Commentary

Australian Renewable Fuels Limited (ARfuels) presents its Appendix 4C: Consolidated Statement of Cash Flows for the December 2014 Quarter. Key highlights for the quarter include:

- Net operating cash inflows of \$0.671m for the quarter.
- Total net cash inflows of \$0.538m for the quarter.

ARfuels generated cash inflows as indicated above and had a cash at bank position of \$2.086m at 31 December 2014, with an undrawn debt facility of \$5.5m.

ARfuels will provide an operations update with the Financial Statements for the six months ended 31 December 2014 which will be released prior to 28 February 2015.

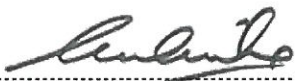
