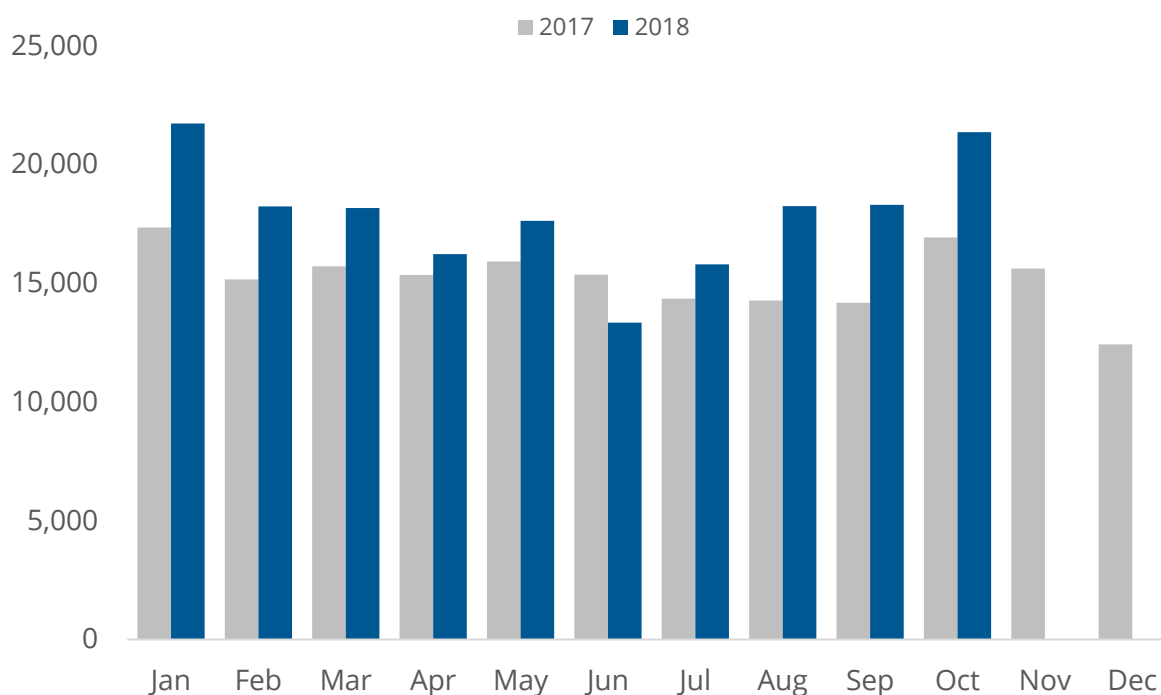

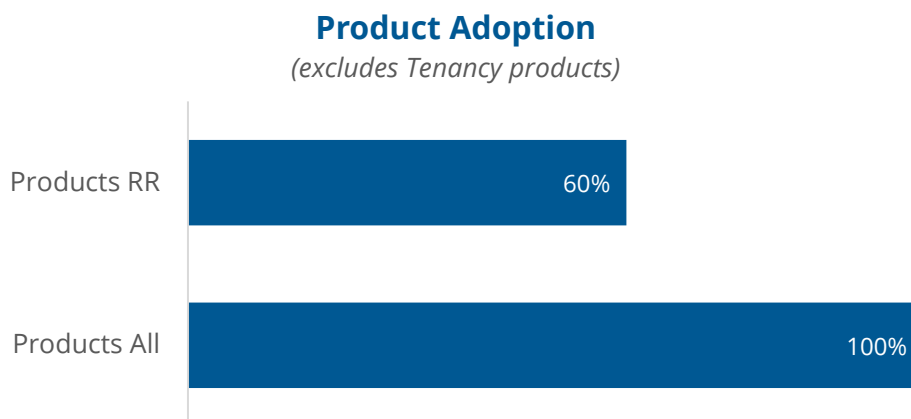
Renter Resume growth continues, with the creation of new Renter Resumes in 2018 running ahead of the previous year (up by 10%) and the recent release of RENT's Apple and Android applications has seen the last three months up by over 20% on the equivalent period in 2017.

Renter Resume a Driver for Renter Products Attachment

The Renter Resume continues to be a key driver of Renter Products revenue because it allows the right product to be presented at the right time in a customer's journey to find a new home. Whilst some products are drawcards in their own right (e.g. people coming to the site specifically to find "RentBond") the Renter Resume proves to be a very effective sales channel with 60% of RENT's product adoption (excluding "in tenancy" products) coming via a Renter Resume.

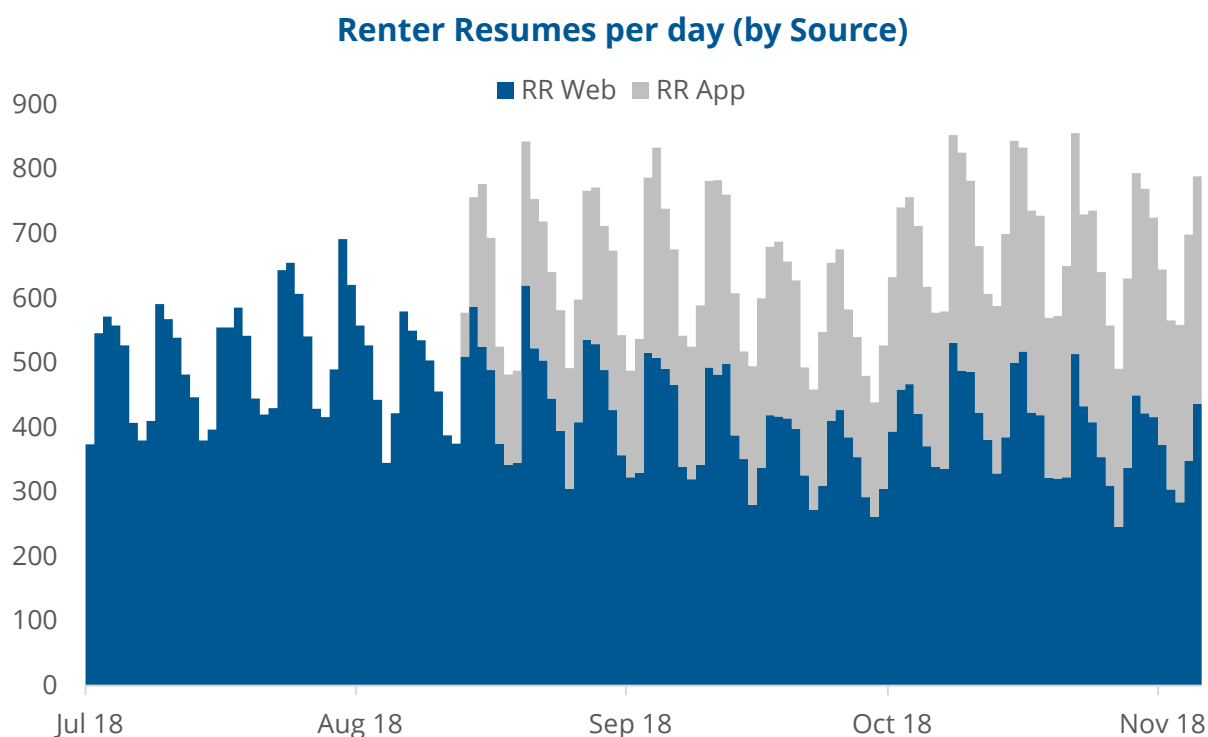


App having an Impact

"Our App is only a few months old and already we are seeing it account for almost 10% of our total daily users and this number is growing each day. What is really exciting is that App users are much more likely to create a Renter Resume, five times more likely than a web user" explained Mr Bader.

"This gives us an excellent foundation and opportunity to build upon. Product consumption on a per user basis is consistent between the Web and App so our focus with the App will be to optimise the product attachment on a per Resume basis. Achieving parity on products per Resume across both platforms will provide a material lift in Renter Products revenue.

"Whilst we are seeing some substitution (as expected, some will create a Resume on the App instead of the website) the 20% uplift in Renter Resumes post the launch of the App is very positive".
