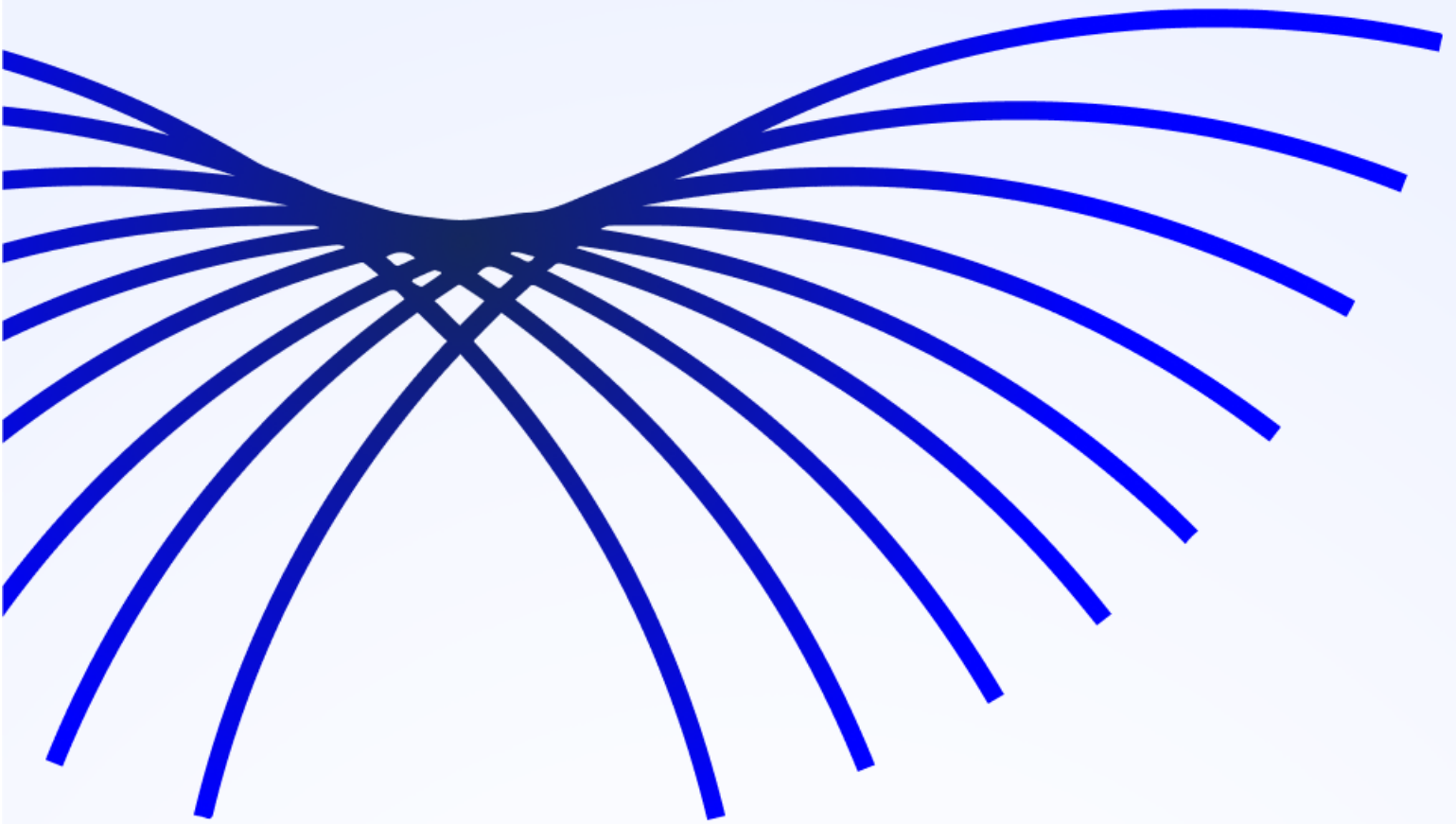

HIGHLIGHTS

WHITEHAWK LIMITED (ASX: WHK OR “WHITEHAWK” OR “THE COMPANY”), THE FIRST GLOBAL ONLINE CYBER SECURITY EXCHANGE ENABLING BUSINESSES AND ORGANIZATIONS OF ALL SIZES TO TAKE SMART ACTION AGAINST CYBERCRIME VIA RISK, MATURITY, COMPLIANCE AND THREAT, SOFTWARE AS A SERVICE ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTIONS AND VIRTUAL CONSULTS, IS PLEASED TO PROVIDE AN UPDATE ON ITS PROGRESS FOR THE FOURTH QUARTER 2024.

UPDATES FOR THE QUARTER

Prime Cyber Services Contract with a Global Social Media Platform Company

Contract Summary

- Annual Contract Jan – Dec 2024 to provide Third Party Risk Management Services for Risk Monitoring, Cyber and Architecture SME services, and Platform integration services.
- Successfully completed and closed out contract

Progress for the Quarter

- Integration between Client and WhiteHawk completed and released to production. Provides the ability to onboard Third parties via API with minimal manual services to deconflict errors and duplicates; and fully automated via API to retrieve Third-party risk performance and observations data.
- Successfully negotiated a 2-year contract renewal to continue providing same services to start 1 January 2025.

Cyber Risk Program contract with ASX 100 Company

Contract Summary

- Phase 1 commenced in August 2024 conducting Cyber Risk Assessments and Continuous Monitoring for three subsidiaries.
- Scope of contract for Phase 1 includes baseline and quarterly assessments and expert analysis of vulnerabilities, cybersecurity practices, and current shortfalls in existing technology stack.
- Provide individual entity and portfolio reports detailing the baseline vulnerability assessment of current cybersecurity gaps and potential best practices/policies that can support improved resilience of critical functions.

Progress for the Quarter

- Delivered on baseline analysis and associated assessment reports.
- Conducted monthly debriefings and analysis of critical vulnerabilities related to configuration, asset management, and obsolescence of software and equipment.

Cyber Risk Program and Cyber Risk Radar Proof of Concept for State and Local Government (City of Atlanta)

Contract Summary

- 60 Day paid pilot program of both the Cyber Risk Program and Cyber Risk Radar beginning on 17 July.
- Scope of contract for proof of concept ("POC") includes baseline and final assessments of 10 municipal agencies and 20 vendors. Baseline will also include one-time business risk assessments for each entity. WhiteHawk will provide expert analysis of vulnerabilities, cybersecurity practices, and current shortfalls in existing processes.

- Provided individual entity and portfolio reports detailing the baseline vulnerability assessment of current cybersecurity gaps and potential best practices/policies that can support improved resilience of critical functions.

Progress for the Quarter

- Successful delivery of final reports and outcomes of POC.
- Supported client in developing scope and requirements for a follow-on annual subscription.

Analyst Platform-as-a-Service (“APaaS”) Proof of Concept for University of South Florida (“USF”)

Contract Summary

- 60 Day paid pilot program for Cyber Risk Radar and APaaS services
- Scope of contract includes:
 - 60-Days access to whitehawk.com for client analysts to perform analysis and reporting
 - Cyber Risk Monitoring for 20 entities
 - Training of students on how to use the platform and perform analysis on entity monitoring performance data
 - Development and Review of Portfolio analytics across multiple entities.

Progress for the Quarter

- Initiated conversations to roll-out additional APaaS and associated monitoring and training across a broader set of students.

CASHFLOW

- Revenue for the Quarter was US\$718K.
- WhiteHawk continues to manage expenses within planned budget, expending US\$267,000 on average per month in total operating expenses over the last quarter.
- Net Cash from Operations in the Quarter was a loss of US\$84,000.
- Payments made to related parties include salaries, director fees and payments made for services provided by Key Management Personnel.
- In continuous effort to manage operational expenditures, reduced salaries on selected employees to take into effect 2025.
