Allotment and Issue of Securities

Further to the announcement released on 27 July 2015, Hammer Metals Limited (Hammer) (ASX: **HMX**), wishes to confirm the allotment and issue of 4,260,000 ordinary shares to sophisticated investors at \$0.06 to raise \$255,600.

The placement is made pursuant to the Company's placement capacity under listing rules 7.1 and 7.1A as follows; 4,260,000 ordinary shares pursuant to listing rule 7.1A.

In addition to the above placement the Company issued the following additional securities:

7,546,667 unlisted options with an exercise price of \$0.10 expiring 30 July 2017.
