RESOLUTION 1 – RATIFICATION OF ISSUE OF PLACEMENT SHARES TO UNRELATED PARTIES UNDER LISTING RULE 7.1

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass, with or without amendment, the following resolution as an **ordinary resolution**:

"That the issue of 42,731,489 Placement Shares to sophisticated and professional investors on 20 March 2026 as part of a placement utilising Listing Rule 7.1 is approved and ratified under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.4 and for all other purposes, on the terms set out in the Explanatory Statement."

Voting Exclusion: The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of the Resolution by or on behalf of a person who participated in the issue or an associate of those persons. However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by:

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by:

- (a) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way; or

However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by:

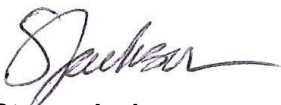
Voting Exclusion: The Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of the Resolution by or on behalf of Red Leaf Securities Pty Limited or its nominees or a person who is expected to participate in, or who will obtain a material benefit as a result of, the proposed issue (except a benefit solely by reason of being a holder of ordinary securities in the entity) or an associate of those persons. However, this does not apply to a vote cast in favour of the Resolution by:

- (a) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way; or
- (b) the chair of the Meeting as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the chair to vote on the Resolution as the chair decides; or
- (c) a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:

VOTING AND PROXIES

1. A Shareholder of the Company entitled to attend and vote is entitled to appoint not more than two proxies. Where more than one proxy is appointed, each proxy must be appointed to represent a specified proportion of the Shareholder's voting rights. If the Shareholder appoints two proxies and the appointment does not specify this proportion, each proxy may exercise half of the votes. A proxy need not be a Shareholder of the Company.
2. Where a voting exclusion applies, the Company need not disregard a vote if it is cast by the person who is entitled to vote in accordance with the directions on the Proxy Form or it is cast by the chair of the Meeting as proxy for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with a direction on the Proxy Form to vote as the proxy decides.
3. The Chair of the Meeting will vote undirected proxies on, and in favour of, all of the proposed resolutions.
4. In accordance with Regulation 7.11.37 of the Corporations Act, the Directors have set a date to determine the identity of those entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting. The date is 6 May 2026 at 5.00pm (WST).

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement is intended to provide Shareholders with sufficient information to assess the merits of the Resolutions contained in the Notice.

The Directors recommend that Shareholders read this Explanatory Statement in full before making any decision in relation to the Resolutions.

1. BACKGROUND TO PLACEMENT AND THE RESOLUTIONS

On 18 March 2026, the Company updated an earlier announcement on the terms of a capital raising and confirmed it would undertake a Placement to sophisticated and professional investors at 2 cents per Share to raise \$1,294,000 before costs. The placees of the Placement Shares will be issued with 2 free attaching Options (Placement Options) for every 1 Placement Share subscribed for.

The Placement Shares have been issued to sophisticated and professional investors who are unrelated parties utilising the Company's Listing Rule 7.1 capacity (42,731,489 Shares and for which ratification is sought under Resolution 1) and Listing Rule 7.1A capacity (21,968,511 Shares for which ratification is sought under Resolution 2). Approval is being sought by Resolution 3 to issue the Placement Options to these unrelated party investors.

Listing Rule 10.11 approval is being sought by Resolution 4 to issue the Director Placement Shares and Director Placement Options to Stuart Gunzburg, a Director who wishes to participate in the fundraising on the same terms as unrelated parties.

The net funds raised by the Placement will be used for the commercial and regulatory rollout of products, advancement of additional reformulated pharmaceutical candidates and providing general working capital.

Red Leaf Securities Pty Limited is the Lead Manager to the fundraising. Part of its fee to lead manage the Placement is the issue of Lead Manager Options for nil cash consideration (and for which approval is sought under Resolution 5).

Red Leaf Securities Pty Limited also acts as corporate adviser to the Company. A corporate adviser retainer fee payable to the corporate adviser will be satisfied by the issue for nil cash consideration of Corporate Adviser Shares (and for which approval is sought under Resolution 6).

The Placement Options and Director Placement Options are on the same terms (exercise price of 4 cents and an expiry date of 30 April 2028 – see Annexure 1). The Lead Manager Options have an exercise price of 4 cents and an expiry date of 30 April 2029 (see Annexure 2).

The Directors unanimously recommend that eligible Shareholders vote in favour of each of the Resolutions so as to respectively ratify and approve the issues of securities. This will enable the Company to have full placement capacity and proceed with the transactions the subject of the approvals. Stuart Gunzburg, who is the Director the subject of Resolution 4, will abstain from a recommendation in respect of the Resolution concerning him.

2. RESOLUTIONS 1 AND 2 - RATIFICATION OF PLACEMENT SHARES TO UNRELATED PARTIES UNDER LISTING RULES 7.1 AND 7.1A

2.1 Background

As referred to in Section 1 above, Resolutions 1 and 2 are seeking to ratify the issue of 64,700,000 Placement Shares to unrelated parties. The Placement Shares were issued as a one tranche placement on 20 March 2026 utilising each of Listing Rule 7.1 and Listing Rule 7.1A.

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A, however, an eligible entity can seek approval from its members, by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting, to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25%.

An "eligible entity" means an entity which is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and which has a market capitalisation of \$300 million or less. The Company is an eligible entity for these purposes as it has a market capitalisation of approximately \$5.7 million at 18 March 2026 and obtained approval at its 2025 annual general meeting to the additional 10% capacity under Listing Rule 7.1A.

The Company is therefore able to issue equity securities up to a combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval within the limits provided.

The Company undertook the issue of the Placement Shares by relying in part on its placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 and in part of its placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1A as the issue did not fall within any of the exceptions to Listing Rule 7.1. The issue did not breach Listing Rules 7.1 or 7.1A.

42,731,489 Placement Shares were issued pursuant to the Company's Listing Rule 7.1 capacity and are the subject of Resolution 1. 21,968,511 Placement Shares were issued pursuant to the Company's Listing Rule 7.1A capacity, which capacity was approved by Shareholders at the annual general meeting held on 5 November 2025. These Placement Shares are the subject of Resolution 2.

Listing Rule 7.4 allows the shareholders of a listed company to approve an issue of equity securities after it has been made or agreed to be made. If they do, the issue is taken to have been approved under Listing Rule 7.1 or Listing Rule 7.1A (as the case may be) and so does not reduce the company's capacity to issue further equity securities without shareholder approval under that rule.

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional equity securities into the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval for such issues under Listing Rules 7.1 or 7.1A.

To this end, Resolutions 1 and 2 seek Shareholder ratification pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Placement Securities.

If Resolution 1 is passed, the 42,731,489 Placement Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of equity securities it can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the issue date.

If Resolution 1 is not passed, the 42,731,489 Placement Shares will be included in calculating the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities it can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the issue date.

If Resolution 2 is passed, the 21,968,511 Placement Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's additional 10% capacity in Listing Rule 7.1A, effectively increasing the number of equity securities it can issue without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1A until 5 November 2026.

If Resolution 2 is not passed, the 21,968,511 Placement Shares will be included in calculating the Company's additional 10% capacity in Listing Rule 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities it can issue without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1A until 5 November 2026.

2.2 Listing Rule 7.5

For Shareholders to approve the Issue under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.4, the following information is provided to Shareholders in accordance with Listing Rule 7.5:

- (a) The Placement Shares were issued to sophisticated and professional investors exempt from or outside the disclosure requirements under Chapter 6D of the Corporations Act. Red Leaf Securities Pty Limited acted as Lead Manager to the Placement. None of the subscribers is a related party of the Company.
- (b) The Placement Shares were issued on the following basis:
 - (i) 42,731,489 Placement Shares were issued pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 (ratification of which is sought under Resolution 1); and
 - (ii) 21,968,511 Placement Shares were issued pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1A (ratification of which is sought under Resolution 2).
- (c) The Placement Shares are fully paid ordinary shares in the Company and rank equally with the Company's current issued shares.
- (d) The Placement Shares were issued on 20 March 2026.
- (e) The Placement Shares were issued at 2 cents each.
- (f) The purpose of the issue of the Placement was to raise funds to be used as set out in Section 1 above.
- (g) The Placement Shares were not issued under an agreement.
- (h) A voting exclusion statement applies to Resolutions 1 and 2.

3. RESOLUTION 3 – APPROVAL TO ISSUE PLACEMENT OPTIONS TO UNRELATED PARTIES

3.1 Background

As referred to in Section 1 above, this Resolution is seeking approval under Listing Rule 7.1 to the issue of the Placement Options to the places the subject of Resolutions 1 and 2, who are unrelated parties.

Information about Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 2.1 above.

The issue of the Placement Options does not fall within any of the exceptions in Listing Rule 7.1 and exceeds the 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1. It therefore requires the approval of the Company's Shareholders under Listing Rule 7.1.

This Resolution seeks the required Shareholder approval to the issue of the Placement Options under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1.

If this Resolution is passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of the Placement Options. In addition, the issue will be excluded from the calculation of the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1.

If this Resolution is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the Placement Options.

3.2 Listing Rule 7.3

For Shareholders to approve the issue of the Placement Options under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1, the following information is provided to Shareholders in accordance with Listing Rule 7.3:

- (a) The Placement Options will be issued to the subscribers of the Placement Shares (the subject of Resolutions 1 and 2), who are sophisticated and professional investors exempt from or outside the requirements under Chapter 6D of the Corporations Act. None of these parties is a related party of the Company.

- (b) The number of securities to issue is up to 129,400,000 Placement Options.
- (c) The Placement Options will have an exercise price of 4 cents and an expiry date of 30 April 2028. The full terms of the Placement Options are set out in Annexure 1.
- (d) The Placement Options will be issued no later than 3 months after the date of the Meeting (or a later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the Listing Rules).
- (e) The Placement Options will be issued for nil cash consideration and as attaching Options to the Placement Shares.
- (f) The purpose of the issue of the Placement Options is to incentivise the placees of the Placement to subscribe for the Placement Shares. No funds will be raised by the issue of the Placement Options.
- (g) The Placement Options are not being issued under an agreement.
- (h) A voting exclusion statement applies to this Resolution.

4. RESOLUTION 4 - APPROVAL TO ISSUE DIRECTOR PLACEMENT SHARES AND DIRECTOR PLACEMENT OPTIONS TO STUART GUNZBURG

4.1 Background

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval so that Stuart Gunzburg, a Director of the Company and thereby a related party, may participate in the fundraising on the same terms as unrelated parties the subject of Resolutions 1 to 3.

Specifically, Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval so that the Company may issue up to 500,000 Director Placement Shares at 2 cents per Share and 1,000,000 Director Placement Options as free attaching Options to Stuart Gunzburg or his nominees.

Listing Rule 10.11 provides that unless one of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12 applies, a listed company must not issue or agree to issue equity securities to:

- (a) Listing Rule 10.11.1 - a related party;
- (b) Listing Rule 10.11.2 - a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (30%+) holder in the company;
- (c) Listing Rule 10.11.3 - a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (10%+) holder in the company and who has nominated a director to the board of the company pursuant to a relevant agreement which gives them a right or expectation to do so;
- (d) Listing Rule 10.11.4 - an associate of a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.3; or
- (e) Listing Rule 10.11.5 - a person whose relationship with the company or a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.4 is such that, in ASX's opinion, the issue or agreement should be approved by its shareholders,

unless it obtains the approval of its shareholders.

The issue falls within Listing Rule 10.11.1 (as Stuart Gunzburg is a Director of the Company) and does not fall within any of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12. It therefore requires the approval of the Company's Shareholders under Listing Rule 10.11.

Resolution 4 seeks the required Shareholder approval to the issue under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.11.

If the Resolution is passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue.

If the Resolution is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the Issue and the Company will not raise the sum of \$10,000 the subject of this Resolution.

4.2 Listing Rule 10.13

For Shareholders to approve the issue of the securities under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.11, the following information is provided to Shareholders in accordance with Listing Rule 10.13:

- (a) The securities will be issued to Stuart Gunzburg or his nominees.
- (b) Stuart Gunzburg is a Director and is therefore a related party (Listing Rule 10.11.1).
- (c) The maximum number of securities the Company will issue is 500,000 Shares and 1,000,000 Director Placement Options.
- (d) The Shares are fully paid ordinary Shares in the Company and rank equally with the Company's current issued shares. The Options have an exercise price of 4 cents and an expiry date of 30 April 2028. The full terms of the Options are set out in Annexure 1.
- (e) The securities will be issued no later than 1 month after the date of this Meeting (or a later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the Listing Rules).
- (f) The Shares will be issued for 2 cents per Share and the Options will be issued for free (nil issue price).
- (g) The purpose of the issue of the securities is to raise funds to be used as set out in Section 1 above.
- (h) The issue of the securities respectively affects Stuart Gunzburg in his capacity as an investor and is not intended to remunerate or incentivise him.
- (i) The securities are not to be issued under a relevant agreement.
- (j) A voting exclusion statement applies to this Resolution.
