Notice is hereby given that the Annual General Meeting of Shareholders (**AGM**) of CleanSpace Holdings Limited (**Company** or **CleanSpace**) will be held on **Monday, 11th November 2024** at 11.00am (AEDT) at Unit 5, 39 Herbert Street, St Leonards NSW 2065.

The Explanatory Statement that accompanies and forms part of this Notice of Meeting describes in more detail the matters to be considered at the AGM. Please ensure you read the Explanatory Statement in full.

AGENDA

1. ANNUAL REPORT

To receive and consider the Annual Financial Report of the Company and its controlled entities for the year ended 30 June 2024 which includes the Financial Report and the Directors' and Auditor's Reports.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF THE REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, the following Resolution as a non-binding **advisory resolution**:

"That, for the purpose of Section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act and for all other purposes, the Remuneration Report as contained in the Company's Annual Financial Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2024 be adopted."

Voting Exclusion Statement: In accordance with Section 250R of the Corporations Act, the Company will disregard any votes cast (in any capacity) on Resolution 1 by or on behalf of either of the following persons:

- (a) A member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the remuneration report;
- (b) A closely related party of such a member. A closely related party includes close family members and companies the Key Management Personnel controls.

However, the Company will not disregard a vote if:

- (a) it is cast by a person as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with the directions on the Proxy Form; or
- (b) it is cast by the person chairing the meeting as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, either in accordance with a direction on the Proxy Form to vote as the proxy decides or pursuant to the express authorisation detailed on the Proxy Voting Form.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF MR. DAN KAO

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That Mr. Dan Kao who retires in accordance with Clause 6.1(e) of the Company's Constitution, and being eligible, be re-elected as a director of the Company."

4. RESOLUTION 3 – APPROVAL OF ISSUE OF SHARES TO MR. GRAHAM MCLEAN

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That approval is given, for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 10.11 and for all other purposes, for the issue and allotment of 159,650 fully paid ordinary Shares to Mr. Graham McLean, or his nominee, on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement."

Voting Exclusion: The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of Resolution 3 by or on behalf of Mr. Graham McLean and any other person who will obtain a material benefit as a result of the issue of the securities (except a benefit solely by reason of being a holder of ordinary securities in the entity).

However, the Company will not disregard a vote cast in favour of resolution 3 by:

- a person as a proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the resolution, in accordance with the directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the resolution in that way; or
- the chair of the meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the chair to vote on the resolution as the chair decides; or
- a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting on the resolution; and
 - the holder votes on the resolution in accordance with the directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

5. RESOLUTION 4 – APPROVAL OF ISSUE OF SHARES TO MR. DAN KAO

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That approval is given, for the purposes of ASX Listing Rule 10.11 and for all other purposes, for the issue and allotment of 20,512 fully paid ordinary Shares to Mr. Dan Kao, or his nominee, on the terms and conditions set out in the Explanatory Statement."

Voting Exclusion: The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of Resolution 4 by or on behalf of Mr. Dan Kao and any other person who will obtain a material benefit as a result of the issue of the securities (except a benefit solely by reason of being a holder of ordinary securities in the entity).

However, the Company will not disregard a vote cast in favour of resolution 4 by:

- a person as a proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the resolution, in accordance with the directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the resolution in that way; or
- the chair of the meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the chair to vote on the resolution as the chair decides; or
- a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting on the resolution; and

All Resolutions will be by poll

Voting on each Resolution considered at the meeting will be conducted by a poll. The Board considers voting by a poll to be in the interests of the Shareholders as a whole and ensures the views of as many Shareholders as possible are represented at the Meeting. Shareholders who are unable to attend the AGM are encouraged to vote in advance of the Meeting by submitting a proxy.

Joint holders

When joint holders are named in the register of members, only one joint holder may vote. If more than one of the joint holders is present at the Meeting, only the person whose name appears first in the register of members will be entitled to vote. If more than one holder votes at the meeting, only the vote of the first named of the joint holders in the register of members will be counted.

Proxies

All Shareholders who are entitled to participate in and vote at the AGM have the right to appoint a proxy to participate in the AGM and vote in their place. A proxy need not be a Shareholder and can be an individual or a body corporate.

You can direct your proxy how to vote (i.e. to vote 'for' or 'against', or to 'abstain' from voting on, each Resolution) by following the instructions either online or on the hard copy voting form. A proxy may decide whether and, if so, how to vote on an item of business, except where the proxy is required by law or the constitution to vote, or abstain from voting, in his or her capacity as proxy. If a proxy is directed how to vote on an item of business, the proxy may only vote on the item as directed. If a proxy is not directed how to vote on an item of business, the proxy may vote as he or she thinks fit.

For your proxy appointment to be effective, it must be received by Boardroom Pty Limited not less than 48 hours before the time for holding the AGM (that is by no later than 11.00am (AEDT) on Saturday, 9th November 2024).

If you appoint the Chairman as your proxy but do not direct the Chairman on how to vote, then by completing and submitting your voting instructions you are expressly authorising the Chairman to vote in favour of each item of business, even when an item of business is directly or indirectly connected

to the remuneration of a member of the key management personnel of CleanSpace Holdings Limited. Subject to the applicable voting exclusions, the Chair intends to vote all available (including undirected) proxies in favour of all Resolutions, subject to the applicable voting exclusions.

If you are entitled to cast two or more votes, you may appoint two proxies and you may specify the proportion or number of votes that each proxy is appointed to exercise. If your appointment does not specify the proportion or number of your voting rights, each proxy may exercise half your votes (disregarding fractions).

The appointment of one or more duly appointed proxies will not preclude a Shareholder from attending the meeting and voting personally. If the Shareholder votes on a Resolution, the proxy must not vote as the Shareholder's proxy on that Resolution.

Voting Intentions of the Chair of the meeting

The Chair of the Meeting intends to vote all available proxies **FOR** all resolutions.

The Chair of the meeting may vote an undirected proxy (i.e. a proxy that does not specify how it is to be voted) provided the Shareholder who has lodged the proxy has given express voting direction to the Chair to exercise the undirected proxy. If you complete a proxy form that authorises the Chair of the meeting to vote on your behalf as proxy, and you do not mark any of the boxes to indicate to the Chair how your vote should be cast, then you will have been taken to have expressly authorised the Chairman to exercise your proxy on Resolutions 1 to 4 inclusive. In accordance with this express authority provided by you, the Chairman will vote **FOR** Resolutions 1 to 4 inclusive.

If you wish to appoint the Chair of the Meeting as your proxy, and you wish to direct the Chair as to how to vote, please tick the appropriate boxes on the proxy form.

QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS FROM SHAREHOLDERS

CleanSpace welcomes questions from Shareholders and proxyholders in the lead up to and during the AGM. In the interests of all participants, please confine your questions to matters being considered at the AGM that are relevant to Shareholders as a whole. It may not be possible to respond to all questions during the AGM and a number of similar questions may be grouped together and answered by the Chairman or management.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement for the 2024 Annual General Meeting (**AGM**) has been prepared for the information of Shareholders in connection with the business to be conducted at the AGM.

The purpose of this Explanatory Statement is to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. ANNUAL REPORT

1.1 General

The first agenda item is to receive the Annual Report of the Company for the year ended 30 June 2024.

1.2 Corporations Act

Section 317 of the *Corporations Act 2001 (Cth)* requires the directors to lay before the Annual General Meeting the Financial Report, the Directors' Report (including the Remuneration Report) and the Auditor's Report for the last financial year that ended 30 June 2024.

The Annual Report is available on the Company's website and a printed copy has been sent to those shareholders who requested it.

In accordance with sections 250S and 250SA of the Corporations Act, Shareholders present at the Annual General Meeting will be provided with a reasonable opportunity to:

- (a) ask questions or make comment to the Directors present on the management of the Company and Remuneration Report; and
- (b) ask questions or make comment to the Auditor about the conduct of the audit and the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report.

No formal resolution to adopt the Annual Report will be put to the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting.

Shareholders who are unable to attend the AGM are able to submit written questions to the Chairman or the auditor about:

- (a) The preparation and the content of the 2024 Auditor's Report;
- (b) The conduct of the 2024 audit;
- (c) Accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the 2024 financial statements; and
- (d) The independence of the Auditor in relation to the conduct of the 2024 audit.

The questions will need to be submitted no later than five (5) business days before the Annual General Meeting to the Company Secretary at the Company's Registered Office or via email to secretary@cleanspacetechnology.com.au.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF THE REMUNERATION REPORT

2.1 General

In accordance with Section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act, at a listed company's Annual General Meeting, a resolution that the Company's Remuneration Report be adopted must be put to the vote. Section 250R(3) of the Corporations Act provides that the vote on the resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors or the Company.

In accordance with Section 300A, the Remuneration Report sets out the Company's remuneration arrangements for Key Management Personnel. The Remuneration Report is part of the Directors' Report contained in the Annual Financial Report for the financial year ending 30 June 2024. A reasonable opportunity will be provided for discussion of the Remuneration Report at the Annual General Meeting.

2.2 Voting Consequences

Under the Corporations Act, companies are required to put to shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company ("Spill Resolution") if, at two consecutive Annual General Meetings, at least 25% of the votes cast on the Remuneration Report are voted against the adoption of the Remuneration Report and at the first of those Annual General Meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those Annual General Meetings.

If more than 50% of votes are cast in favour of a Spill Resolution, the Company must convene a shareholder meeting ("Spill Meeting") within 90 days of the second Annual General Meeting. At that meeting, all directors who were in office at the time of the Directors' Report, other than the managing director, will cease to hold office immediately before the Spill Meeting. Those persons who are elected or re-elected at the Spill Meeting will be the directors of the company. Note those directors who ceased to hold office immediately prior to the Spill Meeting may stand for re-election.

At the 2023 AGM, Shareholders passed the resolution to adopt the Company's 2023 Remuneration Report with a 99.55% for vote. Accordingly, a Spill Resolution is not required at this AGM.

Shareholders of the Company will be provided with the opportunity to ask questions about or make comments on the Remuneration Report.

Board Recommendation

Noting that each director has a personal interest in their own remuneration from the Company as set out in the Remuneration Report, the Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of this resolution.

3. RESOLUTION 2 - RE-ELECTION OF MR. DAN KAO

3.1 General

In accordance with ASX Listing Rule 14.5, a public listed company must hold an election of directors at each annual general meeting. Further, in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 14.4 and the Company's Constitution, a director must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment.

Mr. Dan Kao, Executive Director and Director of Operations, stands for re-election at this meeting via rotation.

Mr. Dan Kao, a former senior designer for ResMed Inc. (Australia) (ASX:RMD), founded the business of CleanSpace in 2009 and has been a director of CleanSpace since April 2011. Mr. Kao worked in the Industrial and healthcare setting for over 20 years, and has extensive experience in manufacturing, supply chain optimisation, quality management systems and in securing patents for innovative technologies.

Board Recommendation

The Directors, with Dan Kao abstaining, unanimously recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2.

4. RESOLUTIONS 3 & 4 – APPROVAL OF ISSUE OF SHARES TO MR. GRAHAM MCLEAN & MR DAN KAO

4.1 Background

Annually in June, the Board of CleanSpace approves a Short-Term Incentive Plan (**Plan**) for all eligible employees. In FY24, no salary increases were awarded to employees, and instead, the leadership team and salespeople, were provided targets aligned with the Company's financial plans and, should they be achieved, the Company would reward them for their efforts and outcomes delivered. The FY24 Plan targets for the leadership team was structured around sales, EBITDA and strategic outcomes. The rewards were to be paid in cash however, all eligible Australian employees have opted to take their Short-Term incentive rewards in Shares at a deemed issue price equal to the 15-day volume weighted average price (**VWAP**) following the announcement of the Company's full year results (Annual Report) to minimise cash expenditure for the Company.

The total Short-Term Incentive awarded to Mr. Graham Mclean Short-Term is \$72,960.00, and the total Short-Term Incentive awarded to Mr. Dan Kao's is \$9,374.

Messrs. McLean and Kao are both directors of the Company and, under ASX listing Rule 10.11, Shareholder approval is required to issue them equity securities. Resolutions 3 and 4 seek Shareholder approval to issue Shares to Messrs. McLean and Kao in consideration for their FY24 Short-Term Incentives. If Shareholders do not approve the issues/s of Shares, the Company will be required to pay the FY24 Short Term incentives payable to each of Messrs. McLean and Kao in cash.

4.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 3 and/or 4 are passed, the Company will be able to issue 159,650 Shares to Mr. Graham McLean, or his nominee, and/or 20,512 to Mr. Dan Kao without utilising the Company's placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

For the avoidance of doubt, the Company must seek Shareholder approval under ASX Listing Rule 10.11 to issue any securities to a related party or a person whose relationship with the Company or the related party is, in ASX's opinion, such that approval should be obtained.

If Resolution 3 and/or 4 are not passed, the Company will not be able to issue Shares to Mr. McLean and/or Mr. Kao and will need to pay their FY24 Short-Term incentives in cash.

4.3 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

For a public company, or an entity that the public company controls, to give a financial benefit to a related party of the public company, the public company or entity must:

- (a) obtain the approval of the public company's members in the manner set out in sections 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act. Section 211 of the Corporations Act says member approval is not needed to give a financial benefit if the benefit is remuneration to a related party as an officer or employee of a public company and to give the remuneration would be reasonable given the circumstances. Accordingly, the Directors (other than Messrs. McLean and Kao who have a material personal interest in Resolution 3 and 4 respectively) consider that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of the issue of Shares, the subject of Resolutions because the Shares are to be issued in consideration of reasonable remuneration, which would otherwise have been paid in cash, which is a carve out to the requirement for Shareholder approval under section 210 of the Corporations Act.

4.4 ASX Listing Rule 10.11

ASX Listing Rule 10.11 provides that, unless one of the exceptions in ASX Listing Rule 10.12 applies, a listed company must not issue or agree to issue equity securities to (using the ASX Listing Rule 10.11 numbering):

- 10.11.1 a related party;
- 10.11.2 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (30%+) holder in the company;
- 10.11.3 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (10%+) holder in the company and who has nominated a director to the board of the company pursuant to a relevant agreement which gives them a right or expectation to do so;
- 10.11.4 an associate of a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.3; or
- 10.11.5 a person whose relationship with the company or a person referred to in Listing rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.4 is such that, in ASX's opinion, the issue or agreement should be approved by its shareholder,

unless it obtains the approval of its shareholders.

The issue falls within Listing Rule 10.11.1 and does not fall within any of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12. It therefore requires the approval of shareholders under Listing rule 10.11.

Resolutions 3 and 4 seek the required shareholder approval for the issue under and for the purposes of Listing rule 10.11.

4.5 Technical Information required by ASX Listing Rule 10.13

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 10.13, the following information is provided in relation to resolution 5:

- (a) the Shares to be issued to Mr. Graham McLean (or his nominee) who is a related party under Listing Rule 10.11.1 by virtue of being a director of the Company and Mr. Dan Kao (or his nominee) who is also a related party under Listing Rule 10.11.1 by virtue of being a director of the Company;
- (b) the number of securities to be issued is 159,650 Shares to Mr. McLean and 20,512 Shares to Mr. Kao;
- (c) the Shares are expected to be issued as soon as possible following this AGM but will be issued no later than one month after the date of the meeting and it is intended that issue of Shares will occur on the same date;
- (d) the Shares will be issued at a deemed issue price of \$0.457 per Share being the 15-day VWAP following the announcement of the Company's full year results;
- (e) the Shares will be fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company issued on the same terms and conditions as the Company's existing Shares;
- (f) no funds will be raised from the issue of shares however, their issue will extinguish liabilities owed to Messrs. McLean and Kao by the Company in consideration for the FY24 Short Term incentives;
- (g) the key terms of the Short-Term Incentives (**STI**) awarded to Messrs. McLean and Kao are:
 - (i) STI plans are set at the discretion of the Board;
 - (ii) Targets are aligned with the Company's financial plans;
 - (iii) Fair rewards offered for the effort and outcomes delivered;

- (iv) Three areas of target: sales (60%), EBITDA (20%) and strategic non-financial (20%);
- (v) STIs paid in the range of 80 – 120% of the target;
- (h) Mr. McLean's total remuneration package for FY25 is \$606,993 per annum comprising a base salary of \$360,360 plus superannuation, a short-term incentive of up to \$160,721 and the long-term incentive valued at approximately \$44,471.

Mr. Kao's total remuneration package for FY25 is \$299,966 per annum comprising a base salary of \$242,122 plus superannuation and a short-term incentive of up to \$30,000.

Approval pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the issue of the Shares to Messrs. McLean and Kao as approval is being obtained under ASX Listing Rule 10.11. Accordingly, the issue of Shares the subject of Resolutions 3 and 4 will not be included in the use of the Company's 15% annual placement capacity pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.1.

Board Recommendation

The Board, with Messrs. Graham McLean and Dan Kao abstaining with respect to the issue of Shares to themselves, recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of this resolution.

Annual General Meeting Resolutions means the resolutions set out in the Notice of Annual General Meeting, or any one of them, as the context requires.

ASIC means the Australian Securities & Investments Commission.

ASX means ASX Limited (ACN 008 624 691) or the financial market operated by ASX Limited, as the context requires.

ASX Listing Rules means the Listing Rules of ASX.

Board means the current board of directors of the Company.

Business Day means Monday to Friday inclusive, except New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and any other day that ASX declares is not a business day.

Chair means the chair of the Meeting.

Closely Related Party of a member of the Key Management Personnel means:

- (a) a spouse or child of the member;
- (b) a child of the member's spouse;
- (c) a dependent of the member or the member's spouse;
- (d) anyone else who is one of the member's family and may be expected to influence the member, or be influenced by the member, in the member's dealing with the entity;
- (e) a company the member controls; or
- (f) a person prescribed by the Corporations Regulations 2001 (Cth) for the purposes of the definition of 'closely related party' in the Corporations Act.

Resolution means a resolution set out in the Notice of Annual General Meeting.

Share means a fully paid ordinary share in the capital of the Company.

Shareholder means a registered holder of a Share.
