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Gateway Mining Ltd ('Gateway' or 'the Company') is pleased to provide the Quarterly Activities and Cashflow Report for the quarter ended 30 June 2016.

Improving optionality around the Gidgee Project

The ongoing regional development around the Company's Gidgee Project is creating further optionality for Gateway's development plans. Adjacent to the project's western boundary is Panoramic Resources Ltd's Gum Creek Gold Project. Panoramic Resources has publicly indicated its intention to progress the project in light of the improving precious metals sector. Additionally, there is further gold project development to the north and south of the project.

This increasing regional activity enhances the attractiveness offered by the Company's gold mineralised tenements. Furthermore, the Company also remains extremely positive about the substantial exploration upside potential of the Gidgee project.

Gateway has spent significant time in the previous quarter determining the most effective way to extract value from this improving optionality, and hopes to provide an update soon to shareholders on a way forward.

Other acquisition opportunities

The Company conducted (and is continuing to conduct) due diligence on other opportunities and projects in the resources sector. There are a number of opportunities within Australia, as well as overseas, that the Company views as strong value-enhancing options for Gateway over the medium-long term.

The Company hopes to be able to provide an update on the status of these various negotiations and discussions in the near future.

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None of the opportunities or negotiations have yet reached a point where there is enough certainty to make an announcement to the market. Should the Board decide to proceed with any further opportunities, the market will be promptly informed and shareholder approval sought, if required.

Focus on preserving cash

As always, the Company remains focused on minimising expenses and keeping a disciplined approach to cash management, particularly until such point as a transaction materialises.

Most of the administration fees paid during the quarter comprised audit, legal, statutory and exchange related payments. None of the directors took any fees during the quarter.

The Board hopes this prudent approach to cash, along with other money-saving initiatives, demonstrates its commitment to advancing its Gidgee project, and adding any worthwhile projects to its portfolio should acceptable terms be negotiated.

The information in this report that relates to Exploration Results, Mineral Resources or Ore Reserves is based on information compiled by Mr Scott Jarvis, a full time employee & Head Geologist at Gateway Mining, a member of the Australian Institute of Geoscientists. Mr Scott Jarvis has a minimum of 5 years' experience which is relevant to the style of mineralisation and type of deposit under consideration and to the activity which he is undertaking to qualify as a Competent Person as defined in the 2012 Edition of the "Australian Code for Reporting of Exploration Results, Mineral Resources and Ore Reserves". Mr Scott Jarvis consents to the inclusion in the report of the matters based on his information in the form and context in which it appears.
