Drilling Commencement at Quidong Project

After successive disruptions due to border restrictions associated with Covid-19 and flooded access roads and areas, a drill rig has been successfully mobilised to site at the Quidong Project in southeastern NSW, for commencement of drilling on approved sites.

Quidong has extensive occurrences of carbonate-hosted zinc/lead and gold mineralisation, and potential intrusive-related gold mineralisation, which occurs elsewhere in the region. Previous data and GCR field reconnaissance have identified zinc-lead-gold drill targets which remain to be tested.

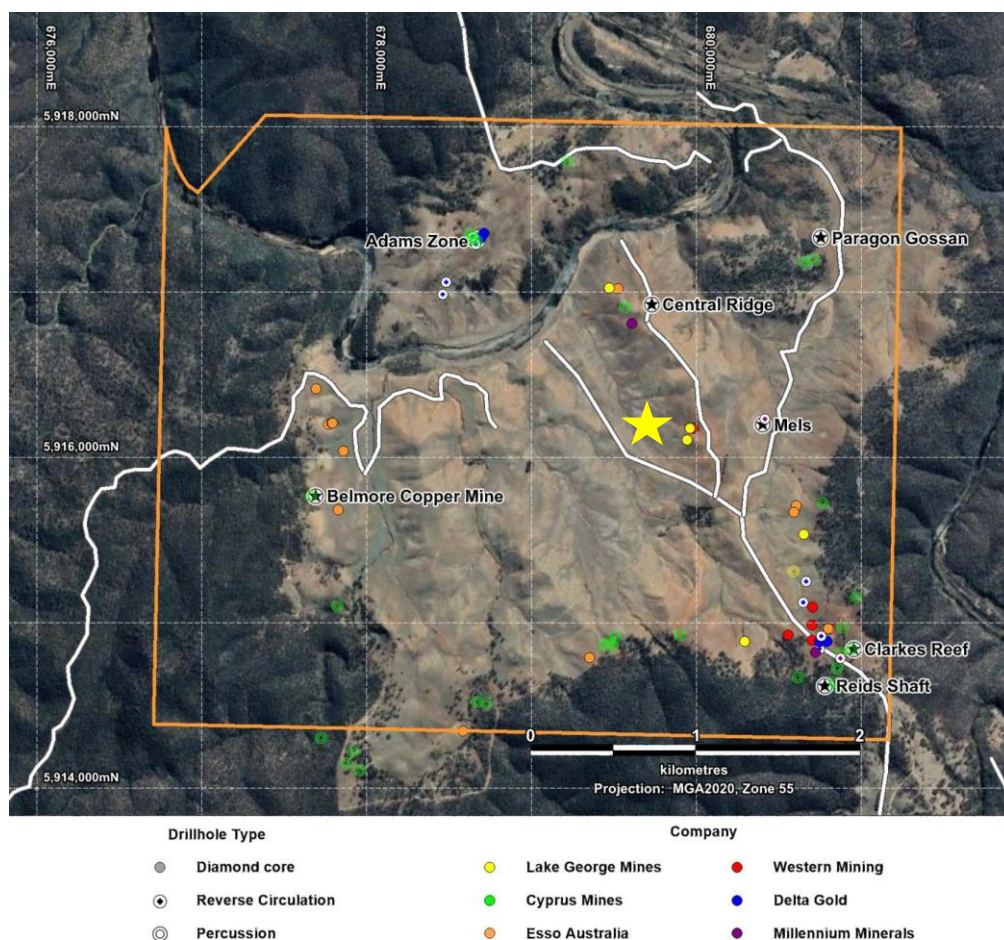


Figure 1: EL7989, historical drill locations and current site

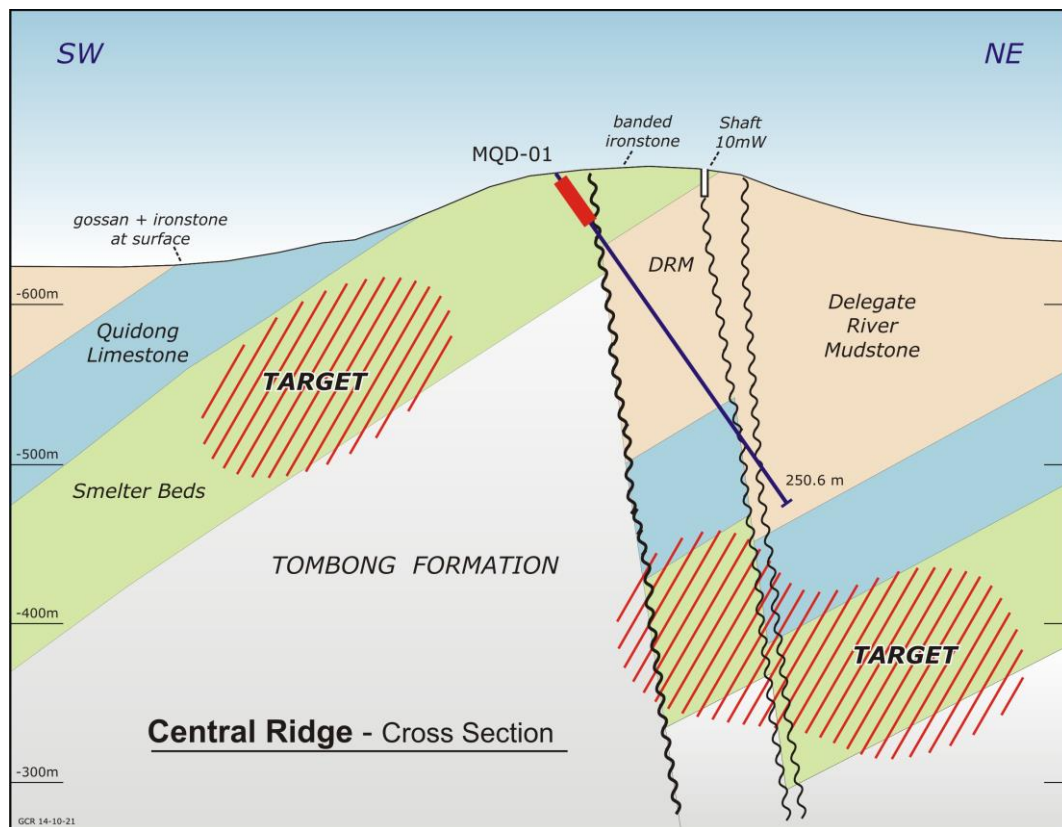


Figure 2: Conceptual Cross section

The current program includes testing of conceptual targets as shown in Figure 2. Detailed mapping has been undertaken to clarify the structural geometry of the proposed drill sites

Outcomes from the current drilling program will be applied to the analysis of the conceptual targets and the determination of future work programs as required.

This announcement has been reviewed and authorised for release by the GCR Board.
