EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. BACKGROUND TO RESOLUTION 1 TO 6

1.1 Background to the Placement

As announced by the Company on 13 February 2025, the Company received firm commitments from new and existing sophisticated investors to raise approximately \$1.8 million (before costs) by way of a placement of Shares at an issue price of \$0.003 per Share (**Placement**). Placement Participants are entitled to receive one free attaching Option (exercisable at \$0.006 each on or before the date that is 5 years from the date of issue). The Company may seek official quotation of the Options on the ASX, subject to meeting the minimum quotation requirements.

The Placement will be issued in two tranches:

- (a) Tranche 1, comprising of:
 - (i) 59,523,492 Shares issued pursuant to the Company's placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 on 20 February 2025 (**Tranche 1 Shares**); and
 - (ii) 59,523,492 Options (**Tranche 1 Options**); and
- (b) Tranche 2, comprising of:
 - (i) up to 538,476,508 Shares (**Tranche 2 Shares**) and 538,476,508 Options (**Tranche 2 Options**);
 - (ii) up to 1,500,000 Shares and 1,500,000 Options to Marion Bush; and
 - (iii) up to 500,000 Shares and 500,000 Options to Terry Gadenne.

The proceeds from the Placement will be allocated to gold and critical minerals exploration programmes including at the Company's Gidji JV, Bangemall, Whaleshark and Chain Pool Projects.

1.2 Broker

The Company entered a lead manager mandate with PAC Partners Securities Pty Ltd (ACN 623 653 912) (**Broker**) (PAC is a corporate authorised representative of PAC Asset Management Pty Ltd (AFSL No. 335 374)) (**Mandate**). The terms of the Mandate are summarised below:

- (a) a 6% selling fee of the gross proceeds raised in the Placement (plus GST) payable in cash, being up to \$108,000; and
- (b) subject to Shareholder approval, the Broker (or its nominee/s) will be issued 20 Options for each dollar raised under the Placement, being up to 36,000,000 Options, on the same terms as the Options under the Placement.

The Mandate otherwise contains terms considered standard for an agreement of its nature.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – RATIFICATION OF TRANCHE 1 SHARES

2.1 General

This Resolution seeks Shareholder ratification for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Tranche 1 Shares to the Placement Participants.

2.2 Listing Rule 7.1

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary shares it had on issue at the start of that period.

The issue does not fit within any of the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 7.2 and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively uses up part of the 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 for the 12 month period following the date of the issue.

2.3 Listing Rule 7.4

Listing Rule 7.4 allows the shareholders of a listed company to approve an issue of equity securities after it has been made or agreed to be made. If they do, the issue is taken to have been approved under Listing Rule 7.1 and so does not reduce the company's capacity to issue further equity securities without shareholder approval under that rule.

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional equity securities in the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval for such issues under Listing Rule 7.1. Accordingly, the Company is seeking Shareholder ratification pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue.

2.4 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If this Resolution is passed, the issue will be excluded in calculating the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of the issue.

If this Resolution is not passed, the issue will be included in calculating the Company's 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of the issue.

5.2 Director Recommendation

Allan Kelly recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of these Resolutions to enable the Directors to participate in the capital raising on the same terms as unrelated participants.

Each Director (other than Allan Kelly) has a material personal interest in the outcome of these Resolutions on the basis that the Directors (other than Allan Kelly) (or their nominee(s)) are to be issued Securities should these Resolutions be passed. For this reason, the Directors (other than Allan Kelly) do not believe that it is appropriate to make a recommendation on these Resolutions.

5.3 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act requires that for a public company, or an entity that the public company controls, to give a financial benefit to a related party of the public company, the public company or entity must:

- (a) obtain the approval of the public company's members in the manner set out in sections 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The issue constitutes giving a financial benefit and each of the proposed recipients is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director.

As Securities are proposed to be issued to all the Directors other than Allan Kelly, the Directors are unable to form a quorum to consider whether one of the exceptions set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act applies to the issue. Accordingly, Shareholder approval for the issue is sought in accordance with Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act.

5.4 Listing Rule 10.11

Listing Rule 10.11 provides that unless one of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12 applies, a listed company must not issue or agree to issue equity securities to:

- 10.11.1 a related party;
- 10.11.2 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (30%+) holder in the company;

- 10.11.3 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (10%+) holder in the company and who has nominated a director to the board of the company pursuant to a relevant agreement which gives them a right or expectation to do so;
- 10.11.4 an associate of a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.3; or
- 10.11.5 a person whose relationship with the company or a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.4 is such that, in ASX's opinion, the issue or agreement should be approved by its shareholders,

unless it obtains the approval of its shareholders.

The issue falls within Listing Rule 10.11.1 and does not fall within any of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12. It therefore requires the approval of Shareholders under Listing Rule 10.11.

5.5 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If these Resolutions are passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue within one month after the date of the Meeting (or such later date as permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the Listing Rules). As approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the issue (because approval is being obtained under Listing Rule 10.11), the issue will not use up any of the Company's 15% annual placement capacity.

If these Resolutions are not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue and the Company will not receive \$6,000 under the Placement.

Rights attaching to Shares on exercise	All Shares issued upon exercise of Convertible Securities will rank equally in all respects with the then Shares of the Company.

The Board may from time to time suspend the operation of the Plan for a fixed period or indefinitely and may end any suspension. If the Plan is terminated or suspended for any reason, that termination or suspension must not prejudice the accrued rights of the Participants. If a Participant and the Company (acting by the Board) agree in writing that some or all of the Securities granted to that Participant are to be cancelled on a specified date or on the occurrence of a particular event, then those Securities may be cancelled in the manner agreed between the Company and the Participant.
