Scrapping RDG for Himachal an assault on fiscal federalism : Sukhu

Shimla: Launching a sharp attack on BJP MPs and MLAs for defending the Centre's decision to scrap the Special Revenue Deficit Grant (RDG) for Himachal Pradesh, Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said the move strikes at the very core of fiscal federalism and disproportionately hurts a small hill state.

Reacting to statements by BJP Members of Parliament and opposition MLAs on the union Budget, Sukhu said on Thursday that Himachal's fiscal stress cannot be equated with that of revenue-surplus states, as BJP leaders have attempted to justify the withdrawal of RDG.

He stressed that Himachal has a structurally weak tax base, limited industrial presence, difficult topography and high expenditure commitments on infrastructure, roads, health, education and disaster management.

"Equating Himachal with large, revenue-surplus states is a deliberate distortion of facts," Sukhu re-



marked. Explaining the fiscal background, Sukhu said the state suffered substantial revenue erosion after the implementation of the Goods and Services Tax.

While GST subsumed several state taxes, the Centre had assured that States with low revenue-raising capacity would be protected through compensation and special grants. Himachal received nearly Rs 3,000 crore annually as GST compensation till June 2022, but that support was discontinued, intensifying the fiscal imbalance. The scrapping of RDG, amounting to around Rs 48,000 crore over the award period, has further aggravated the situation, he added. The Chief Minister emphasised that RDG was not a charity or discretionary dolo,

but a constitutional mechanism under Article 275(1), provided over and above the divisible pool of central taxes to bridge revenue deficits of vulnerable states.

"This grant was specifically designed to ensure that states like Himachal can maintain basic services and development spending without slipping into unsustainable debt," he said. Sukhu revealed that he had repeatedly raised the issue with the Centre, meeting union Finance Minister and the 16th Finance Commission Chairman four times.

Despite detailed representations on the state's fiscal constraints, he alleged that Himachal's concerns were overlooked. Taking direct aim at BJP MP, Sukhu said, portraying the union Budget as a major gain for Himachal was misleading.

"Every state gets routine allocations. The real question is whether BJP leaders from Himachal support or oppose the scrapping of RDG," he asked.

Akhilesh Yadav alleges conspiracy to cut PDA votes, urges Supreme Court's immediate intervention

New Delhi: Samajwadi Party (SP) chief and former Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Akhilesh Yadav on Thursday accused the Bharatiya Janata Party and its allies of conspiring to disenfranchise voters from the PDA (Pichhda, Dalit, Alpsankhyak) communities, particularly minorities, by misusing electoral procedures in Uttar Pradesh. He called upon the Supreme Court to take immediate cognisance of the matter, saying no other institution was left that could be trusted to protect voters' constitutional rights. In a series of messages posted on his WhatsApp channel, Yadav alleged that Booth Level Officers (BLOs) were being harassed, threatened and pressured to facilitate the deletion of voters' names using forged documents. "Maananiya Sarvochch Nyayalaya tatkaal sangyaan le, kyun-ki aur kisi se ummeed nahi bachi hai," Yadav said, appealing directly to the apex court. The SP chief claimed



that Form 7, which is used for objections and deletion of names from the electoral roll under the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) process, was being systematically misused to target voters from PDA communities. "BJP aur unke sahyogi, apradhiyon ki tarah pesh aa rahe hain. Woh UP ke BLO ko pratadit karke, dabav banakar, dhamakarak PDA samaj, khas taur

se alpsankhyak samuday ka vote farzi dastavezon ke aadhar par kaatne ki saazish kar rahe hain," he alleged.

Yadav demanded an immediate ban on the use of Form 7 until what he described as a "valid and transparent mechanism" was put in place. He also sought the cancellation of all Form 7 applications submitted so far and an immediate halt to

claim-and-objection activities. "SIR mein Form 7 ke durupyog ko turant roka jaye aur har voter ke mat dene ke samvaidhanik adhikar ki raksha ki jaye," he said. He further demanded that FIRs be registered against those allegedly forcing BLOs and that such cases be heard on a fast-track basis. Escalating his attack, the SP president sought a judi-

cial inquiry into what he termed "anti-national forces" working behind the alleged conspiracy to delete voters' names. "Desh ki janta ke vote kaatne ke shadyantra ke peeche kaun si desh-virodhi taaqatein sakriya hain, iski nyayik jaanch ho," Yadav said. Yadav also appealed to what he called "honest journalists and officials" to come forward and support the fight against these alleged forces. Appealing to party workers, he urged "PDA praharis" to remain vigilant and actively work to protect every legitimate vote. BJP ki dhandhli ko unki hone wali haar ki hatasha samjhein aur unke ghotalon ke saboot ikattha karke unke khilaf FIR ki taiyari karein," he said. Yadav further asserted that the growing support base of the PDA alliance had unsettled the ruling party. "Sach to yeh hai ki jaise-jaise PDA parivaar badh raha hai, waise-waise BJP dar rahi hai," he added.

Kerala CM to inaugurate 'Vision 2031' International conference on Feb 15

Thiruvananthapuram: Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan will inaugurate the 'Vision 2031' International Conference on February 15 in Thiruvananthapuram, marking the start of a three-day deliberative exercise aimed at shaping the State's long-term development roadmap. The conference assumes significance as Kerala prepares to complete 75 years of its formation in 2031.



the conference will move into its technical phase, with sessions being conducted across nine venues in Thiruvananthapuram. These sessions will collectively deliberate on 18 key thematic areas central to Kerala's future development vision.

The thematic discussions are grounded in grass-roots-level consultations. Ideas for the sessions have been consolidated from 34 seminars held across 14 districts during October and November, organised under the leadership of various government departments.

Officials noted that this consultative process ensured participation from diverse stakeholders, including academics, policymakers, civil society organisations, and sectoral experts, making the Vision 2031 exercise broad-based and inclusive. Experts from both national and international arenas will assess Kerala's existing development initiatives and present their perspectives on the State's future pathway. Areas such as health, education, employment, climate resilience, digital governance, and social welfare are expected to receive focused attention. The conference also aims to evaluate the sustainability of Kerala's much-discussed development model in the face of emerging challenges such as demographic transition, climate change, fiscal pressures, and global economic uncertainties.

EOW files chargesheet against woman for allegedly misrepresenting citizenship to secure SKIMS job

Srinagar: The Economic Offences Wing (EOW) Kashmir of the Crime Branch J&K has filed a chargesheet against a lady, alleging she secured appointment as Assistant Professor at Sher-i-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences (SKIMS), Soura SKIMS despite being a United Kingdom national and an Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) card holder, officials said on Thursday.

The charge sheet was produced in 2022 FIR, registered under Sections 199 and 420 RPC, before the Court of Chief Judicial Magistrate, Srinagar, against Afshan a resident of Shibath Zadibal.

The case pertains to allegations that Afshan Shabir, who was appointed as Assis-

tant Professor at SKIMS Soura in 2019, is a UK national and an OCI card holder, thereby rendering her ineligible for appointment to a Government post.

Investigation revealed that the accused applied for the post as an in-service candidate and submitted documents, including a State Subject Certificate, declaring herself to be an Indian citizen and a permanent resident of J&K.

On the basis of these declarations, she was selected and appointed, EOW said in a statement.

"During the course of investigation, official records including her service book, personal file, application form, and selection committee minutes were seized and

examined. It surfaced that the accused had acquired British citizenship prior to her Government service and allegedly concealed this fact while applying for and continuing in Government service. The accused admitted to holding a British passport and an OCI card," they added. The investigation established that by misrepresenting her citizenship status, the accused fraudulently secured a public post, causing wrongful gain to herself and corresponding loss to the Government.

"Her services were terminated in 2022, and upon culmination of investigation, the chargesheet was produced before the competent court for judicial adjudication," EOW said.

Odisha strengthens paddy procurement with digital platform, ensures timely MSP payments

Bhubaneswar: In a major step towards enhancing transparency and efficiency in paddy procurement, the Odisha Government has rolled out a robust digital platform to ensure timely and error-free disbursement of Minimum Support Price (MSP) and input assistance to farmers across the State.

As part of this landmark reform, the State has, for the first time, implemented Aadhaar-based e-KYC verification to eliminate the possibility of erroneous or duplicate payments.

This initiative ensures that payments are credited exclusively to genuine farmers registered on the P-PAS (Paddy Procurement Automation System) portal, official sources said.

The Government has been working relentlessly to streamline the procurement process and guarantee transparent financial transactions.

So far, financial assistance amounting to Rs 12,703.74 crore has been disbursed to 10,56,693 farmers towards MSP and input assistance. More than 7.99 lakh farmers have benefited from the procurement operations to date. However, a limited number of 5,562 cases have encountered bank account-related issues, leading to payment errors. These issues are primarily due to bank accounts reaching the maximum permissible limit, particularly in Jan Dhan accounts, Airtel Payments Bank accounts, and India Post Payments Bank ac-

counts. Other reasons include inactive or frozen accounts, non-seeding of Aadhaar with bank accounts, closure of bank accounts, and pending KYC updates.

To address these challenges, the State Government has taken proactive measures. District-level field functionaries and officials are continuously engaging with affected farmers and assisting them in resolving issues by advising visits to their respective banks. Regular SMS alerts and phone calls are also being made to inform farmers about the specific errors in their accounts. Further strengthening farmer support, the Government has enhanced its grievance redressal mechanism.

New internal alignment emerges in Karnataka Cong amid leadership tussle

Bengaluru: A new internal alignment appears to be taking shape within the Karnataka Congress, subtly reshaping the party's internal equations even as its top leadership continues to project unity.

Legislators belonging to the Scheduled Caste, Scheduled Tribe and Lingayat communities have begun holding separate meetings in Bengaluru, fuelling speculation about the emergence of a "third front" within the ruling party.

Lingayat MLAs met on Monday night under the leadership of Industries Minister MB Patil, while SC and ST legislators held a meeting on Tuesday evening at the residence of Home Minister G Parameshwara.

These developments



come amid the continuing power tussle between Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar, a rivalry that has persisted for nearly a year.

The Shivakumar camp has maintained that there was an understanding on a mid-term change of Chief Minister, a claim denied by Siddaramaiah's supporters. The issue has been taken to

the Congress high command several times, with efforts made to contain the discord.

Political observers say the latest round of consultations is aimed at asserting numerical strength and pressing for greater representation in the government, including in a possible cabinet reshuffle and, potentially, the Chief Minister's post. Some party insiders, however, suggest that both Patil and

Parameshwara are considered close to Siddaramaiah, and that the meetings could also be intended to counter the growing influence of the Shivakumar camp.

Shivakumar belongs to the Vokkaliga community, the second-largest social group in the state, while Lingayats form the largest. Along with SC and ST legislators, they together command significant strength in the Assembly, giving added political weight to the emerging alignment.

Responding to speculation, Patil maintained that the Lingayat legislators' meeting was routine and unrelated to any leadership change, stating that the community's 34 MLAs were only seeking fair representation in the government.

Manipur Assembly convenes first session after new govt formation

Imphal: The first Assembly session of the newly formed BJP-led government in Manipur is set to commence on Thursday, marking an important political moment for the State following the recent change in leadership. The session comes a day after Y. Khemchand was sworn in as the Chief Minister.

Along with the Chief Minister, four other members of the Council of Ministers were administered the oath of office, including two Deputy Chief Ministers. The formation of the new government has drawn significant attention, given Manipur's complex political landscape and the importance of stability in the State. Governor A.K. Bhalla, exercising powers under Clause (1) of Article 174 of the Constitution of India, has formally summoned the 7th Session of the Twelfth Manipur Legis-

lative Assembly. The session is scheduled to begin at 4 pm.

As this is the first Assembly session of the year, constitutional provisions require the Governor to address the House. The address is expected to outline the policy priorities, governance agenda, and developmental vision of the newly installed government.

The Governor's address traditionally serves as a roadmap for the government's proposed legislative and administrative measures. It is also likely to touch upon issues related to peace, development, and governance in the State. A key focus of the session is expected to be the floor test, through which the new government will seek to establish its majority on the floor of the House. The exercise is a crucial constitutional requirement following the formation of a new government.

Committed to best facilities for cancer patients: J&K CM

Jammu: Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah today reaffirmed the Government's proactive role in ensuring the best possible facilities for cancer patients as well as healthcare professionals.

Addressing a World Cancer Day event here at Government Medical College (GMC), under the theme 'J&K Fights Cancer' to mark World Cancer Day, the Chief Minister expressed hope for a future when the world would truly be able to celebrate World Cancer Day as the day cancer is eradicated.

"Till then, we have to manage this disease as best as possible," he said.

Sharing personal experiences, CM Omar Abdullah spoke with deep empathy about the emotional and psychological toll cancer takes on patients and their families.

He recalled moments of

waiting anxiously for scan results, witnessing loved ones undergoing chemotherapy and radiation, and the pain of losing family members to the disease.

"This disease terrifies people, it terrifies the patient, it terrifies their family, not only because of the prognosis and treatment, but also because of the financial implications," he remarked.

Highlighting the critical role of the Government in combating cancer, the Chief Minister outlined three major responsibilities.

He stressed the importance of supporting research and development, ensuring quality medical education and facilitating doctors and oncologists in advancing cancer care. He expressed hope that future generations may one day speak of cancer as a disease of the past.

The Chief Minister also underlined the need for ro-

bust screening infrastructure, noting that cancer often becomes fatal due to late detection. "Early screening is essential so that this terrible disease can be detected at the earliest stage," he said.

Emphasising the Government's commitment to building strong treatment facilities within Jammu and Kashmir, CM Omar Abdullah said efforts are being made to ensure that fewer patients need to travel outside the region for advanced cancer treatment.

"Our responsibility is to ensure that the least number of patients possible need to travel outside J&K to avail the best possible healthcare facilities," he stated.

The Chief Minister further stressed the need for a strong financial safety net for economically weaker cancer patients, as the burden of treatment is far heavier on the poor. Assur-

ing that the Government would act on all suggestions emerging from such events and workshops, he said, "Please rest assured that my Government will not ignore a single one of them. We are committed to ensuring the best possible facilities in our hospitals and the best possible safety net for our patients."

The Chief Minister concluded by expressing admiration for doctors and medical students for choosing the medical profession, acknowledging the sacrifices made by them and their families.

"We will do our best to ensure that you have the right environment and the right facilities within which to practise your chosen profession," he said.

Earlier, Abdullah inaugurated the new maternity block at Shri Maharaja Gulab Singh (SMGS) Hospital here. The maternity block

has been constructed at a project cost of ₹31.59 crore, with the Public Works (R&B) Department as the executing agency. The multi-storey maternity block has been equipped with enhanced maternal and neonatal care facilities, including 50 beds on the ground floor with critical care and delivery services, a 24-bed OT complex on the first floor, and 84 beds each on the second and third floors.

The Chief Minister also inspected various units and wards of the new block and interacted with hospital staff to review the facilities available for patients.

The newly inaugurated maternity block, equipped with modern infrastructure and advanced medical facilities, is a major step towards strengthening maternal and child healthcare services in the Jammu region. The facility is expect-

ed to significantly reduce patient load and enhance the quality of care for mothers and newborns.
