RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

To consider, and if in favour, to pass the following as an ordinary Resolution:

- 'That Mr Murray d'Almeida, who retires by rotation under rule 19.3 of the Company's constitution, and being eligible, be re-elected as a Director.'**

DIRECTORS' REMUNERATION REPORT

To consider, and if in favour, to pass the following Resolution under section 250R(2) Corporations Act:

- 'That the Remuneration Report of the Directors for the financial year ended 30 June 2016 be adopted.'**

Note

This Resolution will be decided as if it were an ordinary resolution, but under section 250R(3) Corporations Act the vote on this Resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors.

Voting exclusion:

- Key management personnel (**KMP**) whose remuneration details are contained in the Remuneration Report (and their closely related parties) are restricted from voting on Resolution 2 under section 250R(4) Corporations Act.
- KMP (or their closely related parties) appointed as a proxy must not vote on a Resolution connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of KMP if the proxy is undirected unless:
 - the proxy is the person chairing the meeting; and
 - the proxy appointment expressly authorises the person chairing the meeting to vote undirected proxies on such a resolution.

NOTES:

- (a) A Shareholder who is entitled to attend and cast a vote at the meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy.
- (b) The proxy need not be a Shareholder. A Shareholder who is entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise.
- (c) If you wish to appoint a proxy and are entitled to do so, then complete and return the **attached** proxy form.
- (d) If the proxy form specifies the way the proxy is to vote on a particular Resolution the proxy need not vote on a show of hands but if the proxy does so, it must vote as specified in the proxy form.
- (e) If the proxy has two or more appointments that specify different ways to vote on the Resolution, the proxy must not vote on a show of hands.
- (f) A corporation may elect to appoint a representative, rather than appoint a proxy, under the Corporations Act in which case the Company will require written proof of the representative's appointment which must be lodged with or presented to the Company before the meeting.
- (g) The Company has determined under regulation 7.11.37 Corporations Regulations 2001 that for the purpose of voting at the meeting or adjourned meeting, securities are taken to be held by those persons recorded in the Company's register of Shareholders as at 7.00pm (AEDT) on Wednesday, 16 November 2016.

2016 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

EXPLANATORY NOTES

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS

The Corporations Act requires that the report of the Directors, the auditor's report and the financial report be laid before the annual general meeting. In addition, the Company's constitution provides for these reports to be received and considered at the meeting.

Apart from the matters involving remuneration which are required to be voted upon, neither the Corporations Act nor the Company's constitution requires a vote of Shareholders at the annual general meeting on the financial statements and reports.

Shareholders will be given reasonable opportunity at the meeting to raise questions and make comments on these reports.

In addition to asking questions at the meeting, Shareholders may address written questions to the Chairman about the management of the Company or to the Company's auditor, Leslie Pines, if the question is relevant to:

- a) the content of the auditor's report; or
- b) the conduct of its audit of the annual financial report to be considered at the meeting.

Note:

Under section 250PA(1) Corporations Act a Shareholder must submit the question to the Company no later than the fifth business day before the day on which the annual general meeting is held.

Written questions for the auditor must be delivered on or before Friday 11 November 2016. Please send any written questions for Mr Leslie Pines to the Company at the address listed on the proxy form attached to this Notice.

RESOLUTION 1: Re-election of Mr Murray d'Almeida

Mr d'Almeida retires by rotation in accordance with rule 19.3 of the Company's Constitution and, being eligible, offers himself for re-election.

Mr d'Almeida has been a Director of the Company since 23 January 2014. He is a member of the Company's Audit and Risk Committee.

Mr d'Almeida has over 35 years of diverse national and international business experience. He founded the Retail Food Group and developed a presence in seven overseas countries. Subsequently he has maintained operating and board positions within a range of financial services, mining, commercial, academic, government and sporting businesses and organisations. His other directorships are contained in the 2016 Annual Report.

The Board (with Mr d'Almeida abstaining) unanimously support the re-election of Mr Murray d'Almeida as a Director and recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of RESOLUTION 1.



RESOLUTION 2: Directors' Remuneration Report

The Corporations Act requires that the section of the Directors' report dealing with the remuneration of Directors, and the Company Secretary (**Remuneration Report**) be put to the vote of Shareholders for adoption.

The resolution of Shareholders is advisory only and **not binding** on the Company. However, if more than 25% of the votes cast on this Resolution are against the adoption of the Remuneration Report, the Remuneration Report for the following year must either address any comments received from Shareholders or explain why no action has been taken in response to those comments.

If, at the following annual general meeting the Remuneration Report is voted against by 25% or more of votes cast, a 'spill resolution' will be put to Shareholders. If at least 50% of the votes cast are in favour of the 'spill resolution' a special meeting of the Company will be held within 90 days at which the Directors in office at the time of the second annual general meeting must resign and stand for re-election.

THE REPORT:

- a) explains the Board's policies on the nature and level of remuneration paid to the Directors and Company Secretary within the Company;
- b) discusses the link between the Board's policies and the Company's performance;
- c) sets out the remuneration details for each Director;
- d) provides details on any service agreements, share based compensation arrangements and related party transactions; and
- e) makes clear that the basis for remunerating non-executive Directors is distinct from the basis for remunerating executives, including executive Directors.

The Chairman will give Shareholders a reasonable opportunity to ask questions about, or to make comments on, the Remuneration Report.

The Board recommends you vote in favour of RESOLUTION 2.

TO VOTE BY COMPLETING THE PROXY FORM

STEP 1 APPOINTMENT OF PROXY

Indicate who you want to appoint as your Proxy.

If you wish to appoint the Chair of the Meeting as your proxy, mark the box. If you wish to appoint someone other than the Chair of the Meeting as your proxy please write the full name of that individual or body corporate. If you leave this section blank, or your named proxy does not attend the meeting, the Chair of the Meeting will be your proxy. A proxy need not be a security holder of the Company. Do not write the name of the issuer Company or the registered security holder in the space.

Appointment of a Second Proxy

You are entitled to appoint up to two proxies to attend the meeting and vote. If you wish to appoint a second proxy, an additional Proxy Form may be obtained by contacting the Company's securities registry or you may copy this form.

To appoint a second proxy you must:

- (a) complete two Proxy Forms. On each Proxy Form state the percentage of your voting rights or the number of securities applicable to that form. If the appointments do not specify the percentage or number of votes that each proxy may exercise, each proxy may exercise half your votes. Fractions of votes will be disregarded.
- (b) return both forms together in the same envelope.

STEP 2 VOTING DIRECTIONS TO YOUR PROXY

To direct your proxy how to vote, mark one of the boxes opposite each item of business. All your securities will be voted in accordance with such a direction unless you indicate only a portion of securities are to be voted on any item by inserting the percentage or number that you wish to vote in the appropriate box or boxes. If you do not mark any of the boxes on a given item, your proxy may vote as he or she chooses. If you mark more than one box on an item for all your securities your vote on that item will be invalid.

Proxy which is a Body Corporate

Where a body corporate is appointed as your proxy, the representative of that body corporate attending the meeting must have provided an "Appointment of Corporate Representative" prior to admission. An Appointment of Corporate Representative form can be obtained from the Company's securities registry.

STEP 3 SIGN THE FORM

The form **must** be signed as follows:

Individual: This form is to be signed by the security holder.

Joint Holding: where the holding is in more than one name, all the security holders should sign.

Power of Attorney: to sign under a Power of Attorney, you must have already lodged it with the registry. Alternatively, attach a certified photocopy of the Power of Attorney to this form when you return it.

Companies: this form must be signed by a Director jointly with either another Director or a Company Secretary. Where the company has a Sole Director who is also the Sole Company Secretary, this form should be signed by that person. **Please indicate the office held by signing in the appropriate place.**

STEP 4 LODGEMENT

Proxy forms (and any Power of Attorney under which it is signed) must be received no later than 48 hours before the commencement of the meeting, therefore by **11:00am AEDT on Wednesday 16 November 2016**. Any Proxy Form received after that time will not be valid for the scheduled meeting.
