PERFORMANCE AND COMPANY UPDATE

As at 30 April 2026, the Company's investments delivered a total return of 9.9% p.a.¹ (after fees) and distributed a yield of 7.5% (incl. franking) since inception compared to the S&P/ASX 200 Franking Credit Adjusted Daily Total Return Index (Tax-Exempt) ('Benchmark') return of 9.8% and a yield of 5.1%.¹

MARKET OVERVIEW

Australian equities rose 2.2% in April (including franking credits), as renewed optimism around AI-related capital expenditure more than offset concerns about the ongoing closure of the Strait of Hormuz, despite a ceasefire between the U.S. and Iran. This AI-driven sentiment supported significantly stronger global returns, with the U.S. market rebounding 10.5% and Korea—given its greater exposure to the AI thematic—rising 38% in USD terms over the month. The Technology sector gained 13.3%, alongside the Property sector, which rose 8.1%, driven by the strong performance of Goodman Group, reflecting its exposure to data centres. In contrast, Healthcare declined 8.7% following Cochlear's guidance downgrade, while Consumer Staples also fell after Woolworths reported disappointing sales results.

Some of the largest positive contributors to the Company's performance during the month were overweight positions in Codan and Macquarie as well as underweight positions in Cochlear, Woolworths and CSL. However, overweight positions in Woodside and Origin Energy as well as underweight positions in Goodman Group, Pilbara Minerals and NextDC detracted from relative performance.

The Company remains actively positioned to seek superior income than the benchmark.

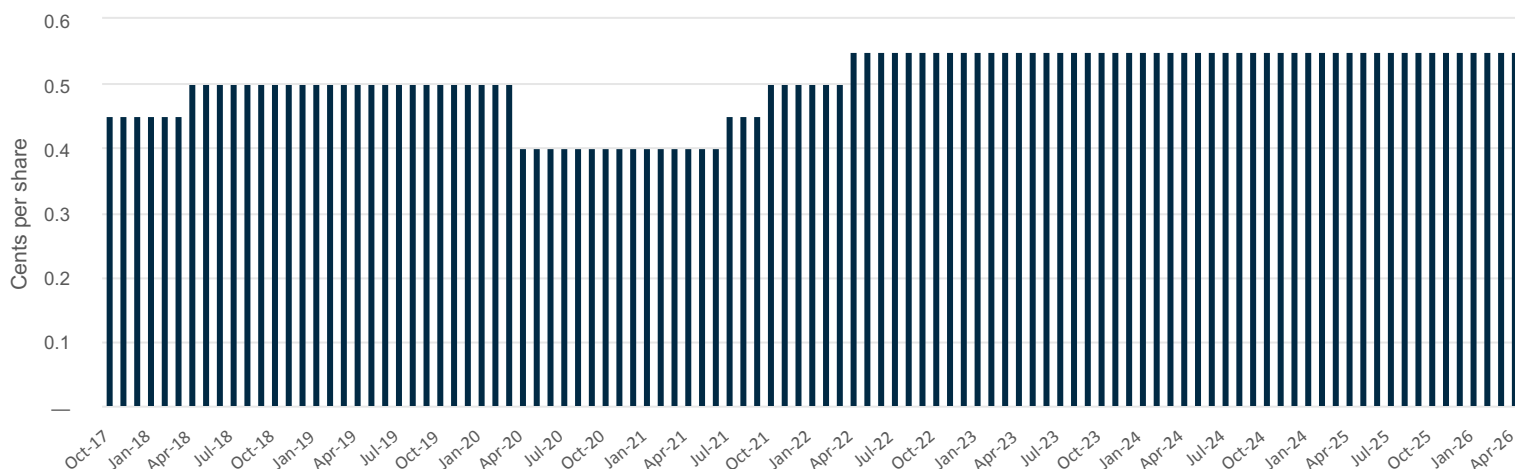

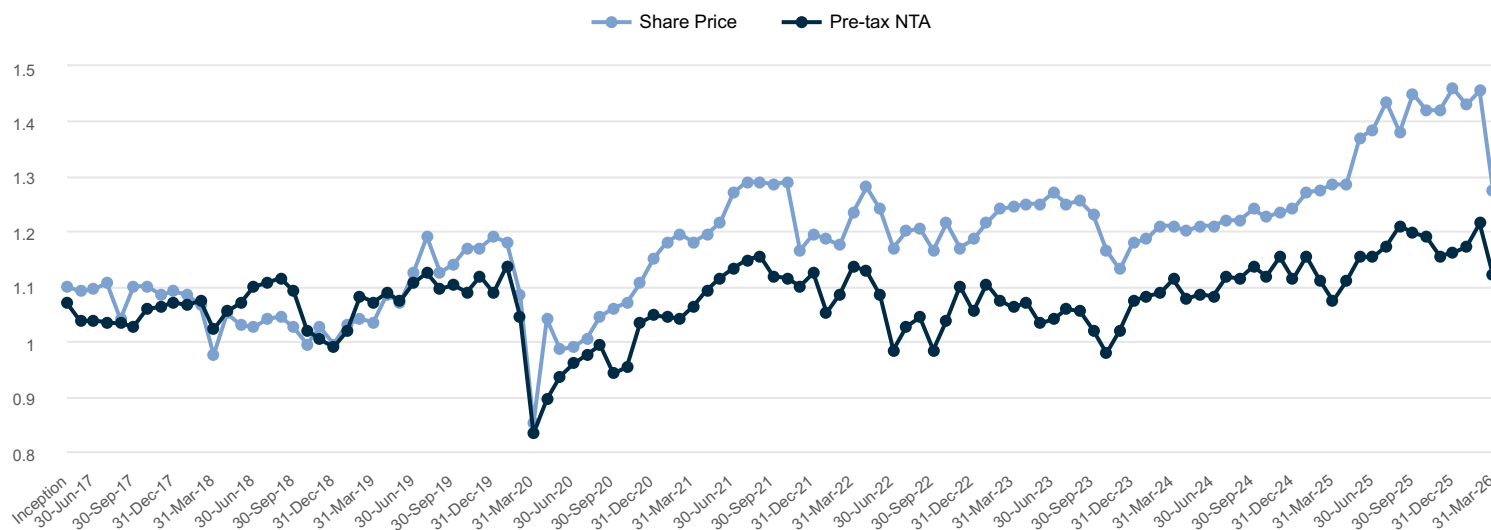
