing cropping patterns over the last decade insulating agriculture and rural demand from the kind of shocks seen in earlier years, according to a report.

Historically, deficient monsoons often translated into sharp declines in agricultural output and rural incomes. In 2002, for instance, rainfall fell to 81 per cent of the long-period average, leading to a steep drop

in foodgrain production and a severe contraction in rural disposable incomes, the report by brokerage and research analyst firm Bernstein said.

However, that correlation has weakened over the past decade, India continued to register rising foodgrain production despite below-normal monsoons in 2018-19 and 2023-24, it added.

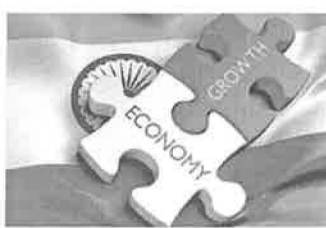
The shift has largely been driven by greater access to irrigation and a move toward year-round farming.

"Monsoons aren't impacting India the way they used to, and the changing dynamics warrant a reset in how we perceive

rainfall and its effects," the Bernstein report said.

It highlights that India's irrigated area now covers nearly 60 per cent of total cultivated land, up from around 42 per cent in the early 2000s. Irrigation coverage in major agricultural states has increased to around 67 per cent from 54 per cent in 2009, with tubewells and canals becoming important buffers against rainfall deficiencies.

At the same time, India's dependence on the monsoon-centric Kharif season has reduced sharply. Kharif crops, which accounted for nearly 60 per cent of total foodgrain pro-



duction until the 1990s, contributed only 47 per cent of total output in 2022-23. Rabi crops and a relatively new

It states that these structural changes mean poor monsoons are no longer an immediate food-security threat and are unlikely to devastate rural demand in the way they once did.

"While low rainfall is still harmful, it is unlikely to kill rural demand like it had in the past," the Bernstein report says. The impact of deficient monsoons is now likely to be more nuanced, affecting specific pockets of the economy rather than triggering head-to-head distress.

Food inflation risks, for instance, are expected to be more contained and concentrated in select categories such as pulses

and vegetables rather than causing a widespread surge in prices.

The brokerage noted that a record winter harvest of around 121 million tonnes and improved irrigation coverage in major agricultural states, including Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh, should help cushion the impact of delayed rainfall.

Similarly, concerns around delayed Kharif sowing may be exaggerated. Although only around a per cent of the normally cultivated area had been sown by mid-June, this is not significantly different from historical trends, as the bulk of

Kharif sowing typically takes place in the second week of June, the report points out.

However, the report points out that poor rainfall does pose a longer-term macroeconomic challenge, through ground-water depletion and rising electricity demand. Reservoir levels have already fallen to levels that are among the lowest in recent years. Lower rainfall could intensify dependence on groundwater and electricity-powered irrigation systems, putting up power demand from the farm sector and further straining water resources.

Govt invites bids for coal gasification projects

The Ministry of Coal has invited applications under the Scheme for Promotion of Surface Coal/Lignite Gasification Projects approved by the government in May this year with a total financial outlay of Rs 37,500 crore, according to an official statement issued on Wednesday.

The scheme is a major initiative aimed at promoting surface coal and lignite gasification projects, thereby enhancing value addition, reducing import dependence and supporting India's vision of achieving greater self-reliance in the energy and chemical sectors.

After the approval of the

scheme, the guidelines were issued on June 25, followed by the publication of the Request for Proposal (RFP) on July 7, inviting eligible applicants to submit proposals.

To facilitate stakeholder participation and provide clarity on the Scheme provisions and the application process, the Ministry will hold a pre-application conference on July 20. Prospective applicants and other stakeholders are encouraged to participate in the conference and submit their queries for clarification, the statement said.

The last date for submission of applications is September 7. The Scheme Guidelines, Request for Proposal (RFP), and the detailed application timeline are avail-

able on the Ministry of Coal website. Interested entities are encouraged to review the documents.

Coal gasification is a transformative technology that converts coal into synthesis gas (syngas), which can be further utilised for the production of value-added products such as methanol, ammonium nitrate, synthetic natural gas, and a range of industrial chemicals. Recognising its strategic importance, the government has undertaken several policy initiatives and incentive measures to promote coal gasification as a means to enhance energy security, reduce import dependence, and diversify the utilisation of domestic coal resources.

Bihar to launch fisheries body

Bihar will set up a dedicated fisheries corporation to give a new impetus to the fisheries and aquaculture sector in the state.

The decision was taken at a meeting chaired by Chief Minister Samrat Choudhary on Wednesday.

The corporation, to be known as the Bihar Aquaculture Infrastructure and Development Corporation Limited (BAIDCL), will be established under the Companies Act, 2013, for the planned development, operation and effective management of fisheries and aquaculture infrastructure.

This initiative will prove to be a historic step towards developing modern fisheries infrastructure, encouraging investment, creating jobs and increasing the income of fish farmers," Choudhary said in a post on X.

The state government also approved the preparation of the Alternative Analysis Report (AAR) and Detailed Project Report (DPR) for a Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS) across four major corridors. The National Capital Region Transport Corporation (NCRTC) has been nominated to prepare the reports.



The proposed corridors will connect Patna with Muzaffarpur, Begusaraj, Ara and Gaya.

"This decision is an important step towards developing a fast, safe and modern public transport network, strengthening regional connectivity and giving new momentum to economic and urban development," the Chief Minister said.

The Cabinet also approved the acquisition of 26.76 acres of land at Mouza Bhushola in Danapur for the expansion of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Patna, at an estimated cost of 348.90 crore.

The expansion is expected to enhance super-specialty healthcare services, strengthen medical education and research, and improve the state's healthcare system.

The Cabinet further approved the allotment of five acres of land each in Madhubani, Munger and Muzaffarpur districts to the Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) for setting up Kendriya Vidyalayas. The land will be leased for 30 years at a token value of Rs 1, with an option to renew the lease.
