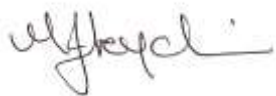

1. **Entire Notice:** The details of the resolutions contained in the Explanatory Statement accompanying this Notice of Meeting should be read together with, and form part of, this Notice of Meeting.
2. **Record Date:** The Company has determined that for the purposes of the Annual General Meeting, only those persons who are registered as Shareholders at 7.00pm (AEST) on the date 48 hours before the date of the Meeting. Only those persons will be entitled to vote at the Meeting and transfers registered after that time will be disregarded in determining entitlements to attend and vote at the Meeting.
3. **Proxies**
 - a. Votes at the Meeting may be given personally or by proxy, attorney or representative.
 - b. Each shareholder has a right to appoint one or two proxies. A proxy need not be a shareholder of the Company.
 - c. Where a shareholder is entitled to cast two or more votes, the shareholder may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise.

ORDINARY BUSINESS

Receipt and Consideration of Financial Statements and Reports

A copy of the Annual Report for the financial year ended 31 December 2022 (which incorporates the Company's Financial Report, Directors Report (including the Remuneration Report) and the Auditors Report) is available on the Company's website at <http://avecho.com.au/> or via the Company's announcement platform on ASX. There is no requirement for Shareholders to approve the Annual Report.

Shareholders will be given reasonable opportunity at the Meeting to ask questions and make comments on the Financial Report, the Directors' Report, and the Auditor's Report. Questions for the Company's auditors relating to the conduct of the audit, preparation and contents of the audit report, accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of its financial statements, and the independence of the auditors in relation to the conduct of the audit, must be submitted no later than 5 business days before the Meeting to the Company Secretary at the Company's registered office.

Resolution 1: Adoption of Remuneration Report

Background

Section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act requires that a resolution to adopt the Remuneration Report must be put to the vote at the Annual General Meeting. The vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

The Remuneration Report is set out in the Directors' Report in the Company's 2022 Annual Report. The Remuneration Report sets out the Company's remuneration arrangements for the Directors and senior management of the Company.

In accordance with Section 250SA of the Corporations Act 2001, Shareholders will be provided with a reasonable opportunity to ask questions concerning, or make comments on, the remuneration report at the AGM.

In accordance with Division 9 of Part 2G.2 of the Corporations Act, if twenty five (25%) per cent or more of votes that are cast are voted against the adoption of the Remuneration Report at two consecutive Annual General Meetings, Shareholders will be required to vote at the second of those Annual General Meetings on a resolution (a "spill resolution") that another meeting be held within 90 days at which all of the Company's Directors (other than the Managing Director) must go up for re-election.

At the Company's last AGM, the votes cast against the Remuneration Report were less than twenty-five (25%) per cent of the total votes cast on that resolution and, accordingly, a spill resolution will not under any circumstances be required for this Meeting.

Voting Exclusions

For voting exclusions refer to Note 5.

Board Recommendation

Noting that each Director has a personal interest in their own remuneration from the Company (as such interests are described in the Remuneration Report) and, as described in the voting exclusions on this Resolution (set out in the Notice of AGM), that each Director (or any Closely Related Party of a Director) is excluded from voting their shares on this Resolution, the Board encourages all eligible shareholders to cast their votes in favour of this Resolution.

Voting Intention

The Chair of the Meeting intends to vote all available undirected proxies in favour of this Resolution.

Resolution 2: Re-Election of Dr Gregory Collier as a Director of the Company

Background

The Constitution of the Company (clauses 20.1 and 20.6) and Listing Rule 14.4 require that at least one Director (excluding the Managing Director) must stand for re-election at each Annual General Meeting. A Director (excluding the Managing Director) must not hold office without re-election following the third Annual General Meeting after that Director's last re-election, or for more than three years, whichever is the longest. Dr Collier is now retiring in accordance with these requirements and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election.

Dr Collier, Chair of the Board, has been appointed as a Director of the Company on 13 April 2015 and has held the position of Executive Chair between 27 March 2019 and 1 May 2020. At the time of this Notice of Meeting, the Board has deemed Dr Collier as not being an independent director as he has served as an executive director within the past three years. This three-year period is expected to end on 1 May 2023, at which time Dr Collier will be deemed to be an independent Non-Executive Director of the Company, with the Board to then be fully comprised of independent Non-Executive Directors.

Dr Collier has more than 25 years' experience spanning operational, clinical, and scientific aspects of pharmaceutical research, development, and commercialisation. He has led the planning and execution of multiple commercial transactions including in and out licensing deals and major M&A activities, and he has successfully taken a drug from discovery through to regulatory approval.

Notably, Dr Collier steered ChemGenex Pharmaceuticals Limited from a research-based company with a market capitalisation of \$10 million to a company with completed clinical trials and regulatory dossiers submitted to the FDA and EMA. In 2011, ChemGenex was sold to Cephalon Inc. (now subsidiary of Teva Pharmaceuticals Industries Limited) for \$230 million.

In addition, Dr Collier has worked with several public and private biotechnology companies on matters ranging from strategy and commercialization through to partnering and capital raising. Including a US drug development company to raise capital and expand shareholder base with institutional investors, pre-product private biotech company to raise capital, refocus operations and deliver M&A opportunities. Worked with and established a USA based microbiome start-up to raise capital, develop strategic plan, develop regulatory and commercialization strategies and successfully complete a clinical trial.

Prior to his commercial pharmaceutical career, Dr Collier had an outstanding academic career resulting in over 150 peer reviewed publications, and senior authorship on 33 patents. Dr Collier was the inaugural Alfred Deakin Professor at Deakin University and also held positions at Melbourne University, Monash University and the University of Toronto. In 2010, Dr Collier was awarded the Roche Award of Excellence.

Voting Exclusions

There are no voting exclusions on this Resolution.

Board Recommendation

The Board (with Dr Gregory Collier abstaining) recommends that shareholders vote in favour of the re-election of Dr Gregory Collier as it considers that his qualifications, experience, skills, and expertise are appropriate for the Board position and will enable him to act in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders.

Voting Intention

The Chair of the Meeting intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of the Resolution.

Resolution 3: Re-Election of Mr Matthew Patrick McNamara as a Director of the Company

The Constitution of the Company (clauses 20.1 and 20.6) and Listing Rule 14.4 require that at least one Director (excluding the Managing Director) must stand for re-election at each Annual General Meeting. A Director (excluding the Managing Director) must not hold office without re-election following the third Annual General Meeting after that Director's last re-election, or for more than three years, whichever is the longest. Mr McNamara is now retiring in accordance with these requirements and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election.

Mr McNamara has been appointed as a Director of the Company on 13 January 2020. At the time of this Notice of Meeting, Mr McNamara has been deemed as being an independent director.

Mr Matthew McNamara has over 30 years' executive and funds management experience in the healthcare and medical sciences sector. He has a BSc (Hons) in Molecular Biology, has an MBA, and is a GAICD.

In 2003, he founded BioBridge Australia, a biotechnology commercialisation advisory company and advised a number of public biotechnology / investment companies.

Mr McNamara is currently Director and Chief Investment Officer of Horizon 3 Healthcare, a healthcare fund manager that has invested in Avecho Biotechnology Limited through trustee Melbourne Securities Corporation Limited.

He is presently a director of Microbio Pty Ltd, ESN Cleer Pty Ltd, Cardiac Dimensions Pty Ltd, and Grey Innovation Investment Partners Pty Ltd. He has held previous directorship in Adherium Ltd (ASX: ADR), Avita Medical Ltd (ASX: AVH), Bioxyne Ltd (ASX: BXN) and Saluda Medical Pty Ltd. Mr McNamara has also served as CIO of BioScience Manager Pty Ltd, and was CEO of SciCapital Pty Ltd, a Life Sciences Venture Capital fund.

Voting Exclusions

There are no voting exclusions on this Resolution.

Board Recommendation

The Board (with Mr Matthew McNamara abstaining) recommends that shareholders vote in favour of the re-election of Mr Matthew McNamara as it considers that his qualifications, experience, skills, and expertise are appropriate for the Board position and will enable him to act in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders.

Voting Intention

The Chair of the Meeting intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of the Resolution.

Resolution 4: Renewal of Avecho Biotechnology Limited Employee Incentive Plan

Background

The Board is committed to incentivising and retaining the Company's directors, employees and such other persons as the Board determine, in a manner which promotes alignment of their interests with shareholder interests. Additionally, the Board considers equity-based compensation an integral component of the Company's remuneration platform as it allows it to be fiscally prudent by conserving cash resources while still enabling it to offer market-competitive remuneration arrangements.

The Company's Employee Incentive Plan (EIP), which applies to eligible directors, officers, employees, and such other persons as the Board determines (including executive and non-executive directors, officers, employees, and contractors of the Company's subsidiaries) and enables those persons to be granted shares, options to acquire shares and other securities in the Company, assists in achieving the objectives referred to above. Shareholders approved the EIP at the AGM of the Company held on 13 July 2020.

No directors or their associates can or will be issued shares, options or other securities or rights under the EIP unless shareholder approval of specific issues to them is obtained. Under the EIP the Company may acquire shares to be held on trust for directors or their associates.

Approval is sought, for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.2, Exception 13(b), to issue up to 183 million Equity Securities (shares, options or other rights including performance rights each conditionally entitling the applicable holder to one fully paid ordinary shares upon exercise or achievement of the applicable milestone). Any additional issues under the EIP above that number would require further shareholder approval, unless they were made from the Company's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

If Shareholders approve this Resolution, the grant of Equity Securities (and the issue of any new Shares pursuant to these Equity Securities) under the EIP will not be included in the 15% limit imposed by ASX Listing Rule 7.1 for a period of three years from the date of the AGM.

If this Resolution is not approved by Shareholders, any Equity Securities issued by the Company under the EIP will be included in the formula to calculate the number of securities which the Company may issue in any 12-month period using ASX Listing Rule 7.1 (15% Placement Capacity).

ASX Listing Rules

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 requires that shareholder approval is required for an issue of securities if the securities will, when aggregated with the securities issued by the entity during the previous 12 months, exceed 15% of the number of securities on issue at the commencement of that 12-month period.

ASX Listing Rule 7.2 exception 13(b) provides an exception to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 for securities issued under an employee incentive scheme, such as the EIP, within 3 years after shareholder approval of the issue of Equity Securities under that scheme as an exception to Listing Rule 7.1. The Company therefore seeks approval of the issue of Equity Securities under the EIP pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.2 Exception 13(b) so that issues of securities under the EIP do not impede the capacity of the Company to issue up to a further 15% of its capital without shareholder approval.

Since 13 July 2020, the date on which Shareholders approved the previous EIP, the Company has issued 108,199,375 securities under the EIP.

A summary of the key terms of the EIP is set out in **Annexure A** and a copy of the EIP Rules is available upon request from the Company.

In the Board's opinion, this Resolution will assist the Company in managing its capital requirements efficiently by ensuring that the Company's annual issue limit is not diminished by issues of shares under the EIP, and capacity is available for capital management initiatives and acquisitions, if necessary and appropriate.

Voting Exclusions

For voting exclusions refer to Note 5.

Board Recommendation

As the Directors of the Company are excluded from voting pursuant to the Listing Rules, they make no recommendation to the Shareholders in respect of the EIP.

Voting Intention

The Chair of the Meeting intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of this Resolution.

Background

The Company announced an Entitlement Offer on 3 April 2023, noting that a Prospectus outlining the terms of the Entitlement Offer has also been announced on the ASX on the same day.

As outlined in the Prospectus, 150,000,000 JLM Options will be issued pursuant to the mandates between the Company and each of CoPeak Corporate Pty Ltd <ATF Peak Asset Management Unit Trust ABN 891 265 739> (or their nominee) (**Peak Asset Management**) and CPS Capital Group Pty Ltd (or their nominee) (**CPS Capital**) (together **Joint Lead Managers**). The Company will seek quotation for both the New Options and JLM Options, noting that they will be combined into a new class of Options.

As defined in the Prospectus, 'New Options' means Options to be allotted and issued under the Entitlement Offer on the basis of 3 New Options for every 2 New Shares subscribed under the Entitlement Offer, with the ability for each New Option to be exercised into one Share on payment of the Exercise Price.

If the JLM Options are issued to the Joint Lead Managers prior to 23 May 2023, i.e., the date of this AGM, shareholder approval for the issue of the JLM Options will be sought pursuant to the ASX Listing Rule 7.4, with the resolutions set out under Resolutions 5(c) and 5(d) of the Notice of Meeting. If this were to be the case, then Resolutions 5(a) and 5(b) will be withdrawn prior to the holding of the AGM.

If the timetable outlined in the Entitlement Offer announcement of 3 April 2023 is delayed and the JLM Options are issued after 23 May 2023, approval for the issue of the JLM Options will be sought pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1, with the resolutions set out under Resolutions 5(a) and 5(b) of the Notice of Meeting. If this were to be the case, then Resolutions 5(c) and 5(d) will be withdrawn prior to the holding of the AGM.

If Resolution 5(a) or Resolution 5(c) is approved, the issue of the 75,000,000 JLM Options to Peak Asset Management may be treated by the Company as having been made with Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.4 (as applicable). The Company will therefore have the flexibility, if required, to issue additional equity securities without the JLM Options counting towards the 15% threshold for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1 over the 12-month period following the issue of the JLM Options.

If Resolution 5(b) or Resolution 5(d) is approved, the issue of the 75,000,000 JLM Options to CPS Capital may be treated by the Company as having been made with Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.4 (as applicable). The Company will therefore have the flexibility, if required, to issue additional equity securities without the JLM Options counting towards the 15% threshold for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1 over the 12-month period following the issue of the JLM Options.

If Resolution 5(a) or Resolution 5(c) is not approved, the issue of the 75,000,000 JLM Options to Peak Asset Management will not be treated by the Company as having been made with Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.4 (as applicable). The Company will therefore have the JLM Options as counting towards the 15% threshold for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1. This will limit the Company's placement capacity under the Listing Rule 7.1 over the 12-month period following the issue of the JLM Options.

If Resolution 5(b) or Resolution 5(d) is not approved, the issue of the 75,000,000 JLM Options to CPS Capital will not be treated by the Company as having been made with Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 7.1 or 7.4 (as applicable). The Company will therefore have the JLM Options as counting towards the 15% threshold for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 7.1. This will limit the Company's placement capacity under the Listing Rule 7.1 over the 12-month period following the issue of the JLM Options.

ASX Listing Rules

ASX Listing Rule 7.1 allows the Company to issue new securities up to 15% of the existing capital of the Company in any 12-month period without the prior approval of Shareholders, unless one of the exceptions in ASX Listing Rule 7.2 applies. The issue of the JLM Options is within the Company's available placement capacity under ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

- (d) The JLM Options will be issued at \$0.0001 each, as outlined in the Prospectus. This amount is expected to be net off against Peak Asset Management and CPS Capital's cash fees for their role as Joint Lead Managers and Corporate Advisors for the Entitlement Offer.
- (e) The JLM Options are expected to be issued on or about 10 May 2023, subject to any revision to the timetable outlined in the Entitlement Offer announcement of 3 April 2023. The JLM Options will be issued no later than 3 months after the date of this Meeting.

The purpose of the issue of the JLM Options is for fees payable to the Joint Lead Managers for services under their mandates. No funds will be raised from the issue of JLM Options as the nominal amounts noted in paragraph (d) will be net off against cash fees payable to the Joint Lead Managers. - (iv) issue 75,000,000 JLM Options to Peak Asset Management (or its nominees).

Pursuant to the mandate between CPS Capital and the Company, the Company has agreed to:

- (v) pay to CPS Capital a management fee of 0.50% (plus GST) of the maximum amount proposed to be raised under the Entitlement Offer (being a fee of \$55,136 plus GST);

- (viii) issue 75,000,000 JLM Options CPS Capital (or its nominees).

Voting Exclusions

Board Recommendation

The Board recommends that shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 5(a), Resolution 5(b), Resolution 5(c), and Resolution 5(d).

Voting Intention

The Chair of the Meeting intends to vote all undirected proxies in favour of Resolution 5(a), Resolution 5(b), Resolution 5(c), and Resolution 5(d).

Resolution 6: Approval of 10% Placement Facility

Background

The Company is seeking Shareholder approval by way of a special resolution to have the ability, if required, to issue Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility. The effect of this Resolution is to allow the Directors to issue Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A during the 10% Placement Period (as defined below) without, or in addition to, using the Company's 15% Capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

ASX Listing Rules information

a. Summary of Listing Rule 7.1A

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of Equity Securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period (**15% Capacity**).

Under Listing Rule 7.1A, however, an eligible entity can seek approval from its members, by way of a special resolution passed at its Annual General Meeting, to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% (**10% Placement Facility**) to 25%.

This Resolution seeks Shareholder approval by way of special resolution for the Company to have the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A to issue Equity Securities without further Shareholder approval.

If this Resolution is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities up to the combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval.

If this Resolution is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% Placement Facility to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval provided for in LR 7.1A and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing Equity Securities without Shareholder approval set out in Listing Rule 7.1.

b. Formula for calculating the 10% Placement Facility

Listing Rule 7.1A.2 provides that eligible entities which have obtained shareholder approval at an Annual General Meeting may issue or agree to issue, during the 12-month period after the date of the Annual General Meeting, a number of Equity Securities calculated in accordance with the following formula:

 - (ii) the issue of, or agreement to issue, the convertible securities was approved, or taken under the Listing Rules to have been approved, under rule 7.1 or rule 7.4;
 - (C) plus the number of fully paid shares issued in the relevant period under an agreement to issue securities within rule 7.2 exception 16 where:
 - (i) the agreement was entered into before the commencement of the relevant period; or
 - (ii) the agreement or issue was approved, or taken under the Listing Rules to have been approved, under rule 7.1 or rule 7.4;
 - (D) plus the number of fully paid shares issued in the relevant period with approval of holders of shares under Listing Rules 7.1 or 7.4;
 - (E) plus the number of partly paid shares that became fully paid in the relevant period;
 - (F) less the number of fully paid shares cancelled in the relevant period.

Note that A has the same meaning in Listing Rule 7.1 when calculating an entity's 15% placement capacity.

- the total number of Shares (or, in respect of Options or Rights, the total number of Shares which would be issued if those Options or Rights were exercised), plus the total number of Shares which would be issued if all outstanding Offers were accepted and all outstanding Options and Rights were exercised or vested (as applicable) (and all outstanding Offers, Options and Rights under any other employee incentive scheme of the Company were accepted, exercised or vested (as applicable)) and the number of Shares issued during the previous three years pursuant to the EIP or any employee incentive scheme of the Company, must not, at any time, exceed the greater of the last specific number approved by shareholders under the ASX Listing Rules or 5% of the total number of Company Shares as at the time of the issuing the Shares, Options or Rights.

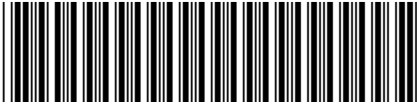
