Wallace Absolute Return Limited (WAB)

Rise in Net Asset Value in Falling Market Reflects Benefits of Investment Strategy

The S&P ASX200 accumulation index fell 3.6% over the week ending Friday 15 April 2005. WAB is pleased to announce that after deducting the latest fully franked dividend of 5.0 cents per share, the Net Asset Value before tax as at **15 April 2005** increased to **\$1.0598** from **\$1.0558**. The Net Asset Value (after all tax, fees and expenses) as at **15 April 2005** increased to **\$1.0224**. This represents a before tax outperformance of 3.98% for the week and 6.47% for the last month and reflects the benefits of WAB's absolute return investment strategy.

WAB seeks to provide shareholders with consistent positive returns in both rising and falling markets. By structuring a portfolio which has equal long and short exposures to the market, WAB aims to neutralise the effects of the overall direction of the equity market. In periods of high volatility WAB believes more relative pricing anomalies are likely to occur. WAB's trading strategies, which are based on sound fundamental and quantitative analysis, are designed to exploit these perceived anomalies.

About Wallace Absolute Return Limited

Wallace Absolute Return Limited ("Company") has been in operation since January 2003 and is a listed investment company on the Australian Stock Exchange ("ASX"). The Company is a market neutral fund offering investors the opportunity to participate in an absolute return product. The Company publishes its NAV weekly through the ASX and on its website (www.wallacefunds.com.au) providing investors with timely performance updates.

The Company's investment strategy involves the use of the Managers fundamental and quantitative research to identify assets that are, in the Managers opinion, mispriced relative to each other. The Company then allocates its capital according to the risk adjusted return expectations of each security in order to optimise the Company's total return for a given level of risk. Broadly, the level of risk is measured by the expected range of outcomes for each security. A greater expected range of outcomes indicates higher risk and results in less capital being allocated to that investment.

Features of the Company include:

Returns not correlated with equity market returns. The Company aims to offer investors the opportunity to achieve positive returns through capital growth and franked dividends in rising and falling markets. These returns may be attractive to investors who wish to diversify the return profile of their investment portfolio.

Franked Dividends: As a listed company, the Company generates franking credits which may be distributed to shareholders through fully franked dividends.

Dividend Re-investment Plan ("DRP"): Shareholders can elect to participate in the dividend re-investment plan. Shares allotted under the DRP are issued at the latest published NAV per share less a discount set by the Board. The Board has determined a discount of 5% should be applied for the time being.

Incentivised Fee Payment Structure: The Manager is paid a base management fee, and a performance fee only if fund returns are above a pre-determined positive hurdle rate. The hurdle rate is the RBA cash rate (5.50% on 15 April 2005). If the Manager does not attain a positive return, no performance fee is payable - this aligns the goals of shareholders and the Manager. Underperformance relative to the positive hurdle rate must be fully recouped before the Manager is entitled to a performance fee. (Also Note: All employees of the Manager are shareholders in the Company).

Flexibility in applying for shares: New investors can buy shares either on the ASX or through the Company's current prospectus dated 21 January 2005. This allows investors to determine the most economical entry price. As new shares issued through the prospectus are issued at Net Asset Value, existing shareholders are not diluted.
