"It is one more sign of how close our cooperation has been in a world where there are so many challenges but also so many opportunities," he said.

In his remarks, Rubio highlighted the strategic partnership between the US and India and its importance for the respective national interests of both countries. "It is a tangible example of that," Rubio said referring to the inkling of the pact.

Rubio added that the domain initiative would also be able to "provide near real time commercial maritime domain awareness data to countries throughout the Indo-Pacific."

Apart from increased maritime surveillance, the Quad would also focus on the development of port infrastructure with selected nations in the Indo-Pacific. Rubio said due to Fiji's "insufficient port capacity" in the Pacific Islands, the Quad partners would work jointly together on a project to "advance that country's port infrastructure." This is the first time that Quad nations will be working together on such a project.

CBI Seeks Evidence & Documents: Soon after taking over the probe and registering an FIR, the CBI intensified its investigation. The agency has sought the complete case file, post-mortem report, forensic science laboratory (FSL) findings, digital evidence, call detail records (CDRs), CCTV footage and all other documents collected during the SIT investigation. The SIT has written to the FSL and other agencies seeking evidence and samples at the earliest.

Similarly, former district judge Giribhai Singh filed a petition in the trial court seeking seizure of the mobile handsets and SIM cards of Twisha's parents, brother and sister-in-law. She also sought proper panchnama proceedings of the sealed DVR and eight cameras in her presence and in the presence of panch witnesses, and requested that the matter be brought to the notice of the Special Investigation Team (SIT). The petition also sought identification of people visible in the DVR footage and camera recordings.

Data submitted by Madhya Pradesh exposed deep gaps in ground enforcement. In the first five months of the year, more than 250 vehicles were booked under Section 192 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 for operating without registration. However, these vehicles were easily released upon paying a fine of ₹5,000, with no subsequent vehicle confiscation, permit suspension, or criminal prosecution

launched against the owners or drivers.

To patch these gaps, the court emphasized that repeat vehicles must face immediate seizure and denial of release. Madhya Pradesh informed the bench that it plans to deploy static checkpoints at eight specific locations across Bham, Morena and Sheopur districts to improve real-time surveillance and block major transit routes used by the active mining mafia.

Family members said he worked as an electrician and remained exposed to extreme heat regularly. Over the past three to four days, he had complained of severe chest pain and deteriorating health but relied on over-the-counter medicines instead of seeking medical treatment.

On Monday evening, Ganesh reportedly fainted in the bathroom after suffering a medical complication. When he did not come out for a long time, family members broke open the door and found him unconscious. He was rushed to a nearby hospital, where doctors declared him dead on arrival. Police have initiated a probe and conducted the autopsy to ascertain the exact cause of death.

Initial site inspections did not yield any suicide note, leaving the underlying cause behind the extreme step unclear. Hahabgani SHO Sanjeev Choudhary confirmed that an official case has been registered and a meticulous investigation is underway. Detectives are currently analyzing the student's mobile phone data, personal contacts and social media accounts while recording statements from family members and close acquaintances. Sources added that while the senior official is posted at the Police Headquarters, his wife is employed in the judicial service.

Rekha Gupta's Rs 66,000 massage chair sparks viral buzz

A photograph shared by Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta from a meeting with actor Rakesh Bedi has sparked discussion online after social media users identified the executive chair visible in the image as a premium model priced between ₹66,000 and ₹82,000. The image, posted on Gupta's official account on

May 25, showed the Chief Minister seated on what several users claimed was the Red Oak 'Impero' executive chair. The model includes features such as electronic massage functions, reclining settings, an automatic footrest, foam cushioning and leather upholstery.

Soon after the photograph began circulating online, users started debating the optics of the chair, particularly in the



context of Delhi's ongoing civic issues and political messaging. Some critics even

questioned whether the chair had been purchased using government funds.

Critics also questioned whether the chair was purchased using public funds—a question that, notably, neither

the government nor Gupta's office has clearly addressed in public statements so far.

The sharpest political attack came from AAP MLA Sanjeev Jha, who framed the chair not as a matter of price but of priorities. Delhi, he pointed out, is a city where areas like Dwarka face daily water shortages of 250 million gallons.

Against that backdrop, the image of the Chief Minister in

a leather-upholstered, massage-enabled chair worth up to ₹82,000 was, in his telling, a statement of misplaced governance.

At the same time, BJP supporters and several social media users defended Gupta, drawing comparisons with the controversy surrounding former Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and the renovation costs associated with his official residence.

The Congress on Tuesday alleged that it was the "atmosphere of threat, intimidation and interference" prevailing in India that was hampering the country's economic growth and adversely impacting the inflow of foreign direct investment (FDI).

Raising the issue, Congress general secretary Jairam Ramesh said Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman referred to how the 3Fs -- Fuel, Fertilizers and Forex -- are matters of great concern.

"But she forgets the all-important fourth F: Falling rates of private investment that have been in evidence these past few years," he said.

Ramesh added that net FDI flows have declined and



private corporate investment as a percentage of GDP was at half of the peak pre-2014 level. As a consequence, he said, "Indian businesses are seeking more predictable and profitable ventures abroad and Indian corporate personalities are taking up residence abroad."

Noting that "investment is as much a financial decision as it is driven by psychological factors", the Congress leader insisted that while "lack of broad-based consumer demand growth has disincentivized companies from investing, the overall atmosphere of threat, intimidation, and intrusiveness created by the Modi Government is a psychological deterrent."

He insisted that recognising what really ails the economy with humility and sobriety and taking remedial actions was the need of the hour.

56-hour hunt on for three
Pak terrorists in Rajouri

A 56-hour manhunt operation is underway in the dense Gambhir Mughlan forests of Rajouri's border belt, where security forces intensify efforts to track the group.

The high-stakes operation began at around 11:30 am on May 24, when an intelligence-based joint search operation in the Dormal-Gambhir Mughlan belt led to contact with the terrorists.

According to the White Knight Corps, troops responded with swift action and engaged the group in a firefight before establishing an effective cordon around the area. The operation has been codenamed Op Sherwall and remains underway.

Officials said the search operation continued through the night, with forces maintaining an unbroken cordon to deny the terrorists the advantage of darkness.

Sources said all three suspected terrorists are believed to be Pakistani nationals.

The trio are believed to have taken shelter deep inside the dense forest cover, prompting security forces to proceed cautiously to avoid collateral damage.

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11 killed in two UP
highway accidents

At least 11 people were killed and several others injured in two separate road accidents on highways in Uttar Pradesh in the early hours of Tuesday, with police suspecting driver fatigue in both cases.

In the first accident, seven passengers, including a sub-inspector, died after a private sleeper bus travelling from Delhi to Gorakhpur overturned on the Lucknow-Agra Expressway in Unnao district around 5 am.

Police said the bus, carrying 52 passengers, lost control at high speed and rumbled into a culvert before overturning. The vehicle then skidded for nearly 100 metres on the road, highlighting the impact of the crash.

Three police personnel were among the 24 injured passengers. Several injured persons were referred to the Trauma Centre in Lucknow after their condition turned critical.

Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath took cognisance of the accident, expressed grief



over the deaths and directed officials to speed up relief and rescue operations. He also announced compensation for the families of the deceased.

In the second accident, four friends, including a government doctor, were killed after their Innova car rumbled into the rear of a trailer truck on the Lucknow-Sultanpur highway in Barabanki district.

The accident took place near Bhikra village in the Haidergarh area around 3 am when the group was travelling to Kaichi Dham.

Police said the Innova was moving at around 100 kmph when it crashed into the trailer from behind. Three other occupants suffered serious injuries and were rushed to hospital by police and local residents.
