- These Standalone Financial Results for the quarter/year ended 31st March, 2026 and the Consolidated Financial Results for the year ended 31st March, 2026 have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and subsequently approved at the meeting of the Board of Directors held on 23rd May, 2026.
- This statement has been prepared in accordance with companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 (Ind AS), prescribed under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and other recognised accounting practices and policies to the extent applicable.
- The Company operates mainly in the business segment of fund based leasing & financing activity. All other activities revolve around the main business. Further, all activities are carried out within India. As such, there are no separate reportable segments as per the provisions of IND AS 108 on 'Operating Segments'.
- The Government of India has consolidated 29 existing labour legislations into a unified framework comprising four labour codes viz the Code on Wages, 2019, the Code on Social Security, 2020, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 (collectively referred to as the "Codes"). The Codes have been made effective from November 21, 2025. The Ministry of Labour & Employment published draft Central Rules and FAQs to enable assessment of the financial impact due to changes in regulations.

The incremental impact of these changes as assessed by the Company, on the basis of the information available, consistent with the guidance provided by The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, is not material and has been recognised in the standalone financial results of the Company for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2026. The Company continues to monitor the developments pertaining to Labour Codes and will evaluate impact, if any, on the measurement of liability pertaining to employee benefits.
- The figures for the quarter ended March 31, 2026 and March 31, 2025 are the balancing figures between audited figures in respect of full financial year and the unaudited published year to date figures upto nine months ended December 31, 2025 and December 31, 2024 which were subject to limited review.
- Figures of the corresponding previous period have been regrouped wherever necessary.

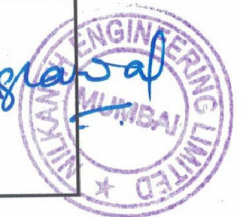

Opinion

- ii. gives a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the Indian Accounting Standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India of the net loss and total comprehensive income and other standalone financial information of the Company for the quarter and year then ended March 31, 2026.

Basis for Opinion

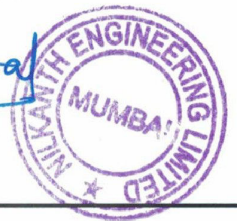

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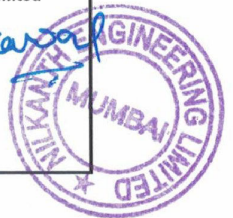

It also includes share of Other Comprehensive Loss of Rs.21.69 Lacs and Rs. 173.00 Lacs for the quarter and year ended March 31, 2026 respectively, which financial statements/financial information have not been audited by us. These financial statements have been audited by other auditors, whose reports have been furnished to us by the management of the Parent Company and our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, in so far as it relates to the said amounts and disclosures is based solely on the report of such other auditors.

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Our opinion on the Statement is not modified in respect of the above matters with respect to our reliance on the financial statements audited by other auditors.

The Statement includes the results for the quarter ended March 31, 2026 being the balancing figure between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year ended March 31, 2026 and the published unaudited year-to-date figures up to the third quarter of the current financial year, which were subjected to a limited review by us, as required under the Listing Regulations.

Our report on the Consolidated Financial Results is not modified in respect of these matters.
