The business of the Meeting affects your shareholding and your vote is important.

The Directors have determined pursuant to Regulation 7.11.37 of the Corporations Regulations 2001 (Cth) that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered Shareholders at 11.00am AEDT on Friday 15 November 2024.

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

To receive and consider the Annual Financial Report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2024 together with the Remuneration Report, the Reports of the Directors and the Auditor.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as a **non-binding ordinary resolution**:

“That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth) and for all other purposes, approval is given for the adoption of the Remuneration Report as contained in the Company’s Annual Financial Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2024.”

Note: the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

Voting Prohibition Statement:

A vote on this Resolution must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of either of the following persons:

- (a) a member of the Company’s Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report; or
- (b) a Closely Related Party of such a member.

However, a person (the voter) described above may cast a vote on this Resolution as a proxy if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person described above and either:

- (a) the voter is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy:
 - (i) does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on this Resolution; and
 - (ii) expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though this Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel for the Company.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – RICHARD BOYCE

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

“That, for the purpose of clause 15.2 of the Constitution, ASX Listing Rule 14.5 and for all other purposes, Richard Boyce, a Director who retires by rotation, and being eligible, offers himself for re-election as a Director of the Company, effective immediately.”

4. RESOLUTION 3 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – IVAN FAIRHALL

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

“That, for the purpose of clause 15.2 of the Constitution, ASX Listing Rule 14.5 and for all other purposes, Ivan Fairhall, a Director who retires by rotation, and being eligible, offers himself for re-election as a Director of the Company, effective immediately.”

5. RESOLUTION 4 – APPROVAL OF 7.1A MANDATE

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass the following resolution as a **special resolution**:

“That, for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1A and for all other purposes, approval is given for the Company to issue equity securities up to 10% of the total issued share capital of the Company at the time of issue, calculated in accordance with the formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 over a 12 month period and otherwise on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement which accompanies and forms part of this Notice of Meeting.”

Voting Exclusion Statement

In accordance with ASX Listing Rule 14.11, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of this Resolution by or on behalf of a person who is expected to participate in, or who will obtain a material benefit as a result of, the proposed issue (except a benefit solely by reason of being a holder of ordinary securities in the Company) or an associate of that person (or those persons). However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of this Resolution by:

- (a) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way; or
- (b) the chair of the meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the chair to vote on the Resolution as the Chair decides; or
- (c) a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the Resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Note: as at the date of this Notice of Meeting it is not known who may participate in the proposed issue (if any). On that basis, no Shareholders are currently excluded.

In accordance with section 249L of the Corporations Act, Shareholders are advised that:

- each Shareholder has a right to appoint a proxy;
- the proxy need not be a Shareholder of the Company; and
- a Shareholder who is entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise. If the Shareholder appoints two proxies and the appointment does not specify the proportion or number of the member's votes, then in accordance with section 249X(3) of the Corporations Act, each proxy may exercise one-half of the votes.

Shareholders and their proxies should be aware that:

- if proxy holders vote, they must cast all directed proxies as directed; and
- any directed proxies which are not voted will automatically default to the Chair, who must vote the proxies as directed.

If you appoint the Chair of the Meeting as your Proxy or the Chair of the Meeting is appointed as your Proxy by default, and you do not provide any voting directions on your Proxy Form, you will be expressly authorising the Chair of the Meeting to cast your vote as he sees fit. If you intend to appoint a member of the Key Management Personnel (other than the Chair) or any of their closely related parties as your proxy on Resolution 1, please ensure that you direct them how to vote on Resolution 1.

Subject to any voting restrictions and exclusions, the Chair intends to vote in favour for all Resolutions.

Power of Attorney

If the Proxy Form is signed under a Power of Attorney on behalf of a Shareholder, then the Attorney must make sure that either the original Power of Attorney or a certified copy is sent with the Proxy Form, unless the Power of Attorney has already provided it to the Share Registry.

Corporate Representatives

If a representative of a corporate Shareholder or a corporate proxy will be attending the Meeting, the representative should provide the Share Registry with adequate evidence of their appointment, unless this has previously been provided to the Share Registry.

Questions

A reasonable opportunity will be given to Shareholders to ask questions or make comments on the management of the Company at the Annual General Meeting.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the business of the Meeting will include receipt and consideration of the Annual Financial Report of the Company for the financial year ended 30 June 2024 together with the Remuneration Report, the Reports of the Directors and the Auditor.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's Annual Financial Report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Company's Annual Financial Report is available on its website at <https://acdcmetals.com.au/>.

Shareholders will be given the opportunity to ask questions and to make comments on the management and performance of the Company.

The Company's Auditor will be present at the Meeting, and during the discussion of this item, will be available to discuss matters relevant to the audit.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

2.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's Annual General Meeting, a resolution that the Remuneration Report be adopted must be put to the Shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Company or the Directors of the Company.

The Remuneration Report sets out the Company's remuneration arrangements for the Directors and Senior Management of the Company. The Remuneration Report is part of the Directors' Report contained in the Annual Financial Report of the Company for a financial year.

The Chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its Shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the Remuneration Report at the Annual General Meeting.

2.2 Voting consequences

A company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at two consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the directors of the company who were in office when the directors' report (as included in the company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the managing director of the company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as directors of the company is approved will be the directors of the company.

2.3 Previous voting results

No previous strike has been recorded against the Company; accordingly, a Spill Resolution will not be relevant for this Annual General Meeting.

2.4 Board recommendations

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in **FAVOUR** of Resolution 1. The Chair of the meeting intends to vote all available undirected proxies in **FAVOUR** of Resolution 1.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – RICHARD BOYCE

3.1 General

Pursuant to Clause 15.4 of the Company's Constitution, Richard Boyce automatically retires and seeks election as a Director.

3.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Richard Boyce is a practicing Chartered accountant and tax agent with over 25 years' experience. He holds a master's in financial planning, AICD member and one of Australia's foremost subject matter experts on Family Offices, Private Investment Capital and Governance. Richard has worked with leading high growth UHNW entrepreneurial families throughout the Asia. Richard is a former Private Client Tax Partner with EY, led the EY ASIA Pacific Family Office Practice and co-author of the EY Global Family Office Leading Practice Guide. He is an academic director of the global Family Firm Institute (FFI) based in Boston, a strategic consultant to Family Business Australia and NZ (FBANZ), Former Chair of RMIT University School of Accounting industry group, and current independent board member to UHNW generational family enterprises. Mr Boyce brings to the ACDC Board extensive experience in governance, capital markets and financial management.

Mr Boyce's current Board Roles include:

- Executive Director of Boyce Family Office Pty Ltd (July 2000 - present)
- Director of Daisy's Garden Supplies Pty Ltd (February 2021 - present)
- Director of Kyvalley Dairy Group Pty Ltd (October 2016 – present)

3.3 Independence

If re-elected, the Board considers that Mr Boyce will be an Independent Director.

3.4 Board recommendation

The Board has reviewed Mr Boyce's performance since his appointment to the Board and considers that his skills and experience will continue to enhance the Board's ability to perform its role. Accordingly, the Board (with Mr Boyce abstaining) supports the re-election of Mr Boyce and recommends that Shareholders vote in **FAVOUR** of Resolution 2. The Chair of the meeting intends to vote undirected proxies in **FAVOUR** of Resolution 2.

4. RESOLUTION 3 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – IVAN FAIRHALL

4.1 General

Pursuant to Clause 15.4 of the Company's Constitution, Ivan Fairhall automatically retires and seeks election as a Director.

4.2 Qualifications and other material directorships

Ivan Fairhall is a chartered engineer and mine finance professional with over 15 years of mining industry experience. Mr Fairhall is currently a Director and CEO of Pivotal Metals Ltd (ASX:PVT), having previously led a TSX listed exploration and development company. Prior to this he was Senior Investment Manager at Greenstone Resources, a London based mining private equity fund investing in development stage companies. Ivan was integral in sourcing, executing and managing investments, representing Greenstone both on public company boards and on project level steering groups. Previously he worked in design, construction and commissioning roles, and has considerable experience managing predevelopment studies across the commodity and geographic spectrum. Mr Fairhall brings to the ACDC Board senior level mining experience across a broad suite of commodities from exploration through commissioning and into production, helping bridge technical considerations with corporate strategy.

During the past three years, Mr Fairhall has also served as a Director of the following listed companies:

- Managing Director and CEO of Pivotal Metals Ltd (ASX: PVT) (19 September 2023 – Present).
- Director and CEO of Mawson Gold Ltd (TSX: MAW) (27 November 2021 – 21 March 2023).

4.3 Independence

If re-elected, the Board considers Mr Fairhall will be an Independent Director.

4.4 Board recommendation

The Board has reviewed Mr Fairhall's performance since his appointment to the Board and considers that his skills and experience will continue to enhance the Board's ability to perform its role. Accordingly, the Board (with Mr Fairhall abstaining) supports the re-election of Mr Fairhall and recommends that Shareholders vote in **FAVOUR** of Resolution 3. The Chair of the meeting intends to vote undirected proxies in **FAVOUR** of Resolution 3.

5. RESOLUTION 4 – APPROVAL OF 7.1A MANDATE

5.1 General

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, ASX Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its Shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary shares it had on issue at the start of that period.

However, under Listing Rule 7.1A, an eligible entity may seek shareholder approval by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting to add an additional 10% capacity and increase this 15% to 25% (**7.1A Mandate**).

An 'eligible entity' for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1A means an entity which is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of \$300 million or less.

As at the date of this Notice, the Company is an eligible entity as it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a current market capitalisation of \$4.2m (based on the number of Shares on issue and the closing price of Shares on the ASX on 2 October 2024).

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval by way of special resolution for the Company to have the additional 10% placement capacity provided for in ASX Listing Rule 7.1A to issue equity securities without Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 4 is passed, the Company will be able to issue equity securities up to the combined 25% limit in ASX Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 4 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue equity securities without Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing equity securities without Shareholder approval set out in ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

5.2 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.3A

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.3A, the information below is provided in relation to Resolution 4:

(a) Period for which the 7.1A Mandate is valid

The 7.1A Mandate will commence on the date of the Annual General Meeting at which the approval is obtained and expires on the earlier of:

- (i) 19 November 2025, being 12 months from the date of this Annual General Meeting;
- (ii) the time and date of the Company's next Annual General Meeting; and
- (iii) the time and date on which Shareholders approve a transaction under ASX Listing Rule 11.1.2 (proposed change to nature or scale of activities) or ASX Listing Rule 11.2 (change involving main undertaking).

(b) Minimum Price at which the equity securities may be issued under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2

Any equity securities issued under 7.1A.2 must be in an existing quoted class of the Company's equity securities and be issued for cash consideration per security which is not less than 75% of the volume weighted average market price for securities in that class, calculated over the 15 trading days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the securities are to be issued is agreed by the entity and the recipient of the securities; or
- (ii) if the securities are not issued within 10 trading days of the date in paragraph (i), the date on which the securities are issued.

(c) Purposes for which the funds raised by an issue of equity securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.2

As at the date of this Notice, the Company has not formed an intention to offer any equity securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A during the ASX Listing Rule 7.1A mandate period, if Shareholders approve this Resolution. However, if Shareholders approved this Resolution and the Company did raise funds from the issue of equity securities under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A, based on the Company's existing plans,

the Company considers that the funds may be used to capitalise on growth opportunities for the following purposes:

- (i) acquisition of new resources, assets and investments (including expenses associated with such an acquisition);
- (ii) continued exploration expenditure on the Company's current assets/or projects and funds would then be used for project feasibility studies and ongoing project administration;
- (iii) development of the Company's current business; and
- (iv) general working capital.

(d) Risk of Economic and Voting Dilution to existing Ordinary Securityholders

Any issue of equity securities under the 7.1A Mandate will dilute the interests of Shareholders who do not receive any Shares under the issue.

If Resolution 4 is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues the maximum number of equity securities available under the 7.1A Mandate, the economic and voting dilution of existing Shares would be as shown in the table below.

The table below shows the potential dilution of existing Shareholders calculated in accordance with the formula outlined in Listing Rule 7.1A.2, on the basis of the closing market price of Shares and the number of Equity Securities on issue as at 2 October 2024.

The table also shows the potential voting dilution impact where the number of Shares on issue (Variable A in the formula) changes and the potential economic dilution where there are changes in the issue price of Shares issued under the 7.1A Mandate.

The table above uses the following assumptions:

- Based on the total number of fully paid Ordinary Shares on issue as at 2 October 2024.
- The issue price set out above is the closing market price of the Shares on the ASX on 2 October 2024.

3. The Company issues the maximum possible number of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate.
4. The Company has not issued any Equity Securities in the 12 months prior to the Meeting that were not issued under an exception in ASX Listing Rule 7.2 or with approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.
5. The issue of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate consists only of Shares. It is assumed that no Options are exercised into Shares before the date of issue of the Equity Securities.
6. The calculations above do not show the dilution that any one particular Shareholder will be subject to. All Shareholders should consider the dilution caused to their own shareholding depending on their specific circumstances.
7. This table does not set out any dilution pursuant to approvals under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 unless otherwise disclosed.
8. The 10% voting dilution reflects the aggregate percentage dilution against the issued share capital at the time of issue. This is why the voting dilution is shown in each example as 10%.
9. The table does not show an example of dilution that may be caused to a particular Shareholder by reason of placements under the 7.1A mandate, based on that Shareholder's holding at the date of the Meeting.

Shareholders should note that there is a risk that:

- (i) the market price for the Company's equity securities in that class may be significantly lower on the issue date than on the date of the Annual General Meeting; and
- (ii) the equity securities may be issued at a price that is at a discount to the market price for those equity securities on the date of issue.

(e) Allocation policy under the 7.1A Mandate

The recipients of equity securities could consist of current Shareholders or new investors (or both), none of whom will be related parties of the Company.

The Company will determine the recipients at the time of the issue under the 7.1A Mandate, having regard to the following factors:

- (i) the purpose of the issue;
- (ii) alternative methods for raising funds available to the Company at that time, including, but not limited to, an entitlement issue, share purchase plan, placement or other offer where existing Shareholders may participate;
- (iii) the effect of the issue of the equity securities on the control of the Company;
- (iv) the circumstances of the Company, including, but not limited to, the financial position and solvency of the Company;
- (v) prevailing market conditions; and
- (vi) advice from corporate, financial and broking advisers (if applicable).

(f) Previous approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A

The Company has previously obtained Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1A, however no Equity Securities have been issued in the last 12 months in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.1A.

5.3 Voting Exclusion Statement

A voting exclusion statement is included in Resolution 4 of this Notice.

5.4 Board recommendation

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in **FAVOUR** of Resolution 4. The Chair of the meeting intends to vote all available undirected proxies in **FAVOUR** of Resolution 4.
