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Senior auditor stabbed in head, back in Delhi murderers were told it was for a 'noble' cause

The 20-year-old man and his minor associate, who were hired to kill a senior auditor by the official's wife and son, had been made to believe that their victim was the woman's brother-in-law who used to sexually harass her, police said.

Investigating officers said the arrested duo have told them they did not know that their target — Anand Singh, a senior auditor posted with Director General of Audit (Central Expenditure) — was indeed the woman's husband. They said the duo contracted to kill Singh were told that they were helping the woman by killing her harasser.

On Wednesday, the police apprehended the 17-year-old minor accused. The mother-son duo and the other alleged killer, Rishab alias Shibu, were caught on Tuesday. Singh's body was found with more than half a dozen stab wounds to his head and back in south Delhi's Om Nagar near Meethapur in Badarpur early Saturday morning.

Police said the 17-year-old boy told them that Singh's son knew him as he lived some blocks away from his house. However, the teenager did not know the boy's father because he used to always leave for office early and returned home in the night.

The teenager told the police that the mother-son



duo approached him around a fortnight ago and sought help in killing a relative, who they claimed would often sexually harass her. The teenager said

he was moved by their stories and agreed to kill the 'relative' when they promised him ₹1.25 lakh for the job. The teenager roped in his friend, Rishab to

execute the crime.

The alleged killers claimed that they came to know of the relationship between the deceased and

the mother-son duo the next day from the reporting of the incident on news channels. They claimed that they were shocked to know that the man they had murdered was the woman's husband and not brother-in-law as they were told.

An investigator associated with the case said Singh's wife, Sunita Devi, and his 16-year-old son had hatched the conspiracy to murder him because Singh was allegedly an alcoholic and used to ill-treat his wife and three children.

The teenager had developed grudge against his father because of his bad behaviour and his resentment was increasing with each

passing day, the officer said.

Devi or her son have shown no remorse for their crime since. She told us that her husband used to fight whenever she protested against his drinking habit. Singh's son told us that his father never gave him pocket money and he used to abuse and scold him whenever he asked for money. Also, neither he, nor his two siblings, ever got a gift from their father, or he ever took them for an outing," said the officer.

"Singh is not alive to defend the allegations. He was an alcoholic but people in his neighbourhood and office remember him as a disciplined and soft-spoken person. We don't know

whether the allegations his family members have made are true. But no other motive surfaced during our probe," the officer added.

On July 5 night, DCP (southeast) Chintoy Biswal had said that Devi and her son called the duo to their house and asked them to hide on the terrace. Singh returned around 11.30 pm and was drunk. He slept without having dinner. Around 2.30 am, the mother-son called the duo.

The two stabbed Singh as Devi and her son stood outside to keep a watch on other family members. The killers fled and Devi left the door open to pass it off as a murder," he said.

At meeting over power rates Political slugfest ensues between AAP and BJP

A public hearing on power tariff revision in city organised by the Delhi Electricity Regulatory Commission (DERC) turned into a political slugfest between the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Wednesday.

Residents' Welfare Associations (RWAs) complained of not getting enough time to discuss their issues.

The hearing, chaired by DERC chief SS Chauhan, began at around 10.30am.

Almost immediately, political parties began slanging and slinging allegations over tariffs in the city.

AAP MLAs Nitin Tyagi, Ritunjay Jha and Sarita Singh were allowed to place their comments in the forum on first come-first serve basis, which was objected by BJP MLAs Vijender Gupta, OP Sharma and Jagdish Pradhan. Soon, more than 15 AAP MLAs and BJP legislators, with rebel AAP MLAs Devender Sehrawat and Anil Bajpai at their side, tore pamphlets, raised the issue.

Residents criticised them



of "waking up" to the issues now when assembly elections are a few months away. "None of you turned up at the DERC hearing last year when

tariff was increased," said Ashok Bhawan of the North Delhi Resident's Welfare Federation. "We were simply

appreciating the DERC for not increasing tariffs in the past four years. We urged them to not do so this year. But the BJP did not let us do that. While Sehrawat verbally attacked me, Vijender Gupta tried to snatch my papers and tear it," said Rakhi Birla, deputy speaker of Delhi Assembly and AAP MLA from Mangolpuri.

Gupta and Sehrawat denied the allegations. Gupta, also the leader of opposition in the Assembly, said he has filed a complaint of "hooliganism" against AAP legislators at Lodhi Road police station. "AAP

MLA Jarnail Singh snatched my petition and tore it. I had placed before the DERC that the government has allowed systematic looting by turning a blind eye towards manipulation by the discoms," said Gupta. It was only around 1.30 pm that the RWAs got a chance to voice their views. Their key demand was a roll back on fixed charges on the sanctioned load that was increased in 2018. They also demanded a refund of the fixed charges they have been paying over the year. The government's claim that

Govt school pupil injured as ceiling fan falls on him

A class VII student of a government-run school in east Delhi's Triokpur was injured when a part of the ceiling fan in the classroom fell on his head Wednesday. The incident triggered another standoff between AAP and BJP, with the latter accusing the former of a "multi-core scam" in the construction of classrooms. According to a senior Directorate of Education (DoE) official, a part of a ceiling fan fell on the head of the 11-year-old boy during class. "He was rushed to a government hospital and the school staff was with him. The DoE is examining the incident. We will file a police complaint against the contractor if found guilty," the official said, requesting anonymity. Soon after, BJP state president Manoj Tiwari held a press conference and demanded an apology from Delhi education minister Manish Sisodia. "In one of the Delhi government schools, a ceiling fan fell on an innocent child and his skull was fractured in Triokpur. Today, a fan has fallen, tomorrow something else may fall on the children but Delhi government is not serious about their security. Sisodia should apologise to the people of Delhi for this incident," he said. The school, where the incident took place, recently got new classrooms made. "We have been told by builders that the classrooms could be constructed at the cost of ₹5 lakh but ₹25 lakh were spent on it by the Delhi government. This indicates a scam," Tiwari said. "The government has shifted the child from LBS Hospital to GB Pant hospital. Since morning, the department of education is keeping a close watch on the child's condition," said AAP spokesperson Sourabh Bhargava. Last week, the Delhi BJP had filed a complaint against the AAP for the Lokayukta, alleging misappropriation of funds in construction of classrooms in government schools. The government had denied the allegation.

DJB was in loop over land pooling policy : DDA

A day after the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) said that it was not consulted by the Delhi Development Authority for the land pooling policy, the land-owning agency said on Wednesday that the water utility has been consulted by the DDA from time to time.

"Delhi Jal Board has been consulted by the DDA from time to time, for a land pooling policy," stated a release issued by the DDA on Wednesday. The release also mentioned motor consultative decisions and the dates on which the meetings took place.

DJB's vice-chairman Dinesh Mohanjiya, who is also an AAP MLA, however, maintained his stand despite the DDA's rebuttal.

"The DDA never consulted the DJB over the land pooling policy. We have not received a single letter



from them, nor have we sent them any official letter over the issue," said Mohanjiya on Wednesday after the DDA's rebuttal.

The DDA, however, in its release stated that a meeting was held on October 5, 2017 with CEO of DJB to assess the water demand in area proposed to come under land pooling policy.

"The DJB informed in the meeting that broad strategy and evaluation plan for water supply will be worked out taking into consideration the existing ground water

capacity, anticipated saving from transmission losses and required augmentation of existing sources of water," the DDA release stated.

The land pooling policy is touted to be a game changer for Delhi's real estate as it is expected to provide land parcels for the creation of nearly 17 lakh housing units.

Subsequently, a discussion was held on December 1, 2017 with CEO, DJB regarding assessment of water availability in land pooling areas. "It was said that due to water scarcity in

Delhi alternative measures such as aquifer systems, water conservation measures like rain water harvesting, natural recharge recycling are required to meet the future water demand in land pooling areas," DDA release stated.

An email was received on December 11, 2017 from DJB regarding Planning for Water in the Proposed Land Pooling Areas, where short term, medium term and long term solutions were suggested for meeting the water requirement of the anticipated population," the release added.

The DDA also said that a meeting was held by the Lieutenant Governor on January 30, 2018 to review the assessment of creating physical infrastructure — water, power and road for the land pooling areas where decision with reference to follow-up actions.

60 Foreigners detained in Greater Noida for staying without valid papers

The Gautam Budh Nagar district police Wednesday detained 60 foreign nationals — 32 men and 28 women — for staying in the country without valid papers.

Among those detained, some were found staying in India on an expired visa, while others were in possession of forged visa documents, police said.

They have been taken to the Surajpur police lines and police have deportation procedures. The detained persons are from Nigeria, Kenya, Tanzania, Zambia, Ivory Coast, Angola, Malawi and Philippines. "We recovered 222 beer bottles meant for sale in Delhi, 3.5kg marijuana, six laptops and 114 SIM cards," Gautam Budh Nagar SSP Vaibhav Krishna said.



Police conducted a drive, Operation Clean -10, from 6am to 10am. "We checked 320 foreign nationals, of whom 60 were found living in the country illegally," he said. "Operation Clean" was launched in the district on July 1 to its issues affecting common man. Every day, the police are conducting special drives against traffic violators, drunk driving, drinking in public places, against foreign nationals

is the 10th drive under Operation Clean," Krishna said. "We found 33 persons were found living illegally in Altonia Society in Sector F1, 20 in Sector Sigma 3, four persons in Mystic Greens society in Omicron 1, and one in Palm Greens society in Sector Mu.

Krishna said the exercise was conducted based on inputs provided by police informers. He said three checking squads headed by SP (city), SP (rural) and circle officers conducted the raids. A Nigerian national, requesting anonymity, said, "Some of those detained may be students. The Indian government recently revised the visa fee and students were unable to arrange the money. We have approached the embassy and the ministry of external affairs for a solution." Krishna, however, said a majority of detained persons were not students. They also had no valid work permit. We have not pressed any IPC sections against them. Had we done that, they would have been sent to judicial custody. We are initiating the process to deport them and are in touch

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Delhi High Court dismisses plea against free Metro rides for women

New Delhi/July 11

The Delhi High Court on Wednesday dismissed a plea, which had challenged the free Metro ride scheme for women in the national capital. The court also imposed a cost of ₹10,000 for filing the plea without "substance". A bench of Chief Justice DN Patel and Justice C Hari Shankar rejected the plea stating that it is for the authorities to decide on giving concession to a particular class. The court said that the cost has to be deposited within four weeks to the Delhi High Court Bar Library. The court also rejected the prayer in the petition seeking reduction of fares and to make 15 slabs of ticket prices and of existing six. "Fixation of fares is a statutory function and the process is complex which involves consideration of several factors, including cost. All these factors cannot be determined in a PIL," the court said. The bench also added that the petitioner, advocate Bipin Bihari Singh, had failed to point out any illegality in fixation of fares and added that the court would be "extremely slow" in fixing the fares for Delhi Metro, which is the prerogative of the government. The court also noted that two similar petitions.
