KAISER REEF LIMITED – COMPANY UPDATE

Kaiser Reef Limited (ACN 635 910 271) (the **Company**) wishes to provide Shareholders with an update as to the Company's activities in connection with the lodgement of the cleansing prospectus today, which is attached to this letter.

During the preparation of its 2024 notice of annual general meeting, the Company has become aware that it has failed to:

- (a) appoint its auditor, BDO Audit Pty Ltd, at the annual general meeting of the Company convened on 23 November 2023 which is required by section 327B(1)(b) of the *Corporations Act 2001* (Cth) (**Corporations Act**); and
- (b) lodge a cleansing prospectus which is required by section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act for the issue of fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company (**Shares**) to participants of a placement in September 2021.

Shareholders should note that the Company's decision to change auditors from BDO (WA) Pty Ltd to BDO Audit Pty Ltd was as a result of the Company's operations being based primarily over east. In effect, there was no change to the auditor of the Company.

The Company has applied to the Court seeking orders to enable the Company to undertake the necessary actions to ensure that any existing and future on-sale of Shares affected by the above failures do not breach the Corporations Act and will update the market accordingly. The Company has advised ASIC and ASX of these matters and of the application to the Court.

Consistent with ASX's Guidance Note 30, the Company does not expect to re-commence trading until the later of:

- (a) the date the orders referred to above have been granted; and
- (b) completion of the proposed capital raising announced on 16 October 2024.

1.2 The Offer

Pursuant to this Prospectus, the Company invites investors identified by the Directors to apply for up to 1,000 Shares at an issue price of \$0.165 per Share, to raise up to \$165 (before expenses).

The Offer will only be extended, and Application Forms will only be provided, to specific parties on invitation from the Directors.

All of the Shares offered under this Prospectus will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Please refer to Section 3 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares.

1.3 Objective

The primary purpose of this Prospectus is as a cleansing prospectus to meet disclosure requirements for offers and sales of Shares going forward so as to remove any trading restrictions that may have attached to Shares issued by the Company without disclosure under Chapter 6D of the Corporations Act prior to the Closing Date (including prior to the date of this Prospectus). Accordingly, the Company is seeking to raise only a nominal amount of \$165 under this Prospectus as the purpose of this Prospectus is not to raise capital.

Relevantly, section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act provides that a sale offer does not need disclosure to investors if:

- (a) the relevant securities are in a class of securities that are quoted securities of the body; and
- (b) either:
 - (i) a prospectus is lodged with the ASIC on or after the day on which the relevant securities were issued but before the day on which the sale offer is made; or
 - (ii) a prospectus is lodged with ASIC before the day on which the relevant securities are issued and offers of securities that have been made under the prospectus are still open for acceptance on the day on which the relevant securities were issued; and
- (c) the prospectus is for an offer of securities issued by the body that are in the same class of securities as the relevant securities.

1.4 Application for Shares

Applications for Shares must be made by investors at the direction of the Company and must be made using the Application Form accompanying this Prospectus.

Payment for the Shares must be made in full at the issue price of \$0.165 per Share.

Completed Application Forms and accompanying cheques, made payable to "**KAISER REEF LIMITED**" and crossed "**Not Negotiable**", must be mailed or delivered to the Company at the address set out in the Application Form by no later than the Closing Date.

1.5 Minimum subscription

There is no minimum subscription.

1.6 Oversubscriptions

No oversubscriptions will be accepted by the Company.

1.7 Underwriting

The Offer is not underwritten.

1.8 Issue of Shares

As noted in Section 1.3, the primary purpose of the Prospectus is to remove any trading restrictions that may have attached to Shares issued by the Company without disclosure under Chapter 6D of the Corporations Act prior to the Closing Date (including prior to the date of this Prospectus).

If the Directors decide to issue Shares under the Offer, the issue of Shares under the Offer will be issued in accordance with the ASX Listing Rules and will take place as soon as practicable after the Closing Date.

Application moneys will be held in a separate subscription account until the Shares are issued. This account will be established and kept by the Company in trust for each Applicant. Any interest earned on the application moneys will be for the benefit of the Company and will be retained by the Company irrespective of whether any Shares are issued and each Applicant waives the right to claim any interest.

The Directors will determine the recipients of all the Shares. The Directors reserve the right to reject any application or to allocate any Applicant fewer Shares than the number applied for. Where the number of Shares issued is less than the number applied for, the surplus monies will be returned by cheque as soon as practicable after the Closing Date. Under the Offer, an amount of approximately \$165 (before expenses) may be raised. The funds raised from the Offer will be applied towards the expenses of the Offer. Refer to Section 5.8 of this Prospectus for further details relating to the estimated expenses of the Offer.

2.3 Financial effect of the Offer

After expenses of the Offer of approximately \$165, there will be no proceeds from the Offer. The expenses of the Offer (exceeding \$165) will be met from the Company's existing cash reserves.

As such, the Offer will have an effect on the Company's financial position, being receipt of funds of \$165 less costs of making the Offer of approximately \$5,706.

3. RIGHTS AND LIABILITIES ATTACHING TO SHARES

The following is a summary of the more significant rights and liabilities attaching to Shares being offered pursuant to this Prospectus. This summary is not exhaustive and does not constitute a definitive statement of the rights and liabilities of Shareholders. To obtain such a statement, persons should seek independent legal advice.

Full details of the rights and liabilities attaching to Shares are set out in the Constitution, a copy of which is available for inspection at the Company's registered office during normal business hours.

(a) **General meetings**

Shareholders are entitled to be present in person, or by proxy, attorney or representative to attend and vote at general meetings of the Company. The Company's constitution permits the use of technology at general meetings of shareholders (including wholly virtual meetings) to the extent permitted under the Corporations Act, Listing Rules and applicable law.

Shareholders may requisition meetings in accordance with section 249D of the Corporations Act and the Constitution of the Company.

(b) **Voting rights**

Subject to any rights or restrictions for the time being attached to any class or classes of shares, at general meetings of shareholders or classes of shareholders:

- (i) each Shareholder entitled to vote may vote in person or by proxy, attorney or representative;
- (ii) on a show of hands, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder has one vote; and
- (iii) on a poll, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder shall, in respect of each fully paid Share held by him, or in respect of which he is appointed a proxy, attorney or representative, have one vote for each Share held, but in respect of partly paid shares shall have such number of votes as bears the same proportion to the total of such Shares registered in the Shareholder's name as the amount paid (not credited) bears to the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited).

(c) **Dividend rights**

Subject to the rights of any preference Shareholders and to the rights of the holders of any shares created or raised under any special arrangement as to dividend, the Directors may from time to time declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders entitled to the dividend which shall be payable on all Shares according to the proportion that the amount paid (not credited) is of the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited) in respect of such Shares.

The Directors may from time to time pay to the Shareholders any interim dividends as they may determine. No dividend shall carry interest as against the Company. The Directors may set aside out of the profits of the Company any amounts that they may determine as reserves, to be applied at the discretion of the Directors, for any purpose for which the profits of the Company may be properly applied.

Subject to the ASX Listing Rules and the Corporations Act, the Company may, by resolution of the Directors, implement a dividend reinvestment plan on such terms and conditions as the Directors think fit and which provides for any dividend which the Directors may declare from time to time payable on Shares which are participating Shares in the dividend reinvestment plan, less any amount which the Company shall either pursuant to the Constitution or any law be entitled or obliged to retain, be applied by the Company to the payment of the subscription price of Shares.

(d) **Winding-up**

If the Company is wound up, the liquidator may, with the authority of a special resolution, divide among the Shareholders in kind the whole or any part of the property of the Company, and may for that purpose set such value as he considers fair upon any property to be so divided, and may determine how the division is to be carried out as between the Shareholders or different classes of Shareholders.

The liquidator may, with the authority of a special resolution, vest the whole or any part of any such property in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator thinks fit, but so that no Shareholder is compelled to accept any shares or other securities in respect of which there is any liability.

(e) **Shareholder liability**

As the Shares issued will be fully paid shares, they will not be subject to any calls for money by the Directors and will therefore not become liable for forfeiture.

(f) **Transfer of shares**

Generally, shares in the Company are freely transferable, subject to formal requirements, the registration of the transfer not resulting in a contravention of or failure to observe the provisions of a law of Australia and the transfer not being in breach of the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules.

(g) **Future increase in capital**

The issue of any new Shares is under the control of the Directors of the Company. Subject to restrictions on the issue or grant of Shares contained in the ASX Listing Rules, the Constitution and the Corporations Act (and without affecting any special right previously conferred on the holder of an existing share or class of shares), the Directors may issue Shares as they shall, in their absolute discretion, determine.

(h) **Variation of rights**

Under section 246B of the Corporations Act, the Company may, with the sanction of a special resolution passed at a meeting of Shareholders vary or abrogate the rights attaching to Shares.

If at any time the share capital is divided into different classes of shares, the rights attached to any class (unless otherwise provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class), whether or not the Company is being wound up, may be varied or abrogated with the consent in writing of the holders of three quarters of the issued shares of that class, or if authorised by a special resolution passed at a separate meeting of the holders of the shares of that class.

(i) **Alteration of Constitution**

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the Constitution can only be amended by a special resolution passed by at least three quarters of Shareholders present and voting at the general meeting. In addition, at least 28 days written notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution as a special resolution must be given.

4. RISK FACTORS

4.1 Introduction

The Shares offered under this Prospectus should be considered as highly speculative and an investment in the Company is not risk free.

The Directors strongly recommend that prospective investors to consider the risk factors set out in this Section 4, together with information contained in this Prospectus.

The future performance of the Company and the value of the Shares may be influenced by a range of factors, many of which are largely beyond the control of the Company and the Directors. The key risks associated with the Company's business, the industry in which it operates and general risks applicable to all investments in listed securities and financial markets generally are described below.

The risks factors set out in this Section 4, or other risk factors not specifically referred to, may have a materially adverse impact on the performance of the Company and the value of the Shares. This Section 4 is not intended to provide an exhaustive list of the risk factors to which the Company is exposed.

4.2 Company specific

Trading halt	As at the date of this Prospectus, the Company's securities are presently in a trading halt on the ASX pending the Company applying to the Supreme Court of Western Australia for orders rectifying the inadvertent failure to lodge a cleansing prospectus upon the issue of Shares on 14 September 2021. Should the Company be unsuccessful in obtaining those orders, there is a risk that the Company may be suspended from trading until it is able to establish a process or mechanism for ensuring the trading of its securities can occur in accordance with the Corporations act. However, the Company takes comfort that there is established precedent for companies to seek the orders that the Company is pursuing in the circumstances the Company is presently in.
Going Concern	The Company's annual financial report for the year ended 30 June 2024 (Financial Report) includes a note on the financial condition of the Company and the possible existence of a material uncertainty about the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. Notwithstanding the 'going concern' emphasis of matter included in the Financial Report, the Directors believe that the Company will have sufficient funds to adequately meet the Company's medium to long-term working capital costs of the Company.
Operating risks	The operations of the Company may be affected by various factors, including operational and technical difficulties encountered in mining, difficulties in commissioning and operating plant and equipment, mechanical failure or plant breakdown, unanticipated metallurgical problems which may affect extraction costs, natural disasters, industrial and environmental accidents, industrial disputes, and unexpected shortages or increases in the costs of consumables, spare parts, plant and equipment. Such changes may have an adverse effect on the operations and production ability of the Company by increasing costs or
