Basis of financial report preparation

19.1 *This report is a half yearly report. It is a general purpose financial report prepared in accordance with the listing rules and AASB 1029: Interim Financial Reporting. The financial statements in this report are "condensed financial statements" as defined in AASB 1029: Interim Financial Reporting. Receivables at 30 June 2003 include \$325,000 receivable by way of a convertible note issued by TMS Global Services Ltd ("TMS"). Conversion of the note would give Euraust a 15% equity holding in TMS. The note includes the option for Euraust to acquire a further 15% interest. TMS has the right to cause the conversion of the note subject to their fulfilment of contractual contingencies.

Subsequent to the year end the subsidiary company has expended approximately \$75,000 in purchasing and installing improved wagering systems.

It is recommended that this report be read in conjunction with the annual financial report for the year ended 31 December 2002 and any public announcements made by Euraust Ltd and its controlled entities during the half-year in accordance with continuous disclosure requirements arising under the Corporations Act 2001.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the entities in the economic entity and are consistent with those applied in the 31 December 2002 annual report.

This report does not include full disclosures of the type normally included in an annual financial report. For the purpose of preparing this report, the half-year has been treated as a discrete reporting period.

The financial statements have also been prepared on the going concern basis of accounting, which assumes that the economic entity will be able to meet its commitments, realise its assets and discharge its liabilities in the ordinary course of business.

The ability of the economic entity to continue as a going concern is dependent on the economic entity developing profitable operations and on the availability of adequate funding for existing commitments and new and ongoing business activities.

The company is currently finalising a placement of shares to raise \$215,000 for working capital. New risk management software installed in the Betworks business along with increased numbers of customers is expected to bring this business to profitability in the near future.

In the event that the Betworks business does not succeed in returning profits in the very near future directors intend to exit the business by way of a trade sale or to minimise or discontinue the operations.

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INDEPENDENT REVIEW REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF EURAUST LIMITED

Scope

We have reviewed the financial report of Euraust Limited ("Company") in the form of Appendix 4B of the Australian Stock Exchange (ASX) Listing Rules, as set out on pages 1 to 20 and the Directors' Declaration for the half-year ended 30 June 2003, but excluding comparison of half year results.

The financial report includes the consolidated financial statements of the consolidated entity comprising the Company and the entities it controlled at the end of the half year or from time to time during the half year. The company's directors are responsible for the financial report. We have performed an independent review of the financial report in order to state whether, on the basis of the procedures described, anything has come to our attention that would indicate that the financial report is not presented fairly in accordance with Accounting Standard AASB 1029: Interim Financial Reporting and other mandatory professional reporting requirements and statutory requirements in Australia and the ASX Listing Rules as they relate to Appendix 4B, and in order for the company to lodge the financial report with the Australian Securities and Investments Commission and the ASX.

Our review has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards applicable to review engagements. Our review was limited primarily to inquiries of the entity's personnel and analytical review procedures applied to financial data. These procedures do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, thus the level of assurance provided is less than that given in an audit. We have not performed an audit and accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

Review Statement

Based on our review, which is not an audit, we have not become aware of any matters that makes us believe that the half-year financial report, as defined in the scope section, of Eurast Limited, is not in accordance with:

- (a) the Corporations Act 2001, including:
 - (i) giving a true and fair view of the company's financial position as at 30 June 2003 and of its performance for the half year ended on that date; and
 - (ii) complying with Accounting Standard AASB 1029: Interim Financial Reporting and the Corporations Regulations 2001; and
- (b) other mandatory professional reporting requirements and ASX Listing Rules as they relate to Appendix 4B.

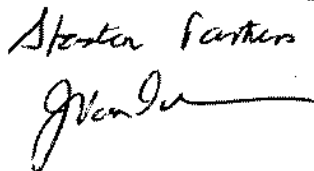
Inherent Uncertainty Regarding Non Current Assets and Continuation as a going concern

Without qualification to the opinion expressed above, attention is drawn to the following matters.

The company and its subsidiary incurred a loss from ordinary activities of \$789,002 for the six month period ended 30 June 2003.

Note 19.5 of Appendix 4B relating to the basis of financial report preparation, states that the financial statements have been drawn up on the going concern basis which assumes that the company and its subsidiary can continue operating and pay their debts as and when they become payable. The ability of the company and its subsidiary to continue as going concerns is dependant on the group returning to profitable operations and on the availability of adequate funding for existing commitments and new and ongoing business activities. In the event that the Company cannot raise further equity or the economic entity cannot return to profitable operations, the value of the economic entity's non current assets may be significantly less than book values.
