LOYALTY OPTIONS PROSPECTUS

For a pro-rata non-renounceable entitlement issue of one (1) Option (**Loyalty Option**) for every two (2) Shares held by those Shareholders registered at the Record Date at an issue price of \$0.01 per Loyalty Option to raise approximately \$191,960 (based on the number of Shares on issue as at the date of this Prospectus) (**Offer**).

This Prospectus also contains a cleansing offer, which is detailed in Section 2.2 (**Cleansing Offer**).

By making an application under the Offer, you warrant that you have read and understood the TMD and that you fall within the target market set out in the TMD.

Company Website

No documents or other information available on the Company's website is incorporated into this Prospectus by reference.

Financial forecasts

The Directors have considered the matters set out in ASIC Regulatory Guide 170 and believe that they do not have a reasonable basis to forecast future earnings on the basis that the operations of the Company are inherently uncertain. Accordingly, any forecast or projection information would contain such a broad range of potential outcomes and possibilities that it is not possible to prepare a reliable best estimate forecast or projection.

Clearing House Electronic Sub-Register System (CHES) and Issuer Sponsorship

The Company will apply to participate in CHES, for those investors who have, or wish to have, a sponsoring stockbroker. Investors who do not wish to participate through CHES will be issuer sponsored by the Company.

Electronic sub-registers mean that the Company will not be issuing certificates to investors. Instead, investors will be provided with statements (similar to a bank account statement) that set out the number of Securities issued to them under this Prospectus. The notice will also advise holders of their Holder Identification Number or Security Holder Reference Number and explain, for future reference, the sale and purchase procedures under CHES and issuer sponsorship.

Electronic sub-registers also mean ownership of securities can be transferred without having to rely upon paper documentation. Further monthly statements will be provided to holders if there have been any changes in their security holding in the Company during the preceding month.

Unless the contrary intention appears or the context otherwise requires, words and phrases contained in this Prospectus have the same meaning and interpretation as given in the Corporations Act and capitalised terms have the meaning given in the Glossary in Section 7.

All references to time in this Prospectus are references to Australian Western Standard Time.

The Board recommends all Shareholders take up their Entitlements. The Board advises that Mr Egerton-Warburton and Mr Lloyd intend to take up their full Entitlements.

1.4 Details of Substantial Holders

Based on publicly available information as at the date of this Prospectus, no person (together with their associates) has a relevant interest in 5% or more of the Shares on issue.

In the event all Entitlements are accepted there will be no change to the substantial holders on completion of the Offers.

1.5 Effect on Control

As the Securities offered under this Prospectus do not contain voting rights, the offering of the Options under the Offers will not change the voting power in the Company. In order to acquire voting rights, holders of Options will need to exercise their Options received in accordance with their terms.

1.6 Potential dilution on non-participating Shareholders

No immediate dilution will occur as a result of the issue of Securities under this Prospectus. However subsequent exercise of any or all of the Loyalty Options will result in dilution. Assuming all Options offered pursuant to this Prospectus are issued and exercised into Shares, Shareholders who do not participate in the Offer, are likely to be diluted by an aggregate of approximately 33.33% (as compared to their holdings and number of Shares on issue as at the date of the Prospectus). 2. DETAILS OF THE OFFERS

2.1 The Offer

The Offer is being made as a pro-rata non-renounceable entitlement offer to acquire one (1) Loyalty Option for every two (2) Shares held by Shareholders registered at the Record Date, at an issue price of \$0.01 per Loyalty Option.

Fractional entitlements will be round down to the nearest whole number. All references to numbers of Loyalty Options to be issued pursuant to this Prospectus are expressed subject to rounding.

Based on the capital structure of the Company as at the date of this Prospectus, approximately 19,196,060 Loyalty Options will be issued pursuant to the Offer to raise approximately \$191,960 (before costs).

As at the date of this Prospectus the Company has 14,650,000 Options on issue that may be exercised prior to the Record Date in order to participate in the Offer. Please refer to Section 3.4 for information on the exercise price and expiry date of the Options on issue.

All of the Loyalty Options offered under this Prospectus will be issued with an exercise price of \$0.25 and an expiry date of 31 January 2027. Full terms and conditions of the Loyalty Options are set out in Section 4.1 of this Prospectus.

All of the Shares issued upon the future exercise of the Options offered under this Prospectus will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Please refer to Section 4.3 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares.

The purpose of the Offer and the intended use of funds raised are set out in Section 3.1.

2.2 Cleansing Offer

Under this Prospectus, the Company also invites investors identified by the Directors to apply for up to 2,000 Options, comprising:

- (a) 1,000 Options exercisable at \$0.25 on or before 31 May 2025 and otherwise on the terms set out in Section 4.2 (**Class A**); and
- (b) 1,000 Options exercisable at \$0.30 on or before 30 June 2025 and otherwise on the terms set out in Section 4.2 (**Class B**).

The Options are being offered at an issue price of \$0.01 per Option to raise up to \$20 (before expenses pursuant to the Cleansing Offer).

The Cleansing Offer will only be extended to specific parties on invitation from the Directors. Application Forms will only be provided by the Company to these parties.

All of the Shares issued upon the future exercise of the Options offered under this Cleansing Offer will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Please refer to Section 4.3 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares.

The primary purpose of the Cleansing Offer is set out in Section 3.2.

2.3 Acceptance of the Offer

(a) What Eligible Shareholders may do

The Offer is non-renounceable. Accordingly, a Shareholder may not sell or transfer all or part of their Entitlement.

(b) Payment options

(i) By BPAY®

For payment by BPAY®, please follow the instructions on the Entitlement and Acceptance Form. You can only make a

payment via BPAY® if you are the holder of an account with an Australian financial institution that supports BPAY® transactions. Please note that should you choose to pay by BPAY®:

- (A) you do not need to submit the Entitlement and Acceptance Form but are taken to have made the declarations on that Entitlement and Acceptance Form; and
- (B) if you do not pay for your Entitlement in full, you are deemed to have taken up your Entitlement in respect of such whole number of Shares which is covered in full by your Application monies.

You should be aware that your own financial institution may implement earlier cut-off times with regard to electronic payment, and you should therefore take this into consideration when making payment. **It is your responsibility to ensure that funds submitted through BPAY® are received by 5.00pm (WST) on the Closing Date. The Company shall not be responsible for any delay in the receipt of the BPAY® payment.**

Guidance where you have more than one CRN (Shareholding of Shares)

(c) **Implications of an acceptance**

Returning a completed Entitlement and Acceptance Form or paying any Application monies by BPAY® or EFT will be taken to constitute a representation by you that:

- (i) you have received a copy of this Prospectus and the accompanying Entitlement and Acceptance Form, and read them both in their entirety;
- (ii) you acknowledge that once the Entitlement and Acceptance Form is returned, or a BPAY® or EFT payment instruction is given in relation to any Application monies, the application may not be varied or withdrawn except as required by law.

2.4 Acceptance of the Cleansing Offer

The Cleansing Offer is only available to those who are personally invited to apply. Applications for Options offered under the Cleansing Offer can only be submitted on an original Application Form which accompanies this Prospectus.

2.5 Minimum subscription

There is no minimum subscription.

2.6 Shortfall Offer

Any Entitlement not taken up pursuant to the Offer will form the Shortfall Offer (**Shortfall Options**). The Shortfall Offer is a separate offer made pursuant to this Prospectus and will remain open for up to three months following the Closing Date. The issue price for each Shortfall Option to be issued under the Shortfall Offer shall be \$0.01 being the price at which Options have been offered under the Offer.

If you do not wish to take up any part of your Entitlement you are not required to take any action. That part of your Entitlement not taken up will form part of the Shortfall Offer and potentially be allocated to other third parties as part of the Shortfall Offer. The Shortfall Offer will only be available where there is a Shortfall between applications received from Eligible Shareholders and the number of Loyalty Options proposed to be issued under the Offer.

No Shortfall Options will be issued to a party under the Shortfall Offer if the effect would be to increase that party's voting power in the Company to an amount greater than 19.99%.

All decisions regarding the allocation of Shortfall Options will be made by the Directors and will be final and binding on all applicants under the Shortfall Offer; as such there is no guarantee that any Shortfall Options applied for will be issued.

The Company will have no liability to any Applicant who receives less than the number of Shortfall Options they applied for under the Shortfall Offer. If the Company scales back any applications for Shortfall Options under the Shortfall Offer any Application monies will be returned (without interest) as soon as practicable.

2.7 ASX listing

Application for Official Quotation of the Loyalty Options will also be made within 7 days after the date of this Prospectus. If ASX does not grant Official Quotation of the Loyalty Options or if the Company does not meet the minimum requirements to be granted Official Quotation of the Loyalty Options, then the Loyalty Options will still be issued, however will not be quoted on ASX.

The fact that ASX may grant Official Quotation to the Loyalty Options is not to be taken in any way as an indication of the merits of the Company or the Loyalty Options now offered for subscription.

2.8 Issue of Loyalty Options

Loyalty Options issued pursuant to the Offer will be issued in accordance with the ASX Listing Rules and timetable set out at Section 1.1.

Pending the issue of the Loyalty Options or payment of refunds pursuant to this Prospectus, all Application monies will be held by the Company in trust for the Applicants in a separate bank account as required by the Corporations Act. The Company, however, will be entitled to retain all interest that accrues on the bank account and each Applicant waives the right to claim interest.

Holding statements for Loyalty Options issued under the Offer will be mailed as soon as practicable after the issue of the Options and for Shortfall Options issued under the Shortfall Offer as soon as practicable after their issue.

2.9 Overseas shareholders

The Offer does not, and is not intended to, constitute an offer in any place or jurisdiction in which, or to any person to whom, it would not be lawful to make such an offer or to issue this Prospectus.

It is not practicable for the Company to comply with the securities laws of overseas jurisdictions having regard to the number of overseas Shareholders, the number and value of Loyalty Options these Shareholders would be offered and the cost of complying with regulatory requirements in each relevant jurisdiction. Accordingly, the Offer is not being extended and Shares will not be issued to Shareholders with a registered address which is outside Australia or New Zealand.

New Zealand

This Prospectus has been prepared in compliance with Australian law and has not been registered, filed with or approved by any New Zealand regulatory

authority. This document is not a product disclosure statement under New Zealand law and is not required to, and may not, contain all the information that a product disclosure statement under New Zealand law is required to contain.

Nominees and custodians

Nominees and custodians may not submit an Entitlement and Acceptance Form on behalf of any Shareholder resident outside Australia and New Zealand without the prior consent of the Company, taking into account relevant securities law restrictions. Return of a duly completed Entitlement and Acceptance Form will be taken by the Company to constitute a representation that there has been no breach of those regulations.

3. PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF THE OFFERS

This summary is not exhaustive and does not constitute a definitive statement of the rights and liabilities of Shareholders. To obtain such a statement, persons should seek independent legal advice.

Full details of the rights and liabilities attaching to Shares are set out in the Constitution, a copy of which is available for inspection at the Company's registered office during normal business hours.

(a) General meetings

Shareholders are entitled to be present in person, or by proxy, attorney or representative to attend and vote at general meetings of the Company. The Constitution permits the use of technology at general meetings of shareholders (including wholly virtual meetings) to the extent permitted under the Corporations Act, ASX Listing Rules and applicable law.

Shareholders may requisition meetings in accordance with section 249D of the Corporations Act and the Constitution of the Company.

(b) Voting rights

Subject to any rights or restrictions for the time being attached to any class or classes of shares, at general meetings of shareholders or classes of shareholders:

- (i) each Shareholder entitled to vote may vote in person or by proxy, attorney or representative;
- (ii) on a show of hands, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder has one vote; and
- (iii) on a poll, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder shall, in respect of each fully paid Share held by him, or in respect of which he is appointed a proxy, attorney or representative, have one vote for each Share held, but in respect of partly paid shares shall have such number of votes as bears the same proportion to the total of such Shares registered in the Shareholder's name as the amount paid (not credited) bears to the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited).

(c) Dividend rights

If the Company is wound up, the liquidator may, with the authority of a special resolution, divide among the Shareholders in kind the whole or any part of the property of the Company, and may for that purpose set such value as he considers fair upon any property to be so divided, and may determine how the division is to be carried out as between the Shareholders or different classes of Shareholders.

Subject to restrictions on the issue or grant of securities contained in the ASX Listing Rules, the Constitution and the Corporations Act (and without affecting any special right previously conferred on the holder of an existing share or class of shares), the Directors may issue Shares as they shall, in their absolute discretion, determine.

(h) **Variation of rights**

Under section 246B of the Corporations Act, the Company may, with the sanction of a special resolution passed at a meeting of Shareholders vary or abrogate the rights attaching to Shares.

If at any time the share capital is divided into different classes of shares, the rights attached to any class (unless otherwise provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class), whether or not the Company is being wound up, may be varied or abrogated with the consent in writing of the holders of three quarters of the issued shares of that class, or if authorised by a special resolution passed at a separate meeting of the holders of the shares of that class.

(i) **Alteration of constitution**

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the Constitution can only be amended by a special resolution passed by at least three quarters of Shareholders present and voting at the general meeting. In addition, at least 28 days written notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution as a special resolution must be given.

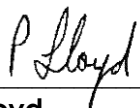
