Waste Handling Optimisation Study

During the quarter, Hawsons commenced a study on process waste handling and management at the Hawson Iron Project (Project). TAKRAF, a world leader in the design of high-capacity bulk material handling systems, has been commissioned to produce this study. Works will focus on the value proposition of substituting haulage trucks with a conveying system, in particular the potential for saving capital, labour and fuel costs.

The study is planned to be completed in May and, subject to final review by Hawsons, findings announced to the ASX thereafter.

Non-magnetic Iron Byproduct Study

Work has commenced on a study focused on liberating the non-magnetic iron from the process waste stream to potentially generate a hematite byproduct revenue stream. Hawsons has engaged a world class mineral processing research engineer to oversee the study.

This work follows the high-level analytical studies undertaken by CSIRO. A summary of the test results from the CSIRO research program was announced by Hawsons in late 2025 ¹.

\$2.2M Share Placement Completed

During the quarter the Company raised an additional \$2,020,000 (before costs) through a share placement². Hawsons Directors will also contribute a further \$180,000 under the share placement, following approval by shareholders at the general meeting held on 23 April 2026.

Placement participants also received one free attaching option per share subscribed for, exercisable at \$0.028 with an expiry date of 6 February 2029.

The Placement will fund targeted initiatives aimed at enhancing the Project economics, reducing development risk and supporting an efficient transition toward the final Feasibility Study planned to commence in 2026.

Community and Stakeholder Engagement

During the quarter, Hawsons engaged in the following community and stakeholder activities:

- Project updates with Federal Government officials;
- Meetings held with the local federal Member for Parkes; and
- Project updates to Foundation Broken Hill, Landcare Broken Hill and Robinson College (Broken Hill).

Financial Position

At 31 March 2026, Hawsons had cash reserves of \$1.0M. Operating cash outflows for the quarter were \$0.37M, and Investing cash outflows were \$0.58M, attributable to the operational activities outlined below.

Operational Activities

During the quarter, activities focused on:

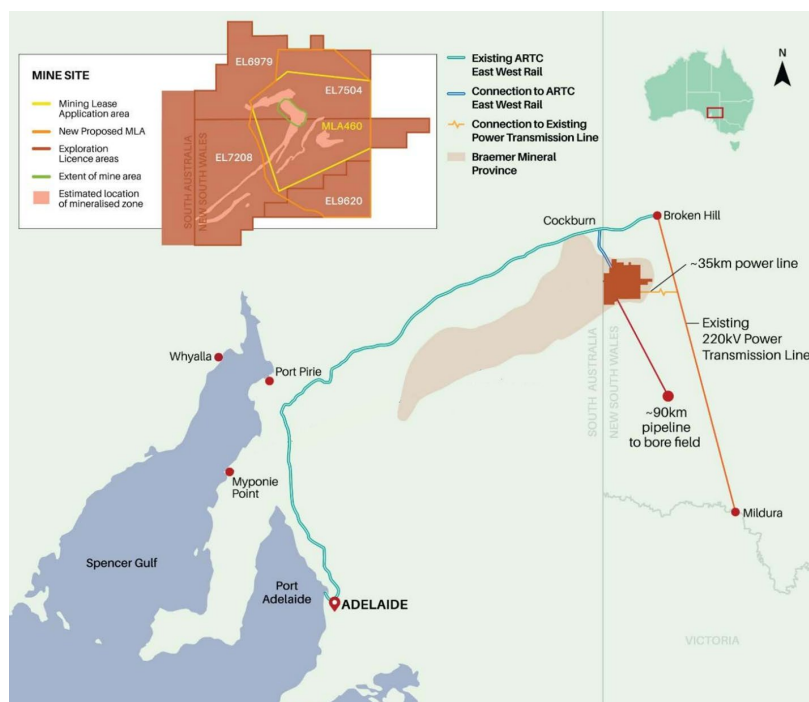

Answer:

Following approval by shareholders on 23 April 2026 of a share placement to Directors, the Company will shortly raise an additional \$180,000.

Further capital raisings will be contemplated as and when required. The Company is confident, based on the success of recent capital raisings, that those future raisings will be successful.
