EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. BACKGROUND TO THE PLACEMENT

1.1 Placement

As announced on 18 June 2026, the Company has received firm commitments from existing shareholders and new institutional and sophisticated investors (**Unrelated Placement Participants**), and Directors, to raise approximately \$2.25 million (before costs), through a placement of 225,000,000 Shares at an issue price of \$0.01 per Share, along with one (1) free attaching Option for every two (2) Shares subscribed for (**Placement**).

The Placement is being conducted in two tranches:

Tranche 1

On 26 June 2026 the Company raised approximately \$1.1 million through the issue of 110,000,000 Shares, comprising:

- (a) 63,000,000 shares issued under the Company's Listing Rule 7.1 placement capacity (being, the subject of Resolution 1); and
- (b) 47,000,000 Shares under the Company's Listing Rule 7.1A placement capacity (being the subject of Resolution 2).

Tranche 2

The Company is proposing to issue 111,000,000 Shares to Unrelated Placement Participants (or their nominees) pursuant to tranche two of the Placement to raise approximately \$1.15 million, subject to Shareholder approval (being the subject of Resolution 3).

The free attaching Options under the Placement, will be issued during tranche two of the Placement, subject to Shareholder approval (being the subject of Resolution 4). The Options are exercisable at \$0.02 each on or before the date which is two (2) years from their date of issue and otherwise on the terms and conditions set out in Schedule 1.

The Company is also seeking Shareholder approval for purposes of Listing Rule 10.11 to enable Adrian Byass and Matthew O'Kane to subscribe for an aggregate of 4,000,000 Shares and 2,000,000 Options under the Placement on the same terms as the Unrelated Placement Participants (being the subject of Resolutions 5 and 6).

1.2 Lead Manager

The Company has engaged Evolution Capital Pty Ltd (ACN 652 397 263) (**Evolution**) as the lead manager to the Placement pursuant to a lead manager mandate dated 11 June 2026 (**Lead Manager Mandate**).

Under the Lead Manager Mandate, the Company agreed to pay/issue to Evolution (or its nominees):

- (a) an equity raising fee equal to 6% of the aggregate amount raised under the Placement;
- (b) an advisory fee of \$30,000 or 3,000,000 Shares, in lieu of the cash fee for corporate advisory services provided for the remainder of the calendar year; and
- (c) 25,000,000 Options, on the terms set out in Schedule 1.

The Lead Manager Mandate otherwise contains terms which are considered to be standard for an agreement of its nature.

1.3 Use of Funds

Funds raised in the Placement will be applied to:

- (a) continued exploration activities at the Company's existing Australian based exploration projects;
- (b) acquisition costs at newly acquired Swansea Project;
- (c) permitting and exploration activities at the Swansea Project;
- (d) other potential project acquisition opportunities, targeting the USA and Australia; and
- (e) general working capital.

For further information in respect of the Placement, refer to the Company's ASX announcement dated 18 June 2026.

2. RESOLUTION 1 AND 2 – RATIFICATION OF PRIOR ISSUE OF TRANCHE 1 SHARES

2.1 General

These Resolutions seek Shareholder ratification for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of an aggregate of 110,000,000 Shares to the Unrelated Placement Participants at an issue price of \$0.01 per Share to raise \$1.1 million.

63,000,000 Shares were issued pursuant to the Company's capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 (being, the subject of Resolution 1) and 47,000,000 Shares were issued on 26 June 2026 pursuant to the Company's placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1A.

2.2 Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that 12-month period.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A however, an Eligible Entity can seek approval from its members, by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting, to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25%. The Company obtained this approval at its annual general meeting held on 28 November 2025.

The issue does not fit within any of the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 7.2 and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively uses up part of the 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 and 7.1A for the 12 month period following the date of the issue.

2.3 Listing Rule 7.4

Listing Rule 7.4 allows the shareholders of a listed company to approve an issue of equity securities after it has been made or agreed to be made. If they do, the issue is taken to have been approved under Listing Rule 7.1 and so does not reduce the company's capacity to issue further equity securities without shareholder approval under that rule.

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional equity securities in the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval for such issues under Listing Rule 7.1. Accordingly, the Company is seeking Shareholder ratification pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue.

2.4 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If these Resolutions are passed, the issue will be excluded in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the date of the issue.

If these Resolutions are not passed, the issue will be included in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the date of the issue.

This Resolution seeks Shareholder approval for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1 for the issue of 111,000,000 Shares to Unrelated Placement Participants (or their nominees) at an issue price of \$0.01 per Share, to raise up to \$1.15 million.

A summary of Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 2.2 above.

The proposed issue falls within exception 17 of Listing Rule 7.2 which excludes from the restrictions in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A an agreement to issue equity securities that is conditional on the holders of its ordinary securities approving the issue under Listing Rule 7.1 before the issue is made. The proposed issue therefore requires the approval of Shareholders under Listing Rule 7.1.

4.1 General

This Resolution seeks Shareholder approval for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1 for the issue of 110,500,000 free attaching Options to the Unrelated Placement Participants (or their nominees).

The Options are being issued on the basis of one (1) free attaching Option for every two (2) Shares subscribed for under the Placement. The Options will be exercisable at \$0.02 each on or before the date that is two (2) years from the date of issue and otherwise on the terms and conditions set out in Schedule 1.

A summary of Listing Rule 7.1 is set out in Section 2.2 above.

The proposed issue falls within exception 17 of Listing Rule 7.2 which excludes from the restrictions in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A an agreement to issue equity securities that is conditional on the holders of its ordinary securities approving the issue under Listing

Rule 7.1 before the issue is made. The proposed issue therefore requires the approval of Shareholders under Listing Rule 7.1.

If this Resolution is passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue. In addition, the issue will be excluded from the calculation of the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1.

5. RESOLUTIONS 5 AND 6 – APPROVAL OF DIRECTORS PARTICIPATION IN THE PLACEMENT

5.1 General

As set out in Section 1.1, current Directors, Adrian Byass and Matthew O'Kane (together the **Related Party Participants**) wish to participate in the Placement for an aggregate of \$40,000, on the same terms as the Unrelated Placement Participants (**Participation**).

Accordingly, Resolutions 5 and 6 seek Shareholder approval under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.11 for the issue of an aggregate of 4,000,000 Shares and 2,000,000 Options to the Related Party Participants (or their nominee(s), comprising:

- (a) 3,500,000 Shares and 1,750,000 Options to Adrian Byass (being, the subject of Resolution 5); and
- (b) 500,000 Shares and 250,000 Options to Matthew O'Kane (being, the subject of Resolution 6).

The Shares and Options to be issued to the Related Party Participants (or their nominees) are together, referred to as the **Participation Securities**.

5.2 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act requires that for a public company, or an entity that the public company controls, to give a financial benefit to a related party of the public company, the public company or entity must:

- (a) obtain the approval of the public company's members in the manner set out in sections 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The Participation constitutes giving financial benefit and the Related Party Participants are related parties of the company by virtue of being Directors.

The Directors (other than Adrian Byass who has a material personal interest in Resolution 5) consider that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of Resolution 5 because the Participation Securities will be issued to Adrian Byass on the same terms as Participation Securities offered to the Unrelated Placement Participants and as such the giving of the financial benefit is on arm's length terms.

The Directors (other than Matthew O'Kane who has a material personal interest in Resolution 6) consider that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of Resolution 6 because the Participation Securities will be issued to Matthew O'Kane on the same terms as Participation Securities offered to the Unrelated Placement Participants and as such the giving of the financial benefit is on arm's length terms.

5.3 Section 195(4) of the Corporations Act

Section 195 of the Corporations Act provides that a director of a public company may not vote or be present during meetings of directors when matters in which that director holds a "material personal interest" are being considered, except in certain limited circumstances. Section 195(4) relevantly provides that if there are not enough directors to form a quorum for a directors meeting because of this restriction, one or more of the directors may call a general meeting and the general meeting may pass a resolution to deal with the matter.

It might be argued (but it is neither conceded nor, indeed, is it thought by the Board to be the case) that the Directors comprising the Board, with the exception of Ramón Jiménez Serrano, have a material personal interest in the outcome of Resolutions 5 and 6. If the Related Party Participants do have such an interest, then a quorum could not be formed to consider the matters contemplated by Resolutions 5 and 6 at Board level.

Accordingly, for the avoidance of any doubt, and for the purpose of transparency and best practice corporate governance, the Company also seeks Shareholder approval for Resolutions 5 and 6 for the purposes of section 195(4) of the Corporations Act in respect of the reliance on the arm's length terms exception and the decision not to seek Shareholder approval under Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act.

5.4 Listing Rule 10.11

Listing Rule 10.11 provides that unless one of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12 applies, a listed company must not issue or agree to issue equity securities to:

- 10.11.1 a related party;
- 10.11.2 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (30%+) holder in the company;
- 10.11.3 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (10%+) holder in the company and who has nominated a director to the board of the company pursuant to a relevant

If, by any anniversary date for such periodic payments, the Company has sought but has not been granted access for drilling at the Swansea Project, 50% (US\$5,000) of the relevant payment will be deferred until access is granted or the Koala Option is exercised.
- (c) **Exercise consideration:** on exercise of the Koala Option, the Company will pay the Vendor US\$25,000 cash, plus A\$200,000 in Shares, to be issued at the higher of:
 - (i) the 15-day VWAP of Shares prior to the date the Koala Option is exercised; and
 - (ii) A\$0.01,**(Deemed Issue Price)**, subject to Shareholder approval.
- (d) **Milestone payment:** the Company will pay the Vendor a further US\$25,000 cash and issue A\$100,000 in Shares (at the same Deemed Issue Price and subject to separate Shareholder approval) if a JORC Code mineral resource estimate of at least 20,000 tonnes of contained copper at the Swansea Project is announced within 5 years of the execution date.
- (e) **Conditions precedent:** the exercise of the Koala Option is conditional upon completion of satisfactory due diligence by the Company on the Swansea Project, the claims comprising the Swansea Project having been duly staked and lodged with the relevant US federal or state authority to the satisfaction of
