Notice of General Meeting

Notice is hereby given that the General Meeting of Shareholders of Lefroy Exploration Limited (**Company**) will be held at the head office of the Company at Level 3, 7 Rheola Street, West Perth, Western Australia on Friday, 31 July 2026 at 12.30pm (AWST) (**Meeting**).

The Explanatory Memorandum provides additional information on matters to be considered at the Meeting. The Explanatory Memorandum and the Proxy Form form part of the Notice.

The Directors have determined pursuant to regulation 7.11.37 of the *Corporations Regulations 2001* (Cth) that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered as Shareholders on Wednesday, 29 July 2026 at 5:00pm (AWST).

Terms and abbreviations used in the Notice are defined in Schedule 1.

1. Resolutions

Resolution 1 – Ratification of prior issue of Placement Shares

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

‘That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.4 and for all other purposes, Shareholders ratify the issue of 26,259,440 Placement Shares on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.’

Resolution 2(a) to (d) – Approval to issue Director Placement Shares

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, each as a **separate** ordinary resolution the following:

‘That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 10.11 and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve the issue of up to 2,540,560 Director Placement Shares to the Directors (or their respective nominees) as follows:

- (a) up to 280,000 Director Placement Shares to David Kelly;*
- (b) up to 120,000 Director Placement Shares to Graeme Gribbin;*
- (c) up to 1,980,560 Director Placement Shares to Michael Davies; and*
- (d) up to 160,000 Director Placement Shares to Tara French,*

on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum.’

2. Voting exclusions

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of:

- (a) Resolution 1:** by or on behalf of any person who participated in the issue of the Placement Shares, or any of their respective associates;

- (b) **Resolution 2(a):** by or on behalf of David Kelly (or his nominees), and any other person who will obtain a material benefit as a result of the issue of these Director Placement Shares (except a benefit solely by reason of being a Shareholder), or any of their respective associates;
- (c) **Resolution 2(b):** by or on behalf of Graeme Gribbin (or his nominees), and any other person who will obtain a material benefit as a result of the issue of these Director Placement Shares (except a benefit solely by reason of being a Shareholder), or any of their respective associates;
- (d) **Resolution 2(c):** by or on behalf of Michael Davies (or his nominees), and any other person who will obtain a material benefit as a result of the issue of these Director Placement Shares (except a benefit solely by reason of being a Shareholder), or any of their respective associates; and
- (e) **Resolution 2(d):** by or on behalf of Tara French (or her nominees), and any other person who will obtain a material benefit as a result of the issue of these Director Placement Shares (except a benefit solely by reason of being a Shareholder), or any of their respective associates.

The above voting exclusions do not apply to a vote cast in favour of the relevant Resolution by:

- (a) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way;
- (b) the Chair as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote on the Resolution, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on the Resolution as the Chair decides; or
- (c) a holder acting solely as a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - (i) the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the Resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Explanatory Memorandum

1. Introduction

The Explanatory Memorandum has been prepared for the information of Shareholders in connection with the business to be conducted at the Meeting to be held at the Company's head office at Level 3, 7 Rheola Street, West Perth, Western Australia on Friday, 31 July 2026 at 12.30pm (AWST).

The Explanatory Memorandum forms part of the Notice which should be read in its entirety. The Explanatory Memorandum contains the terms and conditions on which the Resolutions will be voted.

The Explanatory Memorandum includes the following information to assist Shareholders in deciding how to vote on the Resolutions:

A Proxy Form is made available with this Notice.

2. Action to be taken by Shareholders

Shareholders should read the Notice including the Explanatory Memorandum carefully before deciding how to vote on the Resolutions.

2.1 Voting in person

To vote in person, attend the Meeting on the date and at the place set out above.

2.2 Voting by a corporation

A Shareholder that is a corporation may appoint an individual to act as its representative and vote in person at the Meeting. The appointment must comply with the requirements of section 250D of the Corporations Act. The representative should bring to the Meeting evidence of his or her appointment, including any authority under which it is signed.

2.3 Voting by proxy

A Proxy Form is made available with this Notice. This is to be used by Shareholders if they wish to appoint a representative (a 'proxy') to vote in their place. All Shareholders are invited and encouraged to attend the Meeting or, if they are unable to attend in person, complete the Proxy Form and return the Proxy Form to the Company in accordance with the instructions thereon. Lodgement of a Proxy Form will not preclude a Shareholder from attending and voting at the Meeting in person.

Please note that:

- (a) a member of the Company entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy;
- (b) a proxy need not be a member of the Company; and
- (c) a member of the Company entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise, but where the proportion or number is not specified, each proxy may exercise half of the votes.

The available Proxy Form provides further details on appointing proxies and lodging Proxy Forms.

Section 250BB(1) of the Corporations Act provides that an appointment of a proxy may specify the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution and, if it does:

- (a) the proxy need not vote on a show of hands, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed);
- (b) if the proxy has 2 or more appointments that specify different ways to vote on the resolution – the proxy must not vote on a show of hands;
- (c) if the proxy is the Chair of the meeting at which the resolution is voted on – the proxy must vote on a poll, and must vote that way (i.e. as directed); and
- (d) if the proxy is not the Chair – the proxy need not vote on the poll, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed).

Section 250BC of the Corporations Act provides that, if:

- (a) an appointment of a proxy specifies the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution at a meeting of the Company's members;
- (b) the appointed proxy is not the chair of the meeting;
- (c) at the meeting, a poll is duly demanded, or is otherwise required under section 250JA on the resolution; and
- (d) either the proxy is not recorded as attending the meeting or the proxy does not vote on the resolution,

the Chair of the meeting is taken, before voting on the resolution closes, to have been appointed as the proxy for the purposes of voting on the resolution at the meeting.

Your proxy voting instruction must be received by 12.30pm (AWST) on Wednesday, 29 July 2026, being not later than 48 hours before the commencement of the Meeting.

2.4 Chair's voting intentions

The Chair intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of all Resolutions, unless the Shareholder has expressly indicated a different voting intention.

2.5 Submitting questions

Shareholders may submit questions in advance of the Meeting to the Company. Questions must be submitted by emailing the Company Secretary at info@lefroyex.com by no later than 5 business days before the Meeting.

Shareholders will also have the opportunity to submit questions during the Meeting in respect to the formal items of business. In order to ask a question during the Meeting, please follow the instructions from the Chair.

The Chair will attempt to respond to the questions during the Meeting. The Chair will request prior to a Shareholder asking a question that they identify themselves (including the entity name of their shareholding and the number of Shares they hold).

3. **Resolution 1 – Ratification of prior issue of Placement Shares**

3.1 **General**

On 22 May 2026, the Company announced that it had received firm commitments from institutional and sophisticated investors to raise approximately \$3.6 million (before costs) through the issue of 28,800,000 Shares at an issue price of \$0.125 per Share (**Placement**).

The Placement is comprised of the following:

- (a) **Placement Shares:** 26,259,440 Shares (**Placement Shares**), which were issued on 1 June 2026 utilising the Company's available placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 (the subject of Resolution 1); and
- (b) **Director Placement Shares:** the proposed issue of up to 2,540,560 Shares to the Directors (or their respective nominees) (the subject of Resolution 2(a) to (d) (inclusive)) (**Director Placement Shares**).

Bridge Street Capital Partners Pty Ltd acted as sole lead manager for the Placement (**Lead Manager**) and received fees equal to 6% of the total funds raised pursuant to the Placement.

Resolution 1 seeks the approval of Shareholders pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 to ratify the issue of 26,259,440 Placement Shares under Listing Rule 7.1.

3.2 **Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.4**

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of Equity Securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12-month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary shares it had on issue at the start of that period.

The issue of the Placement Shares does not fit within any of the exceptions to Listing Rule 7.1 and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, effectively uses up part of the Company's 15% placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1. This reduces the Company's capacity to issue further Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under those Listing Rules for the 12-month period following the issue of the Placement Shares.

Listing Rule 7.4 provides an exception to Listing Rule 7.1. It provides that where a company in a general meeting ratifies the previous issue of securities made pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 (and provided that the previous issue did not breach Listing Rule 7.1), those securities will be deemed to have been made with shareholder approval for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1.

The effect of Shareholders passing Resolution 1 will be to allow the Company to retain the flexibility to issue Equity Securities in the future up to the 15% placement capacity set out in Listing Rule 7.1, without the requirement to obtain prior Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 1 is passed, 26,259,440 Placement Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of Equity Securities it can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12-month period following the issue date.

If Resolution 1 is not passed, 26,259,440 Placement Shares will continue to be included in the Company's 15% limit under Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of Equity Securities the Company can issue or agree to issue without obtaining prior Shareholder approval, to the extent of 26,259,440 Equity Securities for the 12-month period following the issue of the Placement Shares.

The Company confirms that Listing Rule 7.1 was not breached at the time the Placement Shares were issued.

3.3 **Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.5**

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to the ratification of the issue of the Placement Shares:

- (a) The Placement Shares were issued to institutional and sophisticated investors, none of whom are a related party of the Company or, other than as detailed below, a Material Investor (**Placement Participants**). The Placement Participants were identified through a bookbuild process, which involved the Company and the Lead Manager seeking expressions of interest to participate in the Placement from new and existing contacts of the Company and clients of the Lead Manager.

The Company advises that substantial Shareholder Noontide Investments Limited received 5,700,000 Placement Shares which comprised more than 1% of the Company's issued capital at the time of the agreement to issue the Placement Shares. Accordingly, Noontide Investments Limited is considered to be a Material Investor in accordance with paragraph 7.4 of ASX Guidance Note 21.

- (b) A total of 26,259,440 Placement Shares were issued under Listing Rule 7.1.
- (c) The Placement Shares are fully paid and rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares on issue.
- (d) The Placement Shares were issued on 1 June 2026 at an issue price of \$0.125 each.
- (e) The proceeds of the Placement will be used to accelerate the growth and evaluation of the Company's key Mt Martin gold deposit, as well as towards working capital and corporate costs.
- (f) There are no other material terms to the agreement for the subscription of the Placement Shares.
- (g) A voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

3.4 **Additional information**

Resolution 1 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 1.

4. **Resolution 2(a) to (d) – Approval to issue Director Placement Shares**

4.1 **General**

The background to the Placement, including the proposed issue of the Director Placement Shares, is set out in Section 3.1 above.

The Directors have committed to participate in the Placement and subscribe for the Director Placement Shares on the same terms and conditions as the Placement Participants in the proportions set out below:

Resolution 2(a) to 2(d) (inclusive) seek the approval of Shareholders pursuant to Listing Rule 10.11 for the issue of the Director Placement Shares to the Directors (or their respective nominees) in the proportions set out above.

4.2 Listing Rule 10.11

Listing Rule 10.11 provides that unless one of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12 applies, a listed company must not issue or agree to issue Equity Securities to any of the following persons without the approval of Shareholders:

- (a) a related party (Listing Rule 10.11.1);
- (b) a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial holder (30%+) in the company (Listing Rule 10.11.2);
- (c) a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial holder (10%+) in the company and who has nominated a director to the board of the company pursuant to a relevant agreement which gives them a right or expectation to do so (Listing Rule 10.11.3);
- (d) an associate of a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.3 (Listing Rule 10.11.4); or
- (e) a person whose relationship with the company or a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 or 10.11.4 is such that, in ASX's opinion, the issue or agreement should be approved by its shareholders (Listing Rule 10.11.5).

The Directors are related parties of the Company by virtue of being directors of the Company.

Shareholder approval pursuant to Listing Rule 10.11 is therefore required unless an exception applies. It is the view of the Board that the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 10.12 do not apply in the current circumstances.

Approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the issue of the Director Placement Shares as approval is being obtained under Listing Rule 10.11. Accordingly, the issue of the Director Placement Shares to the Directors (or their respective nominees) will not be included in the Company's 15% placement capacity pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1.

The effect of Shareholders passing Resolution 2(a) to 2(d) (inclusive) will be to allow the Company to issue the Director Placement Shares, raising an additional \$317,570 (before costs) in connection with the Placement.

If Resolution 2(a) to 2(d) (inclusive) are not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the Director Placement Shares and will not raise an additional \$317,570 (before costs) under the Placement.

Resolution 2(a) to 2(d) are not conditional on each other, and Shareholders may approve one or all of those Resolutions (in which case, the Director Placement Shares the subject of the relevant Resolution(s) will be issued), even though Shareholders have not approved all of these Resolutions.

4.3 Specific information required by Listing Rule 10.13

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 10.13, the following information is provided in relation to the proposed issue of the Director Placement Shares:

- (a) The Director Placement Shares will be issued to the Directors (or their respective nominees), in the proportions set out in Section 4.1.
- (b) Each of the Directors fall into the category stipulated by Listing Rule 10.11.1 by virtue of being a Director of the Company. In the event the Director Placement Shares are issued to a nominee of a Director, that nominee will fall into the category stipulated by Listing Rule 10.11.4.
- (c) A maximum of up to 2,540,560 Director Placement Shares will be issued to the Directors (or their respective nominees).
- (d) The Director Placement Shares will be fully paid and rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares on issue.
- (e) The Director Placement Shares will be issued no later than 1 month after the date of the Meeting.
- (f) The Director Placement Shares will be issued at a price of \$0.125 each, being the same issue price as the Placement Shares.
- (g) A summary of the intended use of funds raised from the Placement is set out in Section 3.3(e).
- (h) The proposed issue of the Director Placement Shares is not intended to remunerate or incentivise the Directors.
- (i) There are no other material terms to the proposed issue of the Director Placement Shares.
- (j) A voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

4.4 **Additional information**

Resolution 2(a) to 2(d) (inclusive) are each separate ordinary resolutions.

The Board declines to make a recommendation in relation to Resolution 2(a) to 2(d) (inclusive) due to each of the Directors' personal interests in the outcome of the Resolutions.
